As you may know, our Antilles Regulatory Section is processing a Joint Permit Application submitted by the Commonwealth Government that entails the installation of a 90 mile natural gas line. This line would transport natural gas from the Southern part of the Island to several power plants in the

Northern Part of Puerto Rico.

This project is the object of public controversy here on the Island. Various Environmental, Civic, Professional groups, as well as private citizens have expressed their opposition to the project at various public "Town Hall" meetings held by the Puerto Rico Environmental Board. It is getting a lot of news coverage.

On Saturday November 6, a Public Meeting was held in the town of Toa Baja Exemption (b)(6)
Because this is a delicate subject in which the USACE has to maintain full transparency and objectivity, I
