A BILL

To direct the Secretary of the Interior to annually designate at least one city in the United States as an “American World War II Heritage City”, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. AMERICAN WORLD WAR II HERITAGE CITIES.**

4 (a) DESIGNATION.—In order to recognize and ensure
5 the continued preservation and importance of the history
6 of the United States involvement in World War II, each
7 calendar year the Secretary of the Interior shall designate
8 not less than one city located in one of the several States
9 or a territory of the United States as an “American World
10 War II Heritage City”. Not more than one city in each
11 State or territory may be designated under this section.

12 (b) APPLICATION FOR DESIGNATION.—The Sec-
13 retary shall—

14 (1) establish and publicize the process by which
15 a city may apply for designation as an American
16 World War II Heritage City based on the criteria in
17 subsection (c); and

18 (2) encourage cities to apply for designation as
19 an American World War II Heritage City.

20 (c) CRITERIA FOR DESIGNATION.—The Secretary, in
21 consultation with the Secretary of the Smithsonian Insti-
22 tution or the President of the National Trust for Historic
23 Preservation, shall make each designation under sub-
24 section (a) based on the following criteria:

1 (1) Contributions by a city and its environs to
2 the World War II home-front war effort, including
3 contributions related to—

4 (A) defense manufacturing, such as ships,
5 aircraft, uniforms, and equipment;

6 (B) production of foodstuffs and consumer
7 items for Armed Forces and home consumption;

8 (C) war bond drives;

9 (D) adaptations to wartime survival;

10 (E) volunteer participation;

11 (F) civil defense preparedness;

12 (G) personnel serving in the Armed
13 Forces, their achievements, and facilities for
14 their rest and recreation; or

15 (H) the presence of Armed Forces camps,
16 bases, airfields, harbors, repair facilities, and
17 other installations within or in its environs.

18 (2) Achievements by a city and its environs to
19 preserve the heritage and legacy of the city's con-
20 tributions to the war effort and to preserve World
21 War II history, including—

22 (A) the identification, preservation, res-
23 toration, and interpretation of World War II-re-
24 lated structures, facilities and sites;

1 (B) establishment of museums, parks, and
2 markers;

3 (C) establishment of memorials to area
4 men who lost their lives in service;

5 (D) organizing groups of veterans and
6 home-front workers and their recognition;

7 (E) presentation of cultural events such as
8 dances, plays, and lectures;

9 (F) public relations outreach through the
10 print and electronic media, and books; and

11 (G) recognition and ceremonies remem-
12 bering wartime event anniversaries such as
13 Pearl Harbor.

14 (d) THE FIRST “AMERICAN WORLD WAR II HERIT-
15 AGE CITY”.—Having met or exceeded all of criteria in
16 subsection (c), Wilmington, North Carolina, and its envi-
17 rons is hereby designated as an “American World War II
18 Heritage City”.

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
