

## ADDENDUM:

## NDC Endorsed Bills and Packages in the 116<sup>th</sup> Congress Thus Far:

- <u>H.R. 1, the For the People Act</u>, and NDC Vice Chair Terri Sewell's <u>H.R. 4, the Voting Rights Advancement Act</u>. NDC Members proposed many of the pro-democracy, anti-corruption reforms included in the packages, ranging from election security measures, ethics reforms, transparent campaign ads, and other voting rights measures.
- <u>H.R. 5, The Equality Act</u>, a bill to ban discrimination against LGBTQ individuals in arenas such as housing, employment, federal funding, education, credit access, and jury service.
- <u>H.R. 6 the Dream and Promise Act</u>, which provides permanent status and a pathway to citizenship for Dreamers, Temporary Protected Status (TPS) holders, and Deferred Enforced Departure (DED) recipients.
- H.R. 9, the Climate Action Now Act, a bill that would prevent America from abandoning the Paris Climate Agreement, committed to by every other nation on the planet.
- A package of prescription drug bills that would will help promote transparency, increase competition, and promote affordability of and access to medicines:

- H.R. 4634 The Terrorism Risk Insurance Program Reauthorization Act of 2019 (TRIA) provides a 7-year reauthorization of the Terrorism Risk Insurance Program (TRIP), requires a GAO report on cyber terrorism risks, and requires biennial Treasury reporting that includes disaggregated data on the feasibility of terrorism risk insurance for places of worship.
