STAFFING

Current staffing level: Approximately 60%

Current number of employees on staff: 130 full-time employees. 117 of these employees are assigned to work with ICE detainees including 62 detention officers, 18 medical staff, 37 administrative staff.

Number of employees on staff that are on temporary duty assignment (TDY): In addition to the 130 full-time employees, TCDF also currently employees 13 people from other facilities.

Current number of vacant positions: 75

Notes: 10 new staff members may be starting on June 10.

SUPPLEMENTAL NOTES

Currently, there are 37 detainees being held in quarantine.

There will be a legal services fair on June 27, 2022.

In-person legal visits have resumed.
