**POPULATION**

Number of total individuals being detained or incarcerated at TCDF: 298

Number of individuals in USMS custody: 52 (49 males, 3 females)

Number of individuals in Torrance County custody: 55 (47 males, 8 females)

Number of ICE detainees: 191

Notes: On June 14, 2022, ICE transferred 30 detainees to TCDF.

On June 18, the breakdown of the ICE detainee population by nationality was as follows:

**STAFFING**

Current staffing level: 66%, which ICE says is based on the current ICE contract for 505 detainees. 88% of the current staff is cleared to work with ICE detainees. According to ICE, with 66% staffing, facility can accommodate 300 ICE detainees.

Current number of employees on staff: 123 full-time employees. All of these employees are assigned to work with ICE detainees including 81 detention officers, 22 medical staff, and 20 administrative staff.

Number of employees that are on temporary duty assignment (TDY): There are 16 CoreCivic staff on TDY at the facility and all of the TDY employees are there to work with ICE detainees.

Current number of vacant positions: 82 vacancies
