## A BILL

To authorize appropriations for fiscal year 2018 for military activities of the Department of Defense and for military construction, to prescribe military personnel strengths for such fiscal year, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “National Defense Au-  
5 thorization Act for Fiscal Year 2018”.

8 Funds are hereby authorized to be appropriated for

15 Funds are hereby authorized to be appropriated for  
16 fiscal year 2018 for purchases under the Defense Produc-  
17 tion Act of 1950 (50 U.S.C. 4501 et seq.) in the amount  
18 of \$37,401,000.

19 **Subtitle B—Air Force Programs**

20 **SEC. 111. PROCUREMENT AUTHORITY FOR CERTAIN PARTS**  
21 **OF INTERCONTINENTAL BALLISTIC MISSILE**  
22 **FUZES.**

23 (a) AVAILABILITY OF FUNDS.—Notwithstanding sec-  
24 tion 1502(a) of title 31, United States Code, of the  
25 amount authorized to be appropriated for fiscal year 2018  
26 by section 103 for Missile Procurement, Air Force,

1 \$6,334,000 shall be available for the procurement of cov-  
2 ered parts pursuant to contracts entered into under sec-  
3 tion 1645(a) of the Carl Levin and Howard P. “Buck”  
4 McKeon National Defense Authorization Act for Fiscal  
5 Year 2015 (Public Law 113–291; 128 Stat. 3651).

6 (b) COVERED PARTS DEFINED.—In this section, the  
7 term “covered parts” means commercially available off-  
8 the-shelf items as defined in section 104 of title 41, United  
9 States Code.

### 12 **SEC. 121. F-35 ECONOMIC ORDER QUANTITY CONTRACTING** 13 **AUTHORITY.**

14 The Secretary of Defense may enter into one or more

17 has completed formal hardware qualification testing for  
18 the F–35 aircraft for use in procurement contracts to be

8 **SEC. 401. END STRENGTHS FOR ACTIVE FORCES.**

9 The Armed Forces are authorized strengths for active  
10 duty personnel as of September 30, 2018, as follows:

11 (1) The Army, 476,000.

12 (2) The Navy, 327,900.

13 (3) The Marine Corps, 185,000.

14 (4) The Air Force, 325,100.

15 **Subtitle B—Reserve Forces**

16 **SEC. 411. END STRENGTHS FOR SELECTED RESERVE.**

17 (a) IN GENERAL.—The Armed Forces are authorized  
18 strengths for Selected Reserve personnel of the reserve  
19 components as of September 30, 2018, as follows:

20 (1) The Army National Guard of the United  
21 States, 343,000.

22 (2) The Army Reserve, 199,000.

23 (3) The Navy Reserve, 59,000.

24 (4) The Marine Corps Reserve, 38,500.

1           (5) The Air National Guard of the United  
2 States, 106,600.

3           (6) The Air Force Reserve, 69,800.

4           (7) The Coast Guard Reserve, 7,000.

5       (b) END STRENGTH REDUCTIONS.—The end  
6 strengths prescribed by subsection (a) for the Selected Re-  
7 serve of any reserve component shall be proportionately  
8 reduced by—

9           (1) the total authorized strength of units orga-  
10 nized to serve as units of the Selected Reserve of  
11 such component which are on active duty (other  
12 than for training) at the end of the fiscal year; and

13           (2) the total number of individual members not  
14 in units organized to serve as units of the Selected  
15 Reserve of such component who are on active duty  
16 (other than for training or for unsatisfactory partici-  
17 pation in training) without their consent at the end  
18 of the fiscal year.

19       (c) END STRENGTH INCREASES.—Whenever units or  
20 individual members of the Selected Reserve for any reserve  
21 component are released from active duty during any fiscal  
22 year, the end strength prescribed for such fiscal year for  
23 the Selected Reserve of such reserve component shall be  
24 increased proportionately by the total authorized strengths

1 of such units and by the total number of such individual  
2 members.

3 **SEC. 412. END STRENGTHS FOR RESERVES ON ACTIVE**  
4 **DUTY IN SUPPORT OF THE RESERVES.**

5 Within the end strengths prescribed in section  
6 411(a), the reserve components of the Armed Forces are  
7 authorized, as of September 30, 2018, the following num-  
8 ber of Reserves to be serving on full-time active duty or  
9 full-time duty, in the case of members of the National  
10 Guard, for the purpose of organizing, administering, re-  
11 cruiting, instructing, or training the reserve components:

12 (1) The Army National Guard of the United

22 The minimum number of military technicians (dual  
23 status) as of the last day of fiscal year 2018 for the re-  
24 serve components of the Army and the Air Force (notwith-

1 standing section 129 of title 10, United States Code) shall  
2 be the following:

3 (1) For the Army National Guard of the United  
4 States, 25,507.

5 (2) For the Army Reserve, 7,427.

6 (3) For the Air National Guard of the United  
7 States, 21,893.

8 (4) For the Air Force Reserve, 10,160.

9 **SEC. 414. MAXIMUM NUMBER OF RESERVE PERSONNEL AU-**  
10 **THORIZED TO BE ON ACTIVE DUTY FOR**  
11 **OPERATIONAL SUPPORT.**

12 During fiscal year 2018, the maximum number of  
13 members of the reserve components of the Armed Forces  
14 who may be serving at any time on full-time operational  
15 support duty under section 115(b) of title 10, United  
16 States Code, is the following:

13 adjustment to become effective during fiscal year 2018 re-  
14 quired by section 1009 of title 37, United States Code,  
15 in the rates of monthly basic pay authorized members of  
16 the uniformed services shall not be made.

17           (b) **INCREASE IN BASIC PAY.**—Effective on January  
18 1, 2018, the rates of monthly basic pay for members of  
19 the uniformed services are increased by 2.1 percent.
