#### A BILL

To amend the Homeland Security Act of 2002 to establish a Joint Counterterrorism Awareness Workshop Series, and for other purposes.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Joint Counterterrorism
- 5 Awareness Workshop Series Act of 2017".
- 6 SEC. 2. JOINT COUNTERTERRORISM AWARENESS WORK-
- 7 SHOP SERIES.
- 8 (a) In General.—Title V of the Homeland Security
- 9 Act of 2002 (6 U.S.C. 311 et seq.) is amended by adding
- 10 at the end the following new section:
- 11 "SEC. 529. JOINT COUNTERTERRORISM AWARENESS WORK-
- 12 SHOP SERIES.
- 13 "(a) IN GENERAL.—The Administrator, in consulta-
- 14 tion with the Director of the National Counterterrorism
- 15 Center and the Director of the Federal Bureau of Inves-
- 16 tigation, shall establish a Joint Counterterrorism Aware-
- 17 ness Workshop Series (in this section referred to as the
- 18 'Workshop Series') to address emerging terrorist threats
- 19 and to enhance the ability of State and local jurisdictions
- 20 to prevent, protect against, respond to, and recover from
- 21 terrorist attacks.
- 22 "(b) Purpose.—The Workshop Series established
- 23 under subsection (a) shall include the following compo-
- 24 nents:

- "(1) Reviewing existing preparedness, response, and interdiction plans, policies, and procedures related to terrorist attacks of the participating jurisdictions and identifying gaps in such plans, operational capabilities, response resources, and authorities.
  - "(2) Identifying Federal, State, and local resources available to address the gaps identified in accordance with paragraph (1).
    - "(3) Providing assistance, through training, exercises, and other means, to build or sustain, as appropriate, the capabilities to close such identified gaps.
    - "(4) Examining the roles and responsibilities of participating agencies and respective communities in the event of a terrorist attack.
  - "(5) Improving situational awareness and information sharing among all participating agencies in the event of a terrorist attack.
- 20 "(6) Identifying and sharing best practices and 21 lessons learned from each Workshop Series estab-22 lished under subsection (a).
- 23 "(c) Designation of Participating Cities.—The
- 24 Administrator shall select jurisdictions to host a Workshop
- 25 Series from those cities that—

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1	"(1) are currently receiving, or that previously
2	received, funding under section 2003; and
3	"(2) have requested to be considered.
4	"(d) Workshop Series Participants.—Individ-
5	uals from State and local jurisdictions and emergency re-
6	sponse providers in cities designated under subsection (c)
7	shall be eligible to participate in the Workshop Series, in-
8	cluding the following:
9	"(1) Senior elected and appointed officials.
10	"(2) Law enforcement.
11	"(3) Fire and Rescue.
12	"(4) Emergency management.
13	"(5) Emergency Medical Services.
14	"(6) Public health officials.
15	"(7) Private sector representatives.
16	"(8) Other participants as deemed appropriate
17	by the Administrator.
18	"(e) Reports.—
19	"(1) Workshop series report.—The Admin-
20	istrator, in consultation with the Director of the Na-
21	tional Counterterrorism Center, the Director of the
22	Federal Bureau of Investigation, and officials from
23	the city in which a Workshop Series is held, shall de-
24	velop and submit to all of the agencies participating
25	in such Workshop Series a report after the conclu-

- sion of each such Workshop Series that addressesthe following:
- 3 "(A) Key findings about lessons learned 4 and best practices from each such Workshop 5 Series.
- 6 "(B) Potential mitigation strategies and 7 resources to address gaps identified during each 8 such Workshop Series.
- "(2) Annual reports.—Not later than one 9 year after the date of the enactment of this section 10 11 and annually thereafter for the next seven years, the 12 Administrator, in consultation with the Director of 13 the National Counterterrorism Center and the Di-14 rector of the Federal Bureau of Investigation, shall 15 submit to the Committee on Homeland Security of 16 the House of Representatives and the Committee on 17 Homeland Security and Governmental Affairs of the 18 Senate a comprehensive summary report of the key 19 themes, lessons learned, and best practices identified 20 during the Workshop Series held during the previous 21 year.
- 22 "(f) AUTHORIZATION.—There is authorized to be appropriated \$1,000,000 to carry out this section.".
- 24 (b) CLERICAL AMENDMENT.—The table of contents 25 in section 1(b) of the Homeland Security Act of 2002 is

- 1 amended by inserting after the item relating to section
- 2 528 the following new item:

"Sec. 529. Joint Counterterrorism Awareness Workshop Series.".

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
