A PROCLAMATION FOSTER CARE MONTH

WHEREAS: Families are the foundation of our communities, as they are the primary source

of love, identity, self-esteem, and support for children; and

WHEREAS: Today, the State of Georgia provides foster care for approximately 13,500

children, some of whom are placed in the homes of relatives; and

WHEREAS: Foster families across the state open their homes and extend love and security

to children in need. They also often support the birth families who are working

to meet the goals necessary for reunification; and

WHEREAS: More foster homes are needed to provide children with safe, secure and stable

living environments. Foster families give of themselves to provide a valuable

benefit to their community, as well as loving homes to children in need; and

WHEREAS: Many public and private organizations continue to work to increase public

awareness of the needs of foster children in Georgia so that we may more effectively address the important roles of both communities and families in

providing a better quality of life for children across the state; now

THEREFORE: I, NATHAN DEAL, Governor of the State of Georgia, do hereby proclaim May

2018 as FOSTER CARE MONTH in Georgia and encourage Georgia citizens to volunteer their talents and energies to support children in foster care, foster

parents, and professional foster care program staff.
