To provide that no Federal funds, fees, or resources may be used to implement certain executive orders, to suspend rule making authority, and for other purposes.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- This Act may be cited as the "End Executive Over-
- 5 reach Act".

1	SEC. 2. RESTRICTION ON THE USE OF FEDERAL FUNDS TO
2	IMPLEMENT EXECUTIVE ORDERS.
3	Beginning on the date of the enactment of this Act,
4	and ending on January 21, 2017, no Federal funds, fees,
5	or resources may be used to implement an executive order
6	which is issued on or after the date of the enactment of
7	this Act.
8	SEC. 3. SUSPENSION OF RULE MAKING AUTHORITY.
9	Beginning on the date of the enactment of this Act,
10	and ending on January 21, 2017, no agency may engage
11	in rule making relating to, or finalize a rule that is—
12	(1) a major rule;
13	(2) a rule that may raise novel legal or policy
14	issues arising out of legal mandates, the President's
15	priorities, or the principles set forth in Executive
16	Order 12866 (58 Fed. Reg. 190); or
17	(3) a rule that may create a serious inconsist-
18	ency or otherwise interfere with an action taken or
19	planned by another agency.
20	SEC. 4. DEFINITIONS.
21	In this Act:
22	(1) The term "agency" has the meaning given
23	such term in section 551 of title 5, United States
24	Code.

1	(2) The term "major rule" has the meaning
2	given such term in section 804 of title 5, United
3	States Code.
4	(3) The term "rule making" has the meaning
5	given such term in section 551 of title 5, United

States Code.
