- 6 SEC. 2. REGULATIONS SUPERSEDED.
- 7 (a) In General.—The following regulations shall
- 8 have no force or effect with regard to hand-propelled ves-

sels and the Secretary of the Interior may not issue substantially similar regulations that apply to hand-propelled 3 vessels: 4 (1) Section 7.13(d)(4)(ii) of title 36, Code of 5 Federal Regulations, regarding vessels on streams 6 and rivers in Yellowstone National Park. 7 (2) Section 7.22(e)(3) of title 36, Code of Fed-8 eral Regulations, regarding vessels on lakes and riv-9 ers in Grand Teton National Park. 10 (b) WILDLIFE-DEPENDANT RECREATIONAL USE.— Notwithstanding section 25.21(a) of title 50, Code of Fed-12 eral Regulations, regarding National Elk Refuge, the use 13 of hand-propelled vessels on rivers and streams in the National Elk Refuge shall be considered a "wildlife-depend-14 15 ent recreational use" as that term is defined in section

5(2) of Public Law 89–669 (16 U.S.C. 668ee(2)).
