DETAILED SUMMARY AND ANALYSIS:

H.R. 540 would designate the facility of the United States Postal Service located at 770 Ayrault Road in Fairport, New York, as the "Louise and Bob Slaughter Post Office".

Louise Slaughter served in the U.S. House of Representatives for thirty-one years, and is <u>well-known</u> for her part in co-sponsoring the Violence Against Women Act and sponsoring the Genetic Information Nondiscrimination Act, which was signed into law by President Bush in 2008. Representative Slaughter chaired or was the ranking member of the House Rules Committee from 2007 until 2018, and was the oldest member of the House upon her passing in 2018.

Representative Slaughter's husband, Bob Slaughter, <u>served</u> in the Air Force from 1954-55 and worked in business in the Rochester area until his retirement in 1991. After fifty-seven years of marriage to Louise Slaughter, Bob Slaughter passed away in 2014.

COMMITTEE ACTION:

H.R. 540 was introduced on January 14, 2019 and was referred to the House Committee on Oversight and Reform.

ADMINISTRATION POSITION:

CONSTITUTIONAL AUTHORITY:

According to the bill's sponsor: "Congress has the power to enact this legislation pursuant to the following: Post Office (e.g. naming post offices; creating)—Article I, Section 8, clause 7 provides Congress with the power to establish post offices."

H.R. 829 would designate the facility of the United States Postal Service located at 1450 Montauk Highway in Mastic, New York, as the "Army Specialist Thomas J. Wilwerth Post Office Building".

Army Specialist Thomas J. Wilwerth was <u>killed in action</u> on February 22, 2006 while serving during Operation Iraqi Freedom. While <u>conducting</u> a mission to retrieve another Bradley soldier that was disabled in an earlier bomb attack, an improvised explosive device detonated near his Bradley fighting vehicle near Balad, Iraq. He was twenty-one.

COMMITTEE ACTION:

This bill was introduced by Representative Zeldin on January 28, 2019 and referred to the House Committee on Oversight and Reform.
