## Never Forget 9/11



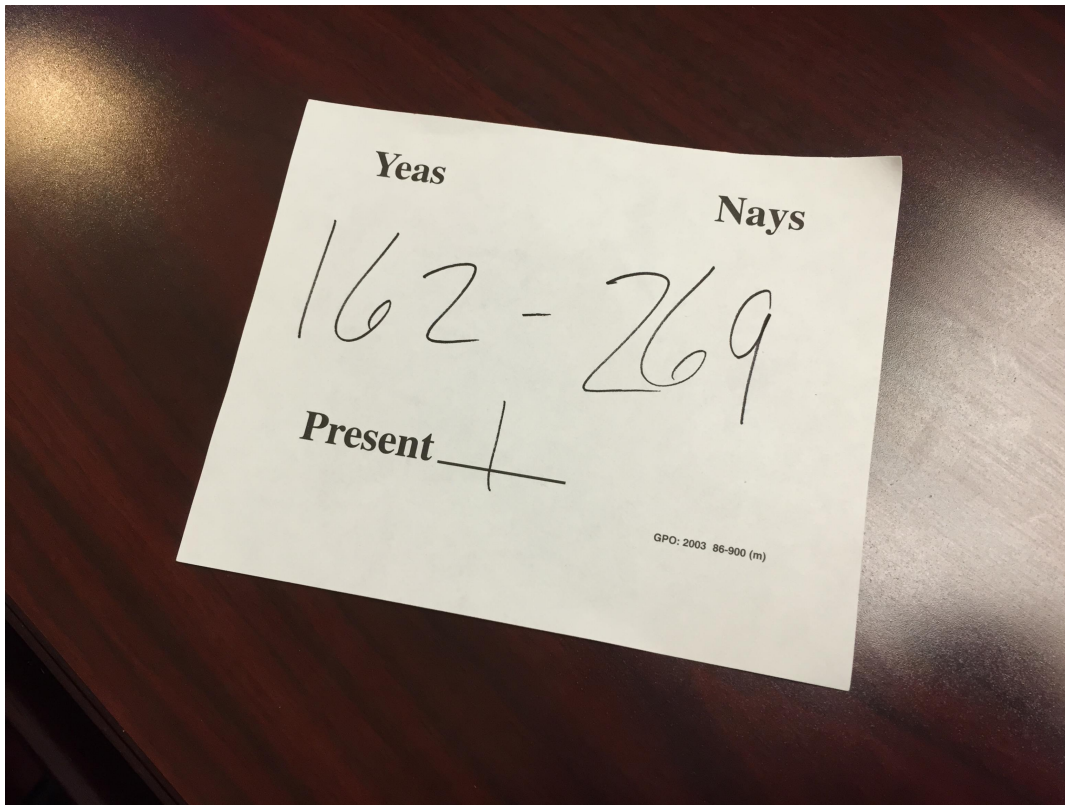
Fourteen years ago, the attacks against our nation left scars on our people and on the land. But our memorials redeem the physical scars of tragedy and remind us of our strength embodied in our everyday and extraordinary heroes.

I have cosponsored legislation (**H.R. 3036**) to declare the 9/11 Memorial site, constructed in remembrance of the attack on the World Trade Center towers in New York, a national memorial. This bill would further authorize

funding to maintain security and operations of the plaza, ensuring the grounds remain open to all for years to come.

We not only remember a day of horror, but of the great bravery and heroism displayed by our first responders and the unity of our country. This bill makes certain the grounds of the 9/11 Memorial plaza are maintained for the world to never forget that attack on our country, and for our citizens to stand firm in defense of our freedoms and our way of life.

### Saying “No” to Flawed Iran Deal



This picture is of the final vote tally I read from the chair as the House rejected the President's Iran deal. In a series of three votes, the House:

- Affirmed that the President did not comply with the Iran Nuclear Agreement Review Act by withholding key, confidential side agreements from Congress between Iran and the International Atomic Energy Agency. (He has still failed to deliver the pertinent documents to Congress.)
- Denied the President the authority to lift sanctions on Iran.
- Rejected the overall nuclear deal.

Now, we all must show our officers, and their families that serve alongside them, our strong appreciation and support that they deserve. We must stand together against violence toward law enforcement.

