# **A BILL**

To require counterterrorism information sharing  
coordination, and for other purposes.

1       *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4       This Act may be cited as the “Counterterrorism In-

5 formation Sharing Improvement Act of 2017”.

6 **SEC. 2. COUNTERTERRORISM INFORMATION SHARING CO-**  
7 **ORDINATION.**

8       (a) IN GENERAL.—The President, acting through the  
9 Secretary of Homeland Security, shall ensure that, for  
10 counterterrorism purposes, the Department of the Home-  
11 land Security has access to biographic and biometric data  
12 collected by the United States Government on individuals  
13 associated with a terrorist organization.

14       (b) COORDINATION.—The President shall direct the  
15 heads of relevant Federal departments and agencies to co-  
16 ordinate with the Secretary of Homeland Security to mini-  
17 mize and overcome any administrative, technical, capacity,  
18 or classification challenges to carrying out subsection (a).

19       (c) PROTECTIONS.—The Secretary of Homeland Se-  
20 curity shall ensure that all relevant laws, rules, and proce-  
21 dures, including the section 552(a) of title 5, United  
22 States Code (commonly referred to as the “Privacy Act”  
23 or the “Privacy Act of 1974”), regarding classification lev-  
24 els and civil rights and civil liberties are followed while  
25 seeking to carry out subsection (a).

1 (d) REPORT TO CONGRESS.—

2 (1) IN GENERAL.—Not later than 90 days after  
3 the date of the enactment of this Act, the Secretary  
4 of Homeland Security shall, consistent with the pro-  
5 tection of classified information, submit to the Com-  
6 mittee on Homeland Security of the House of Rep-  
7 resentatives and the Committee on Homeland Secu-  
8 rity and Governmental Affairs of the Senate a report  
9 on the implementation of this section.

10 (2) CONTENTS.—The report required under  
11 paragraph (1) shall include a description of how the  
12 data referred to in subsection (a) is utilized for De-  
13 partment of Homeland Security screening and vet-  
14 ting purposes and any challenges associated with in-  
15 corporating such data into departmental screening  
16 and vetting systems.



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
