It is with great excitement and anticipation that I am formally requesting Community Project Funding on behalf of Project Open Hand for the Fiscal Year 2023 towards our Community Nutrition and Wellness Expansion Services Project. As you know, Project Open Hand mission is to improve health outcomes and quality of life by providing nutritious meals to the sick and vulnerable, caring for and educating our community. We accomplish this by serving more than one million medically tailored meals each year throughout the Bay Area via our Community Nutrition and Wellness Programs.

Madam Speaker, COVID-19 has had a profound impact on Project Open Hand and our clients. We have experienced historic demand for our services and an exponential increase to our delivery and mobile models. This pandemic has shifted our programmatic focus from communal meals to frozen delivery in the interest of client health, convenience, and safety, and with this comes added stress on our existing infrastructure to meet and exceed the expectations of this new model. Prior to the pandemic, many of our clients were already homebound and experiencing the traumas of increasing isolation and lack of social interaction. In response, the criteria requirements for delivery services have been relaxed to accommodate more susceptible populations to COVID-19 and ensure they can still receive their life-saving nutrition. Project Open Hand has responded to this call.

Our organization and indeed this city is currently at a turning point. Project Open Hand is choosing to meet these new challenges head on and encourage our Food is Medicine Coalition partners to do likewise. We will succeed by investing in infrastructure and sustainability practices for these new expansions, a key portion of which is the Community Nutrition and Wellness Expansion Services Project. We are incredibly grateful for the consideration for funding and the acknowledgment that our most vulnerable residents need the highest quality service.
