


2003 will likely rank as one of the top 20 warmest years on record for the U.S. with temperatures near 53.6°F (12.0°C). Cool temperatures in the East and warmth in the western half of the country were part of a persistent pattern in 2003.

The last four 5-year periods (1999-2003, 1998-2002, 1997-2001, 1996-2000), have been the warmest 5-year periods in the last 109 years of national records, and the last 6 (1998-2003), 7 (1997-2003), 8 (1996-2003), 9 (1995-2003) and 10-year (1994-2003) periods have been the warmest on record for the U.S., illustrating the anomalous warmth of the last decade.

The <u>2002-2003</u> winter season (<u>Dec-Feb</u>) was 32nd warmest on record for the U.S., with <u>warmth in the Northwest</u> and West and cool conditions <u>stretching from the South to the Northeast</u>. <u>Spring (March-May)</u> was warmer than normal nationally with much of the country warmer than average in each of the spring months, except for consistently cool conditions in the <u>Northeast</u>. However, <u>summer (June-August) was 14th warmest</u> in 109 years of national records. The <u>western half of the country</u> contributed most to that warmth, while the <u>Central and Southeast regions were cooler than average</u> over the summer. The 2003 <u>fall season</u> (September-November) was 20th warmest on record, with some states in the West having a <u>record warm October</u>. In November the persistent warmth in the West and cool in the Northeast was replaced with <u>cooler temperatures</u> to the West and some warmth in the East.





Record warm temperatures were seen in the West for several multi-month periods during the last year. The graph above shows June-November average temperature for the West.


2003 is on pace to be the warmest* on record for <u>New Mexico</u> and the second warmest* for <u>Nevada</u> and <u>Idaho</u>. Seven other states will likely be much warmer than normal during 2003*. Cooler statewide annual temperatures were generally confined to the Northeast.

Precipitation in the United States in 2003 was characterized by persistent dryness in the West and above average wetness in the East. Virginia had its <u>wettest January-November</u> on record during 2003, already exceeding the previous *annual* record by the end of November. <u>North Carolina</u> and <u>Maryland</u> are also likely to exceed the annual record for precipitation by the end of December 2003. Twelve states will likely be much wetter than normal with the <u>Southeast</u>

<u>region</u> as a whole having its second wettest year on record. <u>New Mexico</u> had its 5th driest January-November. More details on U.S. drought for 2003 can be found on the <u>annual drought summary</u> page.



Virginia, North and South Carolina had their wettest spring on record (see map below left). It was also the driest spring on record for Texas. It was second wettest spring and summer for the Southeast (see image below right) and the five month period from May-September included <u>six states with record wetness</u>.

2003 Significant Fire Weather Events

June 18 – June 25: Dry lightning followed by gusty winds.

Significant Fire: Aspen Fire near Tucson, AZ.

250 – 300 structures burned in and around the town of Summerhaven, AZ.

July 15 – July 23. Dry lightning occurred on the northern fringe of monsoon moisture moving north through

OR, NV, UT, CO, MT and WY.

Significant Fires: Clark Fire, OR; Fawn Peak Complex, WA; Hot Creek Fire, ID;

Cramer Fire, ID; Missouri Breaks Complex, MT.

August 9 – August 10: Lightning holdovers then gusty winds in Montana and Idaho.

Significant Fires: Wedge Canyon, Robert, Black Mountain 2, Mineral Prim, Fish Creek.

Record fires in Montana and Missoula areas.

October 21 – October 29: Numerous arson fires blown out by Santa Ana Winds in the San Diego/Los Angeles area.

Over 3400 homes were burned and almost 750,000 acres were burned. The fires resulted in 22 deaths and 181 injuries and the damages are estimated between \$2 billion and \$12

billion dollars.





There were 152 IMET dispatches in 2003, making this the 3rd busiest season since records were kept in 1987. The record year for IMET dispatches was 2000 with 204 and the 10 year average number of annual dispatches is 108. Number of IMET days worked: 1,406 Number of IMET hours worked: 19,684 (9.43 person-years)





There are three time frames that are tracked in regards to IMET dispatches. Two of them are controllable by the NWS, and the third is controlled by the land management agencies. The first time frame is from when the National Interagency Coordination Center (NICC) calls the NWS Staff Meteorologist to NIFC (SMN) and requests an IMET to when the SMN calls back NICC with the name and contact information of an IMET (this is controllable by the NWS). The second time frame is from when NICC receives the information about the IMET to when the overhead order is faxed to that IMET's office (this is not controllable by the NWS, it is totally dependent on how quickly the order gets through the wildland fire agencies' dispatch system). An IMET cannot leave for a fire until he/she receives that overhead order. The third time frame is from when the IMET receives the fax of the overhead order to when that IMET arrives on scene (this is controllable by the NWS).

We are meeting or exceeding wildland fire agencies' requirement in both distance and time. The agencies want the closest resource (within reason) and they want them onsite in 24 hours or less.



Number of Dispatch Requests Filled: 100%. Every request that was received by the SMN in Boise was filled. There were several instances where orders for IMETs never made it through the ordering system and the order was "killed" or marked "Unable to Fill (UTF)" after 48 hours without the SMN's knowledge that the order even existed. Corrective measures were made to ensure that all orders make it up to the SMN so that he can fill the order.



The majority of dispatches are from the Western Region. Western Region also has the most IMETs.


