Driverless Cars and Smart Locomotives

I think I've hit the trifecta of Illinois commuting: taking the Metra to Chicago for years, driving to Springfield every week when I was in the state legislature, and now flying from O'Hare to Washington and back every week—and then of course fighting traffic to get home to my family in Plano. Many of you share my desire for relief from the daily commute.

But I had no idea driverless cars and smart trains were on the technology

horizon.

That's why I was so excited to hear from transportation experts at my **Community Leadership Forum on Transportation and Technology**. We have all seen changes happen in transportation over the decades, but rapid change and innovation is now upon us—innovations designed to save time and money.

These are the innovative ideas that are already taking hold right here in the 14th District. I'll be bringing these ideas with me back to Washington as we consider transportation funding and re-authorization legislation.

On my way to Agriculture Day at the Illinois State Fair in Springfield, I was able to stop by a key employer in our state: Caterpillar, Inc. I saw firsthand

how this manufacturer is creating jobs at their Track-Type Tractor facility. Many 14th District suppliers work with Peoria-based CAT to bring their products to the market, creating economic growth in our backyard.

Click here for information on legislation I have introduced, the **Modernizing American Manufacturing Bonds Act (MAMBA) of 2015 (H.R. 2890)**, to help manufacturers invest in new equipment and hire more workers.

In Oswego, I talked with employees at the local Home Depot to learn about their daily operations and how my work in Congress can help them as they carry out their jobs.

Centegra Hospital-Huntley is in the construction phase of its 360,000 square-foot, 128-bed facility. It is estimated that more than 800 jobs will be created to build the hospital, having a total economic impact of \$152 million on local communities.

Centegra Health System hopes to eventually employ about 1,000 Associates at the new hospital. I visited the construction site to get an update on their progress.

Did you know Illinois' farm and fiber industry employs nearly 1 million people, and generates tens of billions of dollars annually to help bolster our economy?

In McHenry County I also met with Sheriff Bill Prim and staff to discuss their detainee contracts with federal agencies, as well as how to continue working together as a community to fight heroin abuse and keep our families safe.

Urging Investigations into Planned Parenthood

In light of the many videos revealing what goes on inside the organization's facilities, I believe Planned Parenthood's activities deserve an immediate and thorough investigation by both state and federal law enforcement. At the state level, I am urging Illinois to act on HR 0671, a resolution introduced by State Representative Jeanne Ives (R-Wheaton) pushing the state to investigate Planned Parenthood and its abortion procedures.

Regardless of the already brutal and grotesque nature of their abortion procedures on unborn life, what was caught on tape reveals they are apparently engaging in trafficking in human organs—a federal offense.

At the national level, <u>I am pushing the Department of Justice to also investigate</u>, and I have cosponsored H.R. 3134 which would place an immediate moratorium on all federal funding of Planned Parenthood for one year while Congress conducts a full investigation.

Planned Parenthood receives more than half a billion dollars from U.S. taxpayers and performs more than 350,000 abortions every year.

Until we have answers, Planned Parenthood should not receive one more dime of taxpayer dollars.

In case you missed it, I wrote in the Sun-Times about how there are many other qualified health centers in Illinois which are already providing comprehensive care to women.
