## COMPARATIVE STATEMENT OF BILLS INTRODUCED AND REPORTS MADE.

The total number of bills and resolutions introduced in the House of Representatives during the first session of the Fifty-seventh Congress was 15,969, on which reports were made on 2,044 bills and resolutions.
