Introduces New Gun Bill: the SAFER Now Act

Congresswoman Beatty recently introduced the Safer America for Everyone Right (SAFER) Now Act, H.R. 5410. If enacted into law, the SAFER Now Act aims to stem the tide of gun violence by banning assault weapons and high capacity magazines, expanding background checks, closing the gun show loophole and authorizing federal grants for gun buy backs, among other reforms.

Public polling suggests there is consensus around the need to improve our nation's gun laws. In fact, a Quinnipiac University poll found that 97 percent of Americans support universal background checks and also that two in three Americans want stronger gun laws overall. Moreover, 70 percent support stricter assault weapons laws based on a MSN poll.

"I refuse to sit on the sidelines as more and more of our fellow citizens lose their lives or are injured from gun violence. Americans are demanding action, because every day another family suffers due to the epidemic. That is why I am proud to introduce the SAFER Now Act and stand ready to work with Members on both sides of the aisle to help put a stop to this senseless violence."
