





## Smithsonian Institution Digital Resources for Students

<u>Smithsonian Learning Lab</u>: A free, interactive platform for discovering millions of authentic digital resources and creating content with online tools. The Learning Lab has an immense amount of content, and the <u>Getting Started</u> guide is a helpful resource. In addition, the weekly Smithsonian Activities Choice Boards features weekly highlights for various subject areas. <u>Issue One</u> and <u>Issue Two</u> are available now. New issues are released each Monday.

<u>Smithsonian Open Access</u>: Allows students to download, share and reuse millions of the Smithsonian's images without asking permission because they have been released into the public domain.

<u>Smithsonian Digital Volunteers Program</u>: Allows the general public to make things like historical documents and biodiversity data more accessible. Students can join fellow volunteers to add more field notes, diaries, ledgers, logbooks, manuscripts, biodiversity specimen labels and more to the collection.

<u>Sidedoor</u>: A podcast for students that enlists the help of biologists, archaeologists, zookeepers and astrophysicists to tell engaging and educational stories.
