Highlights



TRANSPORTATION

- Secured \$19 million grants for runway improvements at Lakeland Linder Airport
 - Demanded improved oversight of disaster recovery process (H.R. 1984)



HEALTHCARE

- Support covering & protecting those with pre-existing conditions (H.R. 692)
- Introduced legislation to protect patients from surprise medical bills (H.R. 4223)
- Support lowering prescription drug prices & consumer transparency (H.R. 19)



PROTECTING THE VULNERABLE

- Introduced the HOPE Act to prevent prosecution of trafficking victims (H.R. 5080)
- Introduced legislation to prevent convicted pedophiles from receiving taxpayer funded pensions (H.R. 3816)



MILITARY & VETERANS

- Introduced legislation to improve healthcare for early National Guard and Reserve retirees (H.R. 5169)
- Extended the 'Boots to Business' program to provide entrepreneurship training to veterans and active members of our military. (H.R. 3537)



SENIORS

- Support seniors not being taxed on their Social Security benefits (H.R. 3971)
- Help seniors cut through Medicare red tape by streamlining prior authorization requirements (H.R. 3107)



ECONOMY

- Supported President Trump in passing of the USMCA trade deal (H.R. 5430)
 - Support making tax cuts permanent for individuals and families

Legislative

Bills Introduced

- **Deadline Enforcement Act (H.R. 1178)**
 - This bill would end future government shutdowns by providing for an automatic continuing appropriation with additional procedures to incentivize Members to pass the regular appropriations bills on time.
- No Pensions for Pedophiles Act (H.R. 3816)

 This bill would ensure that taxpayers are not responsible for continuing to pay the pensions for individuals convicted of federal crimes related to the sexual abuse of children.
- **✓** Protecting Patients from Surprise Medical Bills Act (H.R. 4223)
 - This bill would outlaw balance billing for all emergency services, and for any non-emergency services, provided by an out-of-network provider at an in-network hospital where the patient was given no opportunity to select an in-network provider.
- HOPE for Victims of Human Trafficking Act (H.R. 5169)
 The bill makes it easier for victims of human trafficking to qualify for the affirmative defense of coercion for certain offenses committed while they were being trafficked.
- TRICARE Fairness for National Guard and Reserve Retirees Act (H.R. 5169)
 - Generally aligns the age for TRICARE health care benefits with the age at which retired National Guard and Reserve personnel begin receiving their retired pay.
- Protecting Abortion Survivors (H.R. 962)
 Establishes care requirements a practitioner must exercise in the event a child is born alive following an abortion or attempted abortion

Veteran Issues

Help with compensation claims, VA health care, GI Bill benefits, military records, and obtaining earned military medals.



Tax Questions

My office can make an inquiry regarding open cases with the IRS and about obtaining needed tax forms.



Social Security

My staff can make an inquiry to check status of your social security benefits.



Immigration / Passport Issues

We can help expedite your passport application (fee applies), we can also check status of green card application.



Other Federal Programs

My office may be able to help resolve problems or get information you need. We're always happy to help!

After my office got involved, our local hero received access to the medical care he needed. Cutting through the red-tape of the federal government is what our local staff is here to help you do!

The honor of attending a service academy comes with the obligation and commitment to serve in the military for a minimum of five years upon graduation. Members of Congress may nominate candidates for appointment to four of the five U.S. service academies.

Committee Work

Small Business Committee

During the first session of the 116th Congress, the Small Business Committee has held a total of 61 hearings -- 25 full committee hearings & 36 subcommittee hearings.



18 bills were passed by the committee. 24 small business bills were passed in the House, & 3 were signed into law.

Transportation & Infrastructure Committee

The Transportation & Infrastructure Committee was busy & productive in 2019. The committee held 47 hearings, 5 roundtables, 7 markups, & passed 27 bills in the House.
