AN ACT

Making emergency supplemental appropriations for fiscal year 2001 for additional disaster assistance, for antiterrorism initiatives, and for assistance in the recovery from the tragedy that occurred on September 11, 2001, and for other purposes.

1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, 3 That the following sums are appropriated, out of any money in the Treasury not otherwise appropriated, to provide emergency supplemental appropriations for fiscal year 6 2001, namely: 7 EXECUTIVE OFFICE OF THE PRESIDENT AND 8 FUNDS APPROPRIATED TO THE PRESIDENT 9 EMERGENCY RESPONSE FUND 10 (INCLUDING TRANSFERS OF FUNDS) 11 For emergency expenses to respond to the terrorist 12 attacks on the United States that occurred on September 13 11, 2001, to provide assistance to the victims of the attacks, and to deal with other consequences of the attacks, 14 15 \$40,000,000,000, to remain available until expended, including for the costs of: (1) providing Federal, State, and 16 local preparedness for mitigating and responding to the 17 attacks; (2) providing support to counter, investigate, or 18 prosecute domestic or international terrorism; (3) pro-19 viding increased transportation security; (4) repairing 21 public facilities and transportation systems damaged by

25 this Act: Provided further, That the Congress designates

the attacks; and (5) supporting national security: Pro-

vided, That these funds may be transferred to any author-

ized Federal Government activity to meet the purposes of

- 1 the entire amount as an emergency requirement pursuant
- 2 to section 251(b)(2)(A) of the Balanced Budget and
- 3 Emergency Deficit Control Act of 1985: Provided further,
- 4 That \$40,000,000,000 shall be available only to the extent
- 5 that an official budget request, that includes designation
- 6 of the \$40,000,000,000 as an emergency requirement as
- 7 defined in the Balanced Budget and Emergency Deficit
- 8 Control Act of 1985, is transmitted by the President to
- 9 the Congress: Provided further, That the President shall
- 10 consult with the chairmen and ranking minority members
- 11 of the Committees on Appropriations prior to the transfer
- 12 of these funds: Provided further, That of the
- 13 \$40,000,000,000 made available herein, \$10,000,000,000
- 14 shall not be available for transfer to any Department or
- 15 Agency until 15 days after the Director of the Office of
- 16 Management and Budget has submitted to the House and
- 17 Senate Committees on Appropriations a proposed alloca-
- 18 tion and plan for use of the funds for that Department
- 19 or Agency; \$20,000,000,000 may be obligated only when
- 20 enacted in a subsequent emergency appropriations bill, in
- 21 response to the terrorist acts on September 11, 2001: Pro-
- 22 vided further, That the President shall transmit an amend-
- 23 ed budget request proposing an allocation of funds: Pro-
- 24 vided further, That not less than one-half of the
- 25 \$40,000,000,000 shall be for disaster recovery activities

- 1 and assistance related to the terrorist acts in New York,
- 2 Virginia, and Pennsylvania on September 11, 2001, as au-
- 3 thorized by law: Provided further, That the Director of the
- 4 Office of Management and Budget shall provide quarterly
- 5 reports to the Committees on Appropriations on the use
- 6 of these funds, beginning not later than January 2, 2002:
- 7 Provided further, That the President shall submit to the
- 8 Congress as soon as practicable detailed requests to meet
- 9 any further funding requirements for the purposes speci-
- 10 fied in this Act.

11 GENERAL PROVISIONS

- 12 Sec. 101. Funds appropriated by this Act, or made
- 13 available by the transfer of funds in this Act, for intel-
- 14 ligence activities are deemed to be specifically authorized
- 15 by the Congress for purposes of section 504 of the Na-
- 16 tional Security Act of 1947 (50 U.S.C. 414).
- 17 Sec. 102. Funds appropriated by this Act, or made
- 18 available by the transfer of funds in this Act, may be obli-
- 19 gated and expended notwithstanding section 10 of Public
- 20 Law 91–672, section 313 of the Foreign Relations Author-
- 21 ization Act, fiscal years 1994 and 1995, and section 15
- 22 of the State Department Basic Authorities Act of 1956.

- 1 This Act may be cited as the "2001 Emergency Sup-
- 2 plemental Appropriations Act for Recovery from and Re-
- 3 sponse to Terrorist Attacks on the United States".
