FLASHBACK: <u>2009</u> – President Obama: "If you like your health care plan, you'll be able to keep your health care plan, period. No one will take it away, no matter what."

FLASHBACK: 2012 – President Obama: "If you're one of the more than 250 million Americans who already have health insurance, you will keep your health insurance – this law will only make it more secure and more affordable."

FLASHBACK: <u>2013</u> – White House Press Secretary Jay Carney was asked: "Does the president still contend that if Americans like their health plan, they can keep it? He did not manage to get that into a 50-minute speech." Carney replied, "Absolutely, he did get that in his speech."

Meanwhile...

Congressman Tiberi has continued raising questions about President Obama's false promise of being able to keep the health insurance that you have and like.

On July 16, 2009, during the Ways and Means Committee markup of the House version of the Affordable Care Act, Congressman Tiberi sought clarification about plans changing for employees. In summary he clarifies that "even if everyone likes the [health] plan, they have to change."

On July 23, 2009, Congressman Tiberi described President Obama's rhetoric as misleading. "The president's just not being straight with the American people."

On April 23, 2010, Congressman Tiberi told WCLT radio that the non-partisan Congressional Budget Office said that health care costs will increase and the number of people who got health care through their employer would decrease because of Obamacare. Once again it indicates that the president was wrong when he said that you could keep the health care plan you had and liked.

On February 28, 2012, during a Ways and Means hearing on health care and the budget, Congressman Tiberi questioned Secretary Sebelius about changes to health care plans for employees of the Columbus Catholic Diocese in order to comply with Obamacare.

On July 10, 2012, during a Floor Speech regarding Obamacare repeal, Congressman Tiberi talked about Central Ohio employers that were worried compliance with Obamacare would limit their ability to expand, hire, and offer benefits.
