# NUMBERS TO KNOW

## Expanded Coverage:

- Due to the ACA, for the first time ever, <u>less than 10 percent</u> of Americans are uninsured with the uninsured rate currently at 9.1 percent. [HHS]
- Overall, <u>20 million</u> previously uninsured Americans have gained health insurance coverage since enactment of the Affordable Care Act. [HHS]
- Of the 20 million previously uninsured Americans who have gained health coverage, <u>6.1 million</u> are young adults ages 19 to 25. [HHS]
- <u>An estimated 12.7 million individuals</u> are signed up for coverage in Health Insurance Marketplace plans for 2016. [HHS]

#### New Consumer Protections:

- <u>129 million</u> Americans with pre-existing health conditions, including 17 million children, no longer have to worry about being denied coverage or charged higher premiums due to their health status. [HHS]
- <u>105 million</u> Americans no longer have a lifetime limit or an annual limit on their coverage. [HHS]

#### **Savings and Benefits for Seniors:**

- <u>Nearly 10.7 million seniors</u> have saved <u>more than \$20.8 billion</u> on their prescription drugs since 2010 an average savings of \$1,945 per senior. [CMS]
- <u>39.2 million</u> seniors in Medicare have received free preventive services with <u>no</u> co-pay under the ACA, due to the new free preventive services benefit. [CMS]
- Since the enactment of the ACA, the solvency of the Medicare Trust Fund has been extended by <u>13 years</u>. [CMS]

## Savings for Other Consumers:

- The average premium for employer-provided coverage rose <u>only 2.7 percent</u> in 2015 compared to an average annual rate of 9.5 percent in 2000-2010. [CEA]
- Americans have saved <u>\$9 billion</u> because of the new requirement that insurers have to spend at least 80 percent of every premium dollar they receive on quality health care. [HHS]
- <u>83 percent</u> of consumers buying health plans in the Marketplace qualify for tax credits that make their plans affordable. Nearly 7 in 10 consumers in the Marketplace can get covered for <u>\$75 or less a month</u> after tax credits. <u>[HHS]</u>
- <u>137 million</u> Americans in private plans now have guaranteed access to free preventive services, with <u>no</u> co-pay, due to the Affordable Care Act. [HHS]

#### **Savings for Taxpayers:**

- Over the last few years, health care costs have been growing <u>at the slowest rate</u> <u>in over 50 years</u> – benefiting taxpayers and consumers. [CEA]
- Due to slower cost growth, Medicare spent <u>\$473 billion less</u> from 2009 through 2014 than it would have if pre-ACA spending trends had continued. [HHS]
- <u>\$27.8 billion</u> has been recovered for taxpayers from stepped-up anti-fraud efforts in Medicare and other health programs under the ACA. [HHS]

#### **Improved Quality:**

- <u>87,000 lives</u> and <u>nearly \$20 billion</u> have been saved, due to a 17 percent reduction in hospital-acquired conditions, such as infections, from 2010 to 2014, under the ACA. [HHS]
- Under the ACA, unnecessary hospital readmissions in Medicare have fallen for the first time on record, resulting in <u>150,000 fewer readmissions</u>. [HHS]
- In 2015, in a survey, <u>86 percent</u> of consumers in Marketplace plans or newly insured under Medicaid due to the ACA, including 87 percent of Republicans, expressed satisfaction with their coverage. [Commonwealth Fund]
