Andrew Small is the Transatlantic Fellow at the German Marshall Fund of the United States (GMF) in Brussels, Belgium.

Andrew Small joined the German Marshall Fund in 2006 and coordinates GMF's work on Asia and transatlantic relations, with a focus on China. He previously worked as the director of the Foreign Policy Centre's Beijing office, and has also been a Visiting Fellow at the Chinese Academy of Social Sciences (CASS). His research has concentrated on Chinese foreign policy, with a particular focus on U.S.-China relations, EU-China relations, and China's role in "problem" and fragile states - including Afghanistan, Pakistan, Iran, Burma/Myanmar, North Korea, and Sudan. He has been published in *Foreign Affairs*, the *Washington Quarterly*, the *New York Times*, and the *International Herald Tribune* and has testified to the European Parliament. As well as his work on China he has advised European governments on public diplomacy strategy and was an ESU scholar in the office of Senator Edward M. Kennedy in the summer of 2001.
