



2019 Congressional Art Competition Rules and Regulations

- The Congressional Art Competition is open to all high school students (grades 9-12).
- Entries will be accepted at Congressman Cartwright's district offices for residents of **Pennsylvania's 8th Congressional District**. Students residing outside the district will be referred to their respective Member of Congress. The district includes all of Lackawanna, Pike, and Wayne Counties and portions of Luzerne and Monroe Counties. - Each entry **must be original** in concept, design, and execution and may not violate any US copyright laws. Any entry that has been copied from an existing photo or image (including a painting, graphic, or advertisement), that was created by someone other than the student is a violation of the competition rules and **will not** be accepted.
- Artwork must conform to the following restrictions
 - Artwork must be two dimensional.
 - Artwork can be **no larger** than 26 inches high, 26 inches wide and 4 inches deep, **including the frame**.
 - Artwork **does not** need to be framed to be entered into the competition; however, the winning piece will need to be framed in order to be displayed in the Capitol.
 - Artwork cannot weigh more than 15 pounds.
 - Accepted mediums include
 - Paintings: oil, acrylics, watercolor, etc.
 - Drawings: colored pencil, pencil, ink, marker, pastels, charcoal (it is recommended that charcoal and pastel drawings be fixed.)
 - Prints: lithographs, silk screen, block prints
 - Mixed Media: use of more than two mediums such as pencil, ink, watercolor, etc.
 - Collages (must be two dimensional)
 - Computer generated art
 - Photographs
 - Artwork entered must be in the original medium (that is, not a scanned reproduction of a painting or drawing).

- Students may submit up to **two** total pieces of artwork. All artwork will be judged (only one award per student). Artwork does not have to be from this current academic year.
- A copy of the Student Release Form, signed by the teacher, student, and parent/guardian must be submitted with **each** piece to certify the originality of the piece. This form may be copied, or additional forms may be requested from the Scranton District Office. Also, please complete and attach the required label form to each piece of art, oriented as the piece should be displayed.
- **Suitability Guidelines:** Artwork must adhere to the policy of the House Office Building Commission (the Commission). In accordance with this policy, exhibits depicting subjects of contemporary political controversy or a sensationalistic or gruesome nature are not allowed.
- A small reception will be held with Congressman Matt Cartwright for all participants and interested parties where the winners will be announced.
- Artwork can be submitted to Congressman Cartwright's District Offices in Scranton and Hazleton between 9am and 5pm.
- The final deadline to submit art to Congressman Cartwright's district offices is **Wednesday, April 24, 2019 at 5:00 pm**. Late submissions will not be accepted.
- The 1st place winner, chosen by a panel of judges, will hang in the Capitol for the entire year of the exhibition and cannot be returned to the student earlier. Students, therefore, should submit artwork they will not need for other purposes.
- The 2nd and 3rd place winners and honorable mention will hang in Congressman Cartwright's Scranton District Office for the entire year.
- The first prize winner will receive two round trip airfares from Philadelphia to cover travel costs to attend the national winners' reception in Washington, DC in June.
- After the exhibition, students will be able to pick up their artwork from Rep. Cartwright's Scranton District Office.

2019 Congressional Art Competition Checklist

When preparing for the Congressional Art Competition, please complete the following checklist. This will ensure that the Congressional Art Competition Staff will accept the work. Please consult the official rules and regulations for more information.

Requirements for All Students, Parents/Guardians, and Teachers

- The student resides in Pennsylvania's 8th Congressional District
- The artwork is no larger than 26 inches high, 26 inches wide, and 4 inches deep when framed and weigh no more than 15 pounds.
- Draw arrows on the back of the artwork to indicate which direction is "up."
- The artwork meets suitability and originality guidelines.
- The "Student Information and Release Form" is attached to the back of the artwork.
 - The release form has signatures from the student, parent/guardian, and teacher.
- Securely attach a **typed** label to the back of each piece with the following information
 - Student Name
 - Address
 - Phone Number
 - Email Address
 - Title
 - Medium
 - Member's Name
 - State and District
- Draw arrows on the back of the artwork to indicate which direction is "up."
