## **HRSA Background**

- Mission To provide national leadership, program resources and services needed to improve access to culturally competent, quality healthcare.
- FY2010 Budget \$7.2 Billion

## The People We Serve

- Nearly 19 million patients are served through HRSAfunded health centers, including 1 in 3 people with incomes below the poverty level.
- Over 500,000 people living with HIV/AIDS receive HRSA's Ryan White services. Two-thirds are members of minority groups.
- 34 million women, infants, children, and adolescents benefit from HRSA's maternal and child health programs.
- About 14,000 safety net providers participate in HRSA's 340B program that provides access to discount drug purchases.
- Currently more than 7,400 National Health Service Corps clinicians are (or will be) working in underserved areas in exchange for loan repayment or scholarships.

## **Community Health Centers**



- CHCs provide comprehensive primary, preventive, and supplemental health care services in medically underserved areas.
- HRSA anticipates \$11 billion in funding over the next 5 years for the operation, expansion, and construction of health centers.

## Community Health Center New Access Point



- New delivery service sites for the provision of comprehensive primary, preventive, and supplemental health care services including oral health, mental health, and substance abuse services consistent with the requirements of section 330 of the Public Health Service Act.
- Two types of New Access Points
  - New Start-Organizations
  - Satellite-Organizations





## Community Health Center New Access Point



- HRSA hopes to make as many as 70 NAP grant awards towards the end of FY 2011.
- Additional opportunities anticipated in FY 2012.

## **National Health Service Corps**



The goal of the NHSC is to expand access to health care services and improve the health of people who live areas where health care is scarce.

NHSC recruits a variety of primary care, dental, and mental health providers who are dedicated to serve communities in need.

NHSC provides funding for Scholarships and Loan Repayment for students and health care providers.



## National Health Service Corps



## Significant Program Expansion

- \$300 million in expansion funds from ARRA
- 7,358 primary care providers in 2010 vs. 4,760 in 2009

### Recent Program Improvements

- Simplified site application and approval process
- Max Loan Repayment Award increased to \$60,000
- Allowance for Half-Time; 2 & 4 year contracts.



## National Health Service Corps



 Application Deadline – Open and Continuous.
 Current cycle closed May 26, 2011 for Loan Repayment.



- HRSA anticipates \$240 Million will be available in FY 2011 for scholarships and loan repayment.
- Eligible applicants are primary care clinicians who are willing to work in designated underserved communities for at least 2 years.
- More opportunities anticipated in FY2012

## Healthy People 2020 Community Innovations Projects

- Who is eligible?: non-profit, community-based organizations with budgets less than \$750,000
- Grants must be used to implement projects that address Healthy People 2020 overarching goals, topic areas and objectives and integrate at least one of the following Healthy People 2020 Community Innovation Project priorities:
  - environmental justice
  - health equity
  - healthy behaviors across all life stages.





## Healthy People 2020 Community Innovations Projects

- As many as 170 projects will be given between \$5,000 to \$10,000 to conduct projects between December 1, 2011 and May 31, 2012.
- The deadline for is Friday, August 5, 2011

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




### Mission

## AoA Grant Announcement For State Units on Aging

- The Administration on Aging (AoA) will award up to \$14 million in competitive grants to State Units on Aging through this 2-part Program Announcement (June 9, 2011).
- Part A "Accelerating Integrated, Evidence-Based, and Sustainable Service Systems for Older Adults, Individuals with Disabilities and Family Caregivers" and
- Part B "Creating Dementia Capable, Sustainable Service Systems For Persons With Dementia And Their Family Caregivers"
- The goal of this Program Announcement is to ensure that older adults, individuals with disabilities and family caregivers have clear and ready access to a sustainable, integrated system that offers a comprehensive set of high quality, evidence-based services that can help them remain independent and healthy in the community

## AoA Grant Announcement For State Units on Aging (cont'd.)

- To achieve its goal, AoA will award fully funded 3-year cooperative agreements to successful applicants that agree to implement, and sustain a statewide, integrated service system on two levels:
- Between the state and local communities to implement, and sustain a statewide system
- Across health and human service systems to streamline and facilitate enrollment in a comprehensive array of high quality services and supports



## AoA Grant Announcement For State Units on Aging (cont'd.)

- An integrated, sustainable service system entails meeting two key objectives across these two levels:
- Objective 1. Coordinate the integration of a statewide set of programs that includes a Single Entry Point/No Wrong Door (SEP/NWD) access for individuals.
- Objective 2. Ensure access to a comprehensive, sustainable set of high quality services relevant to the population residing in the state's service area.

- The deadline date for submission of applications is 11:59 p.m., Eastern Time, on July 27, 2011.
- Please submit a letter of intent noting which Parts of the Program Announcement you plan to apply for under this Funding Opportunity by June 27, 2011.
