# Encouraging Career-Minded Students on National Manufacturing Day

On Friday I celebrated Manufacturing Day with seniors from Mooseheart Child City and School and employees at Scot Forge manufacturing plant and headquarters in Spring Grove. There, the students and I met with executives from the company, saw their work first-hand, and learned about the exciting careers available in manufacturing.

Contrary to some misinformation out there, manufacturing careers have strong opportunities for advancement and boast competitive salaries. According to the National Association of Manufacturers there were 579,600 manufacturing employees in Illinois in 2014, with an average annual compensation of \$78,971 in 2013.

As we visited one our district's great employers, I could see how these high school seniors' eyes lit up at the opportunities they didn't know were available to them in manufacturing. We need to expose even more students to STEM fields as they plan their futures.

Parents are the key drivers in getting their kids excited about the world and career possibilities, yet many are misinformed about manufacturing. There are tremendous opportunities for advancement and income growth. I hope the students excited about today's visit can go back home and get their classmates and parents excited about manufacturing careers.

#### Fighting Religious Persecution by ISIS

As the Middle East continues to be in a state of turmoil, <u>I spoke with the Wall Street Journal</u> this week about the need for Congress and the Administration to act to save a number of religious minorities targeted for annihilation by ISIS.

One solution I have cosponsored is <u>H.R. 1568</u>, the <u>Protecting Religious</u>

<u>Minorities Persecuted by ISIS Act of 2015</u>, which would require the secretary of state to report to Congress a plan to expedite the processing of refugee admissions applications for religious minorities threatened with extinction by ISIS.

#### Additional Legislative Update

Here are some additional actions I've taken in Congress on behalf of the 14th District:

Co-sponsored H.R. 3220, the Medicare Common Access Card Act of 2015, requiring Medicare to pilot smart card technology to reduce fraud in the program often facilitated by unsafe paper cards. Advancing technology in health care is critically important to improving quality, expanding access, preventing fraud and abuse, and reducing costs across the Medicare program and the larger U.S. health care system.

Opposed House passage of a short-term bill funding the government through December. I opposed this legislation because Congress failed to do its job of cutting spending to fight our ballooning national debt, and yet again has ceded more authority to the executive branch to act completely independently without the input of the representatives of the American people. This short-term spending bill fails in our congressional responsibility to conduct proper oversight and pass bills to properly fund the government. I was also disappointed the House failed to stop sending taxpayer dollars to Planned Parenthood which has engaged in horrific practices and possibly in the trafficking of human body parts. The House and Senate must come together, do the rigorous work of reviewing taxpayer-funded programs to determine their usefulness, and stand up for Americans wanting real leadership in Washington.

Supported Financial Services Committee passage of a bill I cosponsored, H.R. 1090, the Retail Protection Investor Act. The bill protects retail financial planners and their customers from a planned Department of Labor rule which restricts choice and shows a lack of trust in American consumers. I have consistently urged the DOL to reconsider and change course. Democrats agree, which is why they have filed similar objections to the rule.

Supported House passage of the National Defense Authorization Act

for Fiscal Year 2016 which authorizes the necessary funding for the Department of Defense (DOD) so service men and women have the tools and resources they need to defend the nation. As the world grows more dangerous and uncertain, this legislation ensures our nation's armed forces are agile, efficient, and ready. It provides care for our service men and women, and their families, through retirement plan access, housing assistance, and improved childcare access.

#### Voted with the House to pass three pro-life pieces of legislation:

- H.R. 3134, the Defund Planned Parenthood Act of 2015, a bill I cosponsored which provides for a one-year moratorium on all federal funding while the organization's activities are investigated.
- H.R. 3495, the Women's Public Health and Safety Act, which provides state governments with flexibility to choose to only include in a state's Medicaid program health care providers who do not perform, or participate in the performance of, elective abortions. Given the appalling activities revealed to be occurring at Planned Parenthood clinics, states should have the option to direct tax dollars away from abortion providers like Planned Parenthood and toward comprehensive health care providers.
- H.R. 3504, the Born-Alive Abortion Survivors Protection
   Act, which would make failure to provide standard medical care to
   children born alive during an abortion a federal crime. It would also
   apply stronger penalties in cases where an overt act is taken to kill the
   abortion survivor. There is also a civil right of action for mothers of
   children who survive an abortion to hold the abortion provider
   accountable.
