Greetings again to the families and friends of our deployed servicemembers here in the Horn of Africa! It was another amazing month both at Camp Lemonier and at all sites throughout our region, a region roughly two-thirds the size of the United States. I can assure you that we are making a big difference everyday. In the short few months that I have had the honor of commanding this operation I have seen firsthand the positive impact your loved ones have made upon this land. When you consider we have just 1,300 men and women assigned to accomplish the numerous missions, it makes the magnitude of their achievements that much greater. You have much to be proud of.

This month we received a number of prestigious visitors to our camp. Twice during August we had visits from a Congressional Delegation, representing the states of New Jersey, Florida, Arkansas, Oklahoma, and the territory of Guam.
