Fighting for Affordable Health Care

While the Supreme Court's decision regarding the Affordable Care Act (ACA) in *King v. Burwell* locked in federal insurance subsidies for approximately 15,000 individuals in the 14th District, it does nothing to stop crippling premium increases or prevent a health insurer monopoly that is severely restricting choice for hundreds of thousands of Illinoisians.

The ACA has caused health care to be grossly unaffordable to millions of Americans. Some in Illinois could face a more than 30 percent premium hike next year, and many simply can't afford even higher health costs.

I will not stop fighting to make health insurance better and more affordable for everyone in the 14th District. I have **cosponsored the three bills**

in the House that would repeal three of the ACA's costly and misguided taxes and move toward a more affordable health care system for Illinois individuals, families and businesses. Click here to read more in my letter to the Northwest Herald.

In addition, I joined the House in passing H.R. 6, the 21st Century Cures Act, a bill I cosponsored to accelerate the development of life-saving medical treatments. Medical researchers have discovered more than 10,000 diseases and conditions, but have found cures and treatments for just 500 of them. Unfortunately, under current regulations it takes around 14 years and \$2 billion or more to develop a new drug for suffering patients—and 95 percent of those drugs fail during development, according to NIH.

21st Century Cures will help speed up the discovery, development, and delivery of potential new treatments and cures by providing new incentives for drug development, streamlining the FDA's approval process for life-saving drugs and modernizing clinical trials, among other provisions.

Restoring Local Control of Education

Every child deserves a good education, but well-intentioned efforts like No Child Left Behind have fallen short of delivering on that promise. Further, through mandates like the Common Core Standards, the Department of Education has forced parents and educators to follow unflinchingly rigid standards, while also restricting students learning to standardized tests.

I believe our students are best educated by curriculum developed by the state and our communities, involving parents and students in the process. I supported House passage of the **Student Success Act (H.R. 5)** to help restore local control over education. H.R. 5 underwent a process of improvement as it moved through the House. While the final bill did not contain all of the

provisions I believe are necessary to give full responsibility back to parents and educators, the bill as amended is a step toward reversing the Department of Education's overreach and preventing future federal transgressions against state and local control of education policy.

I supported the Academic Partnerships Lead Us to Success Act (A PLUS) amendment which, if included, would have further reduced the power of the Secretary of Education to coerce states to adopt certain criteria, like the Common Core Standards, through threats to funding. Unfortunately, it was not included in final passage. I encourage further revision of the bill as the Senate works on its own version to ensure we restore local control over education to parents, teachers and students where it belongs.
