As will be seen from the above table, the average number of days in each of the eight preceding Congresses was 331 and the average number of laws 1,421. In the Fifty-sixth Congress 1,941 laws were passed in 197 days, which is 135 days less than the average for the last 16 years.



# COMPARATIVE STATEMENT OF BILLS INTRODUCED AND REPORTS MADE.

The total number of House bills introduced in the Fifty-sixth Congress was 14,339, of which 2,193 were reported. A total of 6,070 Senate bills was introduced, of which but 1,050 reached the House, and on these the House committees favorably reported 813.

#### DETAILED STATEMENT OF HOUSE WORK.

The House passed during the two sessions of the Fifty-sixth Congress a total of 1,411 House bills and resolutions and a total of 793 Senate bills and resolutions, making a grand total of 2,204 bills and resolutions acted upon. It left upon its Calendar, unacted upon, 593 House bills and resolutions and 89 Senate bills and resolutions. Included in the above it passed a total of 158 House bills and resolutions which failed to become laws and 17 Senate bills and resolutions which also failed to become laws. Twenty-nine of these legislative acts failed of signature.
