# Welch works to block doubling of student loan interest rates; urges Vermonters to share student debt stories

With student loan debt topping one trillion dollars nationwide and Congress working to avoid a doubling of some student loan interest rates set for July, Rep. Welch is urging Vermonters to share their stories about student debt and college affordability on his website at <u>www.welch.house.gov/studentdebt</u>. He will bring the stories to Washington to push for policies that keep student loan interest rates low and make college more affordable for middle class families.

# Fighting to save White River Junction postal facility

Rep. Welch is leading a bipartisan effort urging House leaders to take up postal reform legislation that would save the White River Junction mail sorting facility. Without action by May 15th, the Postal Service will begin closing and consolidating hundreds of processing facilities and more than 2,000 post offices nationwide, including the White River Junction facility. "The Postal Service serves all Americans regardless of where they live," Welch said. "Unnecessarily closing postal facilities will undermine this vital mission, cut services to Vermonters, eliminate good middle class jobs and deal an enormous blow to rural America."

#### Protecting Vermont's dairy farmers


