READY, SET, GO !

Ready Level 1: Assemble emergency supplies & belongings. Plan escape routes, create an action plan.

Ready Level 2: Pack emergency items, stay updated on latest news/information from local fire departments and public safety.

Ready Level 3: LEAVE IMMEDIATELY. Refer to action plan.

GRANTS

Individuals may qualify for:

1. **Tax Relief** through the IRS, additional time to file & pay taxes.
2. **Housing Assistance** through FEMA: temporary housing disaster relief.

Small Businesses may qualify for **low-interest loans** through the SBA for renters, homeowners, and small businesses.

Local government may qualify for:

1. Hazard Mitigation Grant Payment
2. Pre-Disaster Mitigation Grant Program
3. Assistance to Firefighters Grant

P'S OF PREPAREDNESS

If you have to leave your home, make sure you have:

- People
- Pets
- Papers (important documents)
- Phone numbers and phones
- Prescriptions
- Pictures (and other mementos)
- PCs (for the information stored on them)
- Plastic (credit cards, cash)
