# **A BILL**

To require the Commissioner of Social Security to make publicly available online tools to allow individuals eligible for disability benefits to assess the impact of earnings on the individual's eligibility for, and amount of, benefits received through Federal and State benefit programs.

1        *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4        *This Act may be cited as the “Social Security Online*  
5 *Tools Innovation Act of 2018”.*

6 **SEC. 2. ONLINE BENEFIT ASSESSMENT TOOLS.**

7        (a) *IN GENERAL.*—Not later than 2 years after the  
8 *date of the enactment of this Act, the Commissioner of So-*  
9 *cial Security shall make available on the website of the So-*  
10 *cial Security Administration a tool or tools to allow an*  
11 *individual entitled to benefits under section 223 of the So-*  
12 *cial Security Act to obtain an estimate of the potential im-*  
13 *pact of earnings on the individual’s eligibility for and*  
14 *amount of such benefits.*

15        (b) *NO RECOVERY OF CERTAIN OVERPAYMENTS.*—In  
16 *any case in which a beneficiary to whom an overpayment*  
17 *is made under section 223 of the Social Security Act shows*  
18 *to the satisfaction of the Commissioner that such overpay-*  
19 *ment arose as a result of the beneficiary’s reliance on inac-*  
20 *curate information provided by the tool or tools described*  
21 *in subsection (a), the beneficiary shall be considered to meet*  
22 *the criteria in section 204(b)(1) of such Act and there shall*  
23 *be no adjustment of payments to, or recovery by the United*  
24 *States from, the beneficiary with respect to such overpay-*  
25 *ment.*

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
