moved from the United States during the period beginning on the date of the enactment of this Act, and ending on 3 the date on which a Federal law is enacted preventing the 4 separation of aliens entering the United States with a 5 child who has not attained 18 years of age from such child. 6 (b) COVERED ALIEN.—The term "covered alien" 7 means an alien who— 8 (1) entered the United States on or after April 9 6, 2018 with the alien's child who had not attained 10 18 years of age; 11 (2) was separated from such child; and 12 (3) was charged only with a misdemeanor of-13 fense under section 275(a) of the Immigration and 14 Nationality Act (8 U.S.C. 1325(a)). 15 SEC. 3. REUNITING FAMILIES. 16 (a) IN GENERAL.—Not later than 30 days after the 17 date of the enactment of this Act, the Secretary of Homeland Security, in consultation with the Secretary of Health 18 19 and Human Services and the Attorney General, shall reunite each covered alien with the covered alien's child, if 20 21 both the alien and child are physically present in the 22 United States. 23 (b) Expedited Background Checks.—Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the Secretary of Homeland Security, in consultation with the Secretary of
