Bradley Byrne is a lifelong resident of South Alabama, where he has always been involved in the local community through various service and economic development organizations. A graduate of Duke University and the University of Alabama School of Law, Byrne previously served as a member of Alabama State School Board, in the Alabama State Senate, and as chancellor of Alabama's community college system. Congressman Byrne was elected to the United States House of Representatives in 2013, to fill the seat of retiring Congressman Jo Bonner.

In Congress, Byrne has established himself as an effective legislator by successfully advocating for local interests while also championing a smaller, less invasive federal government. Byrne is a member of the prestigious House Rules Committee, Committee on Armed Services, and Committee on Education and the Workforce.
