3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Southwest Border Pro-
- 5 tection Act of 2014".

1SEC. 2. ACTIVATION AND DEPLOYMENT OF MEMBERS OF2THE NATIONAL GUARD TO SUPPORT DEPART-3MENT OF HOMELAND SECURITY BORDER4CONTROL ACTIVITIES ALONG INTER-5NATIONAL BORDER BETWEEN THE UNITED6STATES AND MEXICO.

7 (a) EXPANDED Deployment NATIONAL OF 8 GUARD.—At the request of a Governor of a State that 9 shares a portion of the international border between the United States and Mexico, the Secretary of Defense shall 10 11 order to active duty, and provide for the deployment of, members of the National Guard along such border the as-12 sist United States Customs and Border Protection in 13 14 achieving operational control of such border.

15 (b) NUMBER OF GUARDSMEN DEPLOYED.—At least 10,000 members of the National Guard shall be ordered 16 to active duty and deployed under the authority of this 17 section along the international border between the United 18 19 States and Mexico. Members ordered to active duty and 20 deployed under the authority of this section shall be in 21 addition to the number of members of the National Guard 22 so deployed along such border as of the date of the enact-23 ment of this Act.

(c) DURATION.—The deployment of members of the
National Guard under the authority of this section in a
State that shares a portion of the international border be-

tween the United States and Mexico shall continue until
 the earlier of the following:

- 3 (1) The date on which the Secretary of Home4 land Security certifies that the Federal Government
 5 has achieved operational control of such border.
- 6 (2) The date on which the Governor of the
 7 State withdraws the request made under subsection
 8 (a).

9 (d) EXEMPTION FROM END STRENGTHS AND OTHER
10 LIMITATIONS.—Members of the National Guard deployed
11 under the authority of this section shall not be counted
12 toward —

13 (1) any limits on end strength; or

14 (2) limits on the number of National Guard15 personal that may be placed on active duty for oper-16 ational support.

(e) OPERATIONAL CONTROL DEFINED.—In this section, the term "operational control" has the meaning given
that term in section 2(b) of the Secure Fence Act of 2006
(Public Law 109–367; 8 U.S.C. 1701 note).
