Frequently Asked Questions

1) What is a nomination?

- Members of Congress may nominate applicants who meet the eligibility requirements established by law. A candidate may seek a nomination from the following:
 - A member of the U.S. House of Representatives who represents the congressional district in which the candidate resides
 - Both U.S. Senators from his or her state (U.S. Senator Pat Toomey and U.S. Senator Bob Casey)
 - Apply directly to the Vice-President of the United States

2) What are the basic eligibility requirements?

- To be eligible for a nomination from Congressman Mike Kelly, you must:
 - Be a citizen of the United States by the time you enter a military academy
 - Be a legal resident of Pennsylvania's 16th Congressional District. If you have a question regarding the district, please call 724-282-2557 and ask for Steph or visit www.house.gov and enter your ZIP code
 - Be 17 years old, but not yet past your 23rd birthday on July 1st of the year you enter a military academy
 - Have earned an above average academic record
 - Have achieved competitive standardized test scores (ACT/SAT)
 - Be medically qualified as determined by the Department of Defense Medical Evaluation and Review Board (DoDMERB)
 - Have unquestionably strong moral character and display uncompromising integrity
 - Be unmarried, not pregnant, and without legal obligation to support children or other dependents

3) When do I apply for a nomination?

- The nomination application period opens May 1st of each year for those candidates who will be high school seniors the following school year.
 - Students who have already graduated are also welcomed to apply.

4) What is the deadline for completing a nomination file for Congressman Kelly's office?

- The deadline for submitting a nomination packet to Congressman Kelly's Butler district office is OCTOBER 1, 2020. All submissions must be postmarked by that date. Late packets will not be accepted.
 - KEEP IN MIND: This is just the **deadline**. You may begin submitting your application materials as early as May 1, 2020.

5) What materials are required for a completed application file?

- Application for nomination
- Materials from your school
 - OFFICIAL academic transcript(s)
 - Current/senior year class schedule (may be included on transcript)
 - High school disciplinary records (if you do NOT have any disciplinary records on file, please provide a letter from your school stating that)
 - High school attendance records (9th through 12th grade)
- Standardized Test Scores (ACT/SAT)

- ACT institution code: **7650**

- SAT institution code: 2752

- Resume
- Essay "Why I want to attend a military academy" (500 words or less)

- Letters of Recommendation (3)
 - Letters should be from people who know you personally, and should attest to your character, motivation to serve and integrity
 - One of these must be a principal, dean or teacher at your current high school or college
 - Please do not submit more than 3 letters
- One-page explanation of your felony charges and/or convictions (if applicable)
- A current photo, no larger than wallet size

6) What happens after I have completed my nomination file?

 Applicants who submit all items required, by the deadline, will be contacted in order to schedule an in-person interview.

7) What criteria is used in selecting candidates?

Nominations are based on a "whole person" evaluation. Factors such as academic achievements, extra-curricular activities, leadership skills, physical aptitude, character and motivation are taken into consideration and compared with other applicants.

8) How many academies are there?

- There are five service academies.
- Three reside within the Department of Defense:
 - U.S. Military Academy at West Point, New York
 - U.S. Naval Academy at Annapolis, Maryland
 - U.S. Air Force Academy at Colorado Springs, Colorado
- Two reside within the Department of Transportation:
 - U.S. Merchant Marine Academy at Kings Point, New York
 - U.S. Coast Guard Academy at New London, Connecticut

9) Are the requirements the same for all of the service academies?

No. Although many of the qualifications are similar, each academy operates under its own admissions guidelines. Visit the academy of your choice via the websites noted for each academy's particular admissions qualifications. It is not necessary to seek a nomination to the Coast Guard Academy, as the U.S.C.G.A. accepts candidates based on their own testing criteria.

10) Who should I ask to write a letter of recommendation on my behalf?

- Some of the people applicants typically seek recommendations from include:
 - Teachers
 - Counselors
 - Employers
 - Coaches
 - Clergy
 - Scout Leaders
- One letter must be from a current principal, dean or teacher at your high school or college.
- We do not require a specific recommendation form. A letter of recommendation is sufficient.

11) What if I choose more than one academy? Will I be limited to a single nomination?

 No. You can be nominated to multiple academies depending on how well you have competed among this year's pool of candidates.
 It is possible to receive multiple nominations.

12) Will I automatically be selected by the academy after I receive a nomination?

 No. You will be placed among a select group of nominees, and the academy of your choice will make the final decision. If selected, you will receive an offer of admission (an appointment) directly from the academy.

13) When will I know if I have been offered an appointment by an academy?

 Academies will begin to notify candidates of their admission status in February. All offers of appointment are generally sent out by May.

- In addition to seeking a nomination from Rep. Kelly, you must also open an admissions file at each academy you are interested in. Due to the fact that nominations are highly competitive, it is to your advantage to apply to more than one academy.
