## A BILL

To authorize a Wall of Remembrance as part of the Korean War Veterans Memorial and to allow certain private contributions to fund that Wall of Remembrance.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Korean War Veterans  
5 Memorial Wall of Remembrance Act of 2015”.

6 **SEC. 2. WALL OF REMEMBRANCE.**

7 Section 1 of the Act titled “An Act to authorize the  
8 erection of a memorial on Federal Land in the District  
9 of Columbia and its environs to honor members of the

1 Armed Forces of the United States who served in the Ko-  
2 rean War”, approved October 25, 1986 (Public Law 99-  
3 572), is amended by adding at the end the following:

4 “Such memorial shall include a Wall of Remembrance,  
5 which shall be constructed without the use of Federal  
6 funds. The American Battle Monuments Commission shall  
7 request and consider design recommendations from the  
8 Korean War Veterans Memorial Foundation, Inc. for the  
9 establishment of the Wall of Remembrance. The Wall of  
10 Remembrance shall include—

11           “(1) a list by name of members of the Armed  
12 Forces of the United States who were killed in ac-  
13 tion in the Korean War;

14           “(2) the number of members of the Armed  
15 Forces of the United States who, in regards to the  
16 Korean War—

17                   “(A) were wounded in action;

18                   “(B) are listed as missing in action; or

19                   “(C) were prisoners of war; and

20           “(3) the number of members of the Korean  
21 Augmentation to the United States Army, the Re-  
22 public of Korea Armed Forces, and the other na-  
23 tions of the United Nations Command who, in re-  
24 gards to the Korean War—

25                   “(A) were killed in action;

- 1 “(B) were wounded in action;
- 2 “(C) are listed as missing in action; or
- 3 “(D) were prisoners of war.”.
