A BILL

To amend the Homeland Security Act of 2002 to make technical corrections to the requirement that the Secretary of Homeland Security submit quadrennial homeland security reviews, and for other purposes.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

4 This Act may be cited as the “Quadrennial Homeland
5 Security Review Technical Corrections Act of 2017”.

6 SEC. 2. TECHNICAL CORRECTIONS TO QUADRENNIAL

7 HOMELAND SECURITY REVIEW.

8 (a) IN GENERAL.—Section 707 of the Homeland Se-
9 curity Act of 2002 (6 U.S.C. 347) is amended—

10 (1) in subsection (a)(3)—

15 (C) by inserting after subparagraph (B)
16 the following new subparagraph:

17 “(C) representatives from appropriate ad-
18 visory committees established pursuant to sec-
19 tion 871, including the Homeland Security Ad-
20 visory Council and the Homeland Security
21 Science and Technology Advisory Committee, or
22 otherwise established, including the Aviation
23 Security Advisory Committee established pursu-
24 ant to section 44946 of title 49, United States
25 Code; and”;

- 1 (2) in subsection (b)—
2 (A) in paragraph (2), by inserting before
3 the semicolon at the end the following: “based
4 on the risk assessment required pursuant to
5 subsection (c)(2)(B)”;
6 (B) in paragraph (3)—
7 (i) by inserting “, to the extent prac-
8 ticable,” after “describe”; and
9 (ii) by striking “budget plan” and in-
10 serting “resources required”;
11 (C) in paragraph (4)—
12 (i) by inserting “, to the extent prac-
13 ticable,” after “identify”;
14 (ii) by striking “budget plan required
15 to provide sufficient resources to success-
16 fully” and inserting “resources required
17 to”; and
18 (iii) by striking the semicolon at the
19 end and inserting the following: “, includ-
20 ing any resources identified from redun-
21 dant, wasteful, or unnecessary capabilities
22 or capacities that may be redirected to bet-
23 ter support other existing capabilities or
24 capabilities, as the case may be; and”;

(D) in paragraph (5), by striking “; and” and inserting a period; and

(E) by striking paragraph (6);

(3) in subsection (c)—

(A) in paragraph (1), by striking “December 31 of the year” and inserting “60 days after the date of the submission of the President’s budget for the fiscal year after the fiscal year”;

(B) in paragraph (2)—

(i) in subparagraph (B), by striking “description of the threats to” and inserting “risk assessment of”;

(ii) in subparagraph (C), by inserting
“, as required under subsection (b)(2)” be-
fore the semicolon at the end:

(iii) in subparagraph (D)—

(I) by inserting "to the extent practicable," before "a description"; and

(II) by striking “budget plan” and inserting “resources required”;

(iv) in subparagraph (F)—

1 “(A) Records regarding the consultation
2 carried out the pursuant to subsection (a)(3),
3 including—

4 “(i) all written communications, in-
5 cluding communications sent out by the
6 Secretary and feedback submitted to the
7 Secretary through technology, online com-
8 munications tools, in-person discussions,
9 and the interagency process; and

10 “(ii) information on how feedback re-
11 ceived by the Secretary informed each such
12 quadrennial homeland security review.

13 “(B) Information regarding the risk as-
14 essment required under subsection (c)(2)(B),
15 including—

16 “(i) the risk model utilized to generate
17 such risk assessment;

18 “(ii) information, including data used
19 in the risk model, utilized to generate such
20 risk assessment;

21 “(iii) sources of information, including
22 other risk assessments, utilized to generate
23 such risk assessment; and

24 “(iv) information on assumptions,
25 weighing factors, and subjective judgments

1 utilized to generate such risk assessment,
2 together with information on the rationale
3 or basis thereof.”;

4 (4) by redesignating subsection (d) as sub-
5 section (e); and

6 (5) by inserting after subsection (c) the fol-
7 lowing new subsection:

8 “(d) REVIEW.—Not later than 90 days after the sub-
9 mission of each report required under subsection (c)(1),
10 the Secretary shall provide to the Committee on Homeland
11 Security of the House of Representatives and the Com-
12 mittee on Homeland Security and Governmental Affairs
13 of the Senate information on the degree to which the find-
14 ings and recommendations developed in the quadrennial
15 homeland security review that is the subject of such report
16 were integrated into the acquisition strategy and expendi-
17 ture plans for the Department.”.

18 (b) EFFECTIVE DATE.—The amendments made by
19 this Act shall apply with respect to a quadrennial home-
20 land security review conducted after December 31, 2021.

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