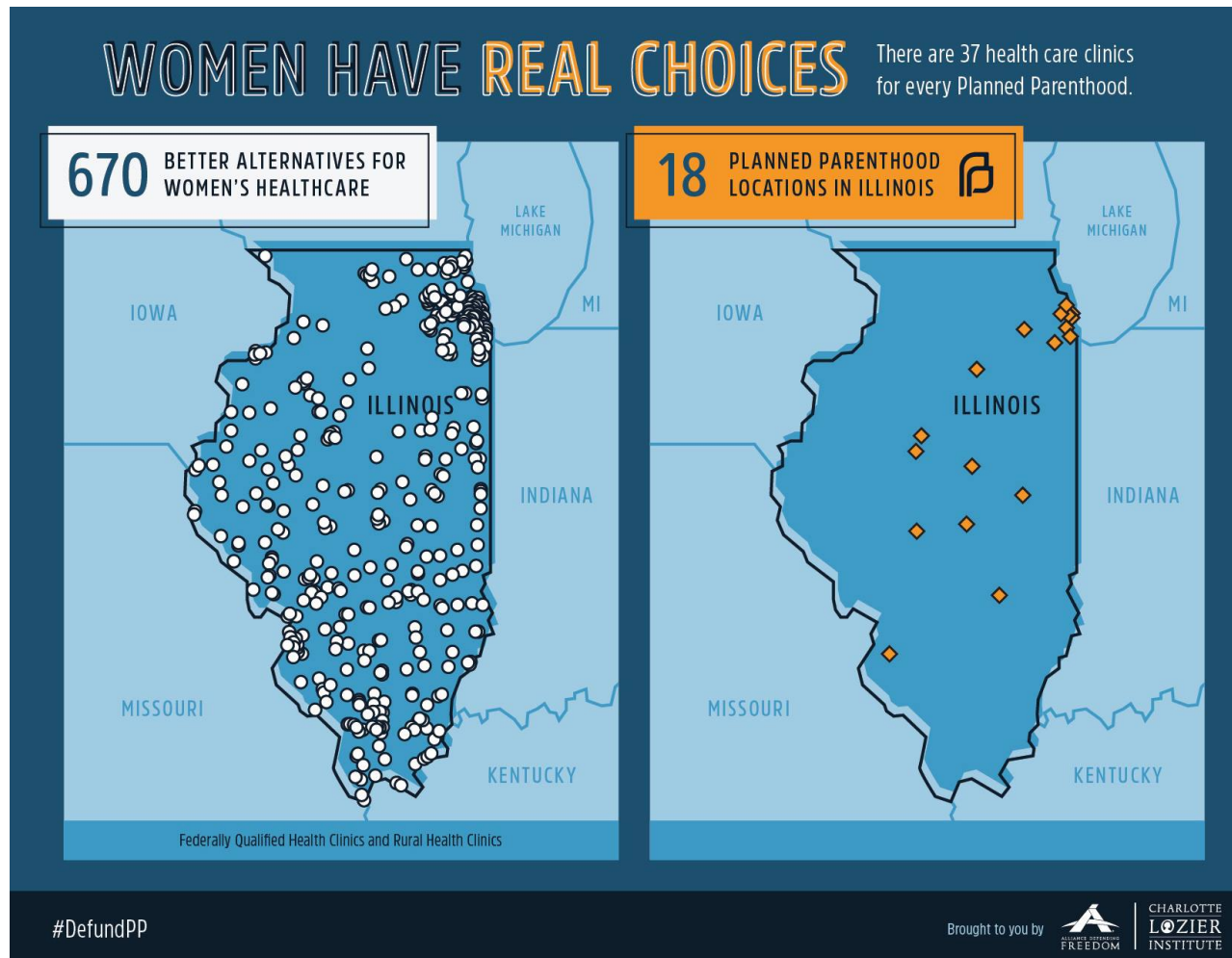
### Fighting for Whole Woman Health Care—Not Abortion

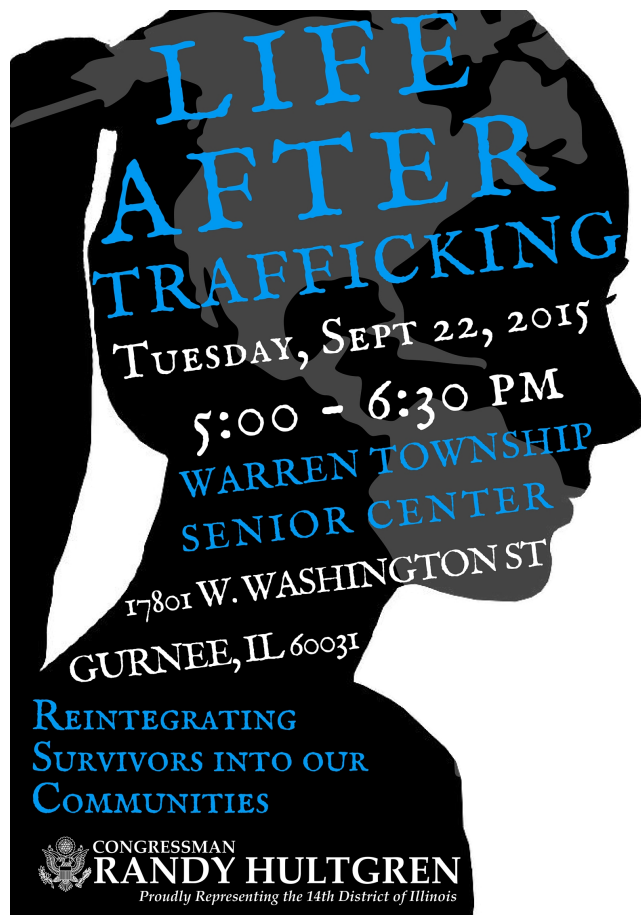
defend their content.
