1 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

2	This Act may be cited as the "Rural Opioid Abuse

8	Section 3021 of title I of the Omnibus Crime Control
9	and Safe Streets Act of 1968 (34 U.S.C. 10701) is amend-
10	ed—
11	(1) in subsection (a)(1)—
12	(A) in subparagraph (F), by striking
13	"and";
14	(B) in subparagraph (G), by striking the
15	period at the end and inserting "; and"; and
16	(C) by adding at the end the following:
17	"(H) a pilot program for rural areas to im-
18	plement community response programs that
19	focus on reducing opioid overdose deaths, which
20	may include presenting alternatives to incarcer-
21	ation, as described in subsection (f)."; and
22	(2) by adding at the end the following:
23	"(f) Rural Pilot Program.—
24	"(1) In General.—The pilot program de-
25	scribed under this subsection shall make grants to
26	rural areas to implement community response pro-

grams to reduce opioid overdose deaths. Grants issued under this subsection shall be jointly operated by units of local government, in collaboration with public safety and public health agencies or public safety, public health and behavioral health collaborations. A community response program under this subsection shall identify gaps in community prevention, treatment, and recovery services for individuals who encounter the criminal justice system and shall establish treatment protocols to address identified shortcomings. The Attorney General, through the Office of Justice Programs, shall increase the amount provided as a grant under this section for a pilot program by no more than five percent for each of the two years following certification by the Attorney General of the submission of data by the rural area on the prescribing of schedules II, III, and IV controlled substances to a prescription drug monitoring program, or any other centralized database administered by an authorized State agency, which includes tracking the dispensation of such substances, and providing for interoperability and data sharing with each other such program (including an electronic health records system) in each other

1	State, and with any interstate entity that shares in-					
2	formation between such programs.					
3	"(2) Rules of Construction.—Nothing in					
4	this subsection shall be construed to—					
5	"(A) direct or encourage a State to use a					
6	specific interstate data sharing program; or					
7	"(B) limit or prohibit the discretion of a					
8	prescription drug monitoring program for inter-					
9	operability connections to other programs (in-					
10	cluding electronic health records systems, hos-					
11	pital systems, pharmacy dispensing systems, or					
12	health information exchanges).".
