19	"(c) Cooperative Research.—

1	"(1) In general.—As part of the program es-
2	tablished in subsection (a), the Secretary may carry
3	out cooperative research on hazardous materials
4	transport.
5	"(2) National academies.—The Secretary
6	may enter into an agreement with the National
7	Academies to support such research.
8	"(3) Research.—Research conducted under
9	this subsection may include activities related to—
10	"(A) emergency planning and response, in-
11	cluding information and programs that can be
12	readily assessed and implemented in local juris-
13	dictions;
14	"(B) risk analysis and perception and data
15	assessment;
16	"(C) commodity flow data, including vol-
17	untary collaboration between shippers and first
18	responders for secure data exchange of critical
19	information;
20	"(D) integration of safety and security;
21	"(E) cargo packaging and handling;
22	"(F) hazmat release consequences; and
23	"(G) materials and equipment testing.".
