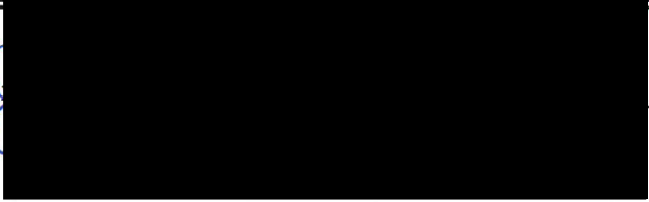

**Edward (Ed) L. Bradley, III**

Edward (Ed) L. Bradley, III serves as the Executive Director of the Office of Asset Enterprise Management (OAEM) within the Department of Veterans Affairs' (VA) Office of Management. Mr. Bradley assumed this leadership role in July 2018. Prior to becoming the Executive Director of OAEM, he served as the Deputy Executive Director since July 2002. With over 40 years of experience in various aspects of capital budgeting, planning, and asset management and sustainable, energy program management; Mr. Bradley plays a pivotal role in developing and setting Department level capital asset and sustainability policy.

As the Executive Director, he ensures efficient and effective corporate-level management of VA capital assets to better serve Veterans and their families. OAEM ensures that capital investments fully support the agency mission and strategic goals by employing strategic vision and managing VA's inventory most effectively. This also ensures effective energy management, making prudent investments, measuring performance, and disposing or reusing assets that are no longer needed.

Mr. Bradley participates as a key member on various Federal interagency and White House task forces, committees, and councils that cover all aspects of effective stewardship, accountability, and policy guidance for real property, capital assets, and energy management in the Federal Government. He also interfaces with the Office of Management and Budget, the Government Accountability Office, and Congress.

Mr. Bradley entered Federal service in 1978 as a resident engineer on VA's major construction projects. Before becoming the Deputy Executive Director of OAEM, he served as the Director, Investment and Enterprise Development Service within OAEM. He was responsible for research, evaluation, and implementation of VA's Enhanced-Use Lease (EUL) program, the Department-wide energy management program, which included energy conservation, environment, transportation, and sustainability programs, as well as other VA capital asset management programs.

Under his leadership, the EUL program partnered with the public/private sector to re-develop unneeded VA land and buildings. His work was instrumental in establishing shared savings efforts, third-party financing ventures, and other alternative means to acquire needed facilities and services for VA and its customers. Mr. Bradley was also responsible for the energy management program; and he led efforts to revitalize the former energy, environment, transportation, and sustainability programs that were embodied within various Administrations within VA. The consolidation of those programs into one restructured Department-wide program enabled VA to be one of the major energy management players in the Federal sector.

Mr. Bradley holds a bachelor's degree in mechanical engineering from the West Virginia Institute of Technology, now known as the West Virginia University of Technology.
