On June 13, 1926, Agent appeared at Ft. Scott, interviewed Chief of Police Ball and learned that on the night of June 11, officers from Miami, Oklahoma, appeared at Ft. Scott, and Subjects were turned over to said officers and returned to Miami, Okla., there to answer charges of bank robbery and also a charge of Grand Larceny.

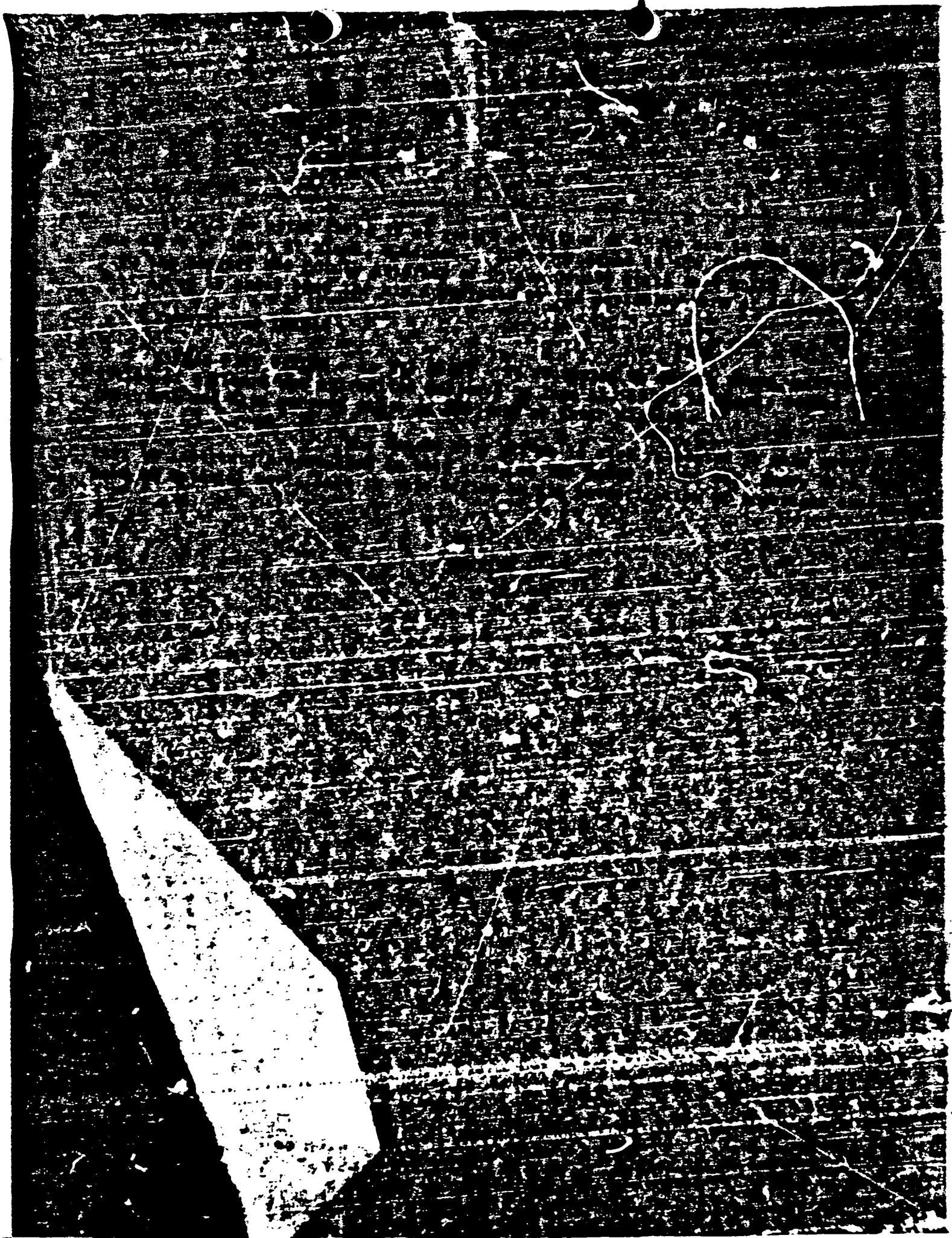

J. H. Ward of Fairfax, Oklahoma, states that he is the legal owner of the Paige Cabrolet, Motor #412,026, Serial #406,407, which he purchased from Mr. T. K. McOune at Oklahoma City, Oklahoma, on April 16, 1926. The car in question is insured by the Commercial Investment Trust Company, Oklahoma City, Oklahoma; that he is an automobile dealer at Fairfax, Oklahoma, and placed this car in his show room at the time of purchasing same, and that on June 6, 1926, 11 A. M. he took the car out of his show room and parked it on South Main Street; that he discovered the car missing some time that night, and presume that it was stolen some time that afternoon. Mr. Ward further stated that he advertised extensively for the car and the thieves, and that on June 9, 1926, he received word from the Chief of Police at Ft. Scott, Kansas, that he had recovered the car in possession of the two Subjects of this case. On receipt of this information the following wire was sent to the Kansas City Office: "Frank J. Blace, Department of Justice, Latrop Building, Kansas City, Missouri. Ft. Scott authorities holding Al Ayres and J. L. White who stole Paige Coupe number four one two naught two six from Henry Ward Fairfax Oklahoma June seventh Request made this office handle quick as of. lcers proceeding there to recover car. I have been advised by the United States Attorney's office at Topeka, Kansas, that these two Subjects have been indicted at Fort Scott, Kansas, and asking if certified copy of indictment should be sent to your office.

Complaint was filed in the Kansas district when it seemed unlikely that prosecution would be successful in Oklahoma, on your report at this Agent, Kansas City, October 7, 1934. 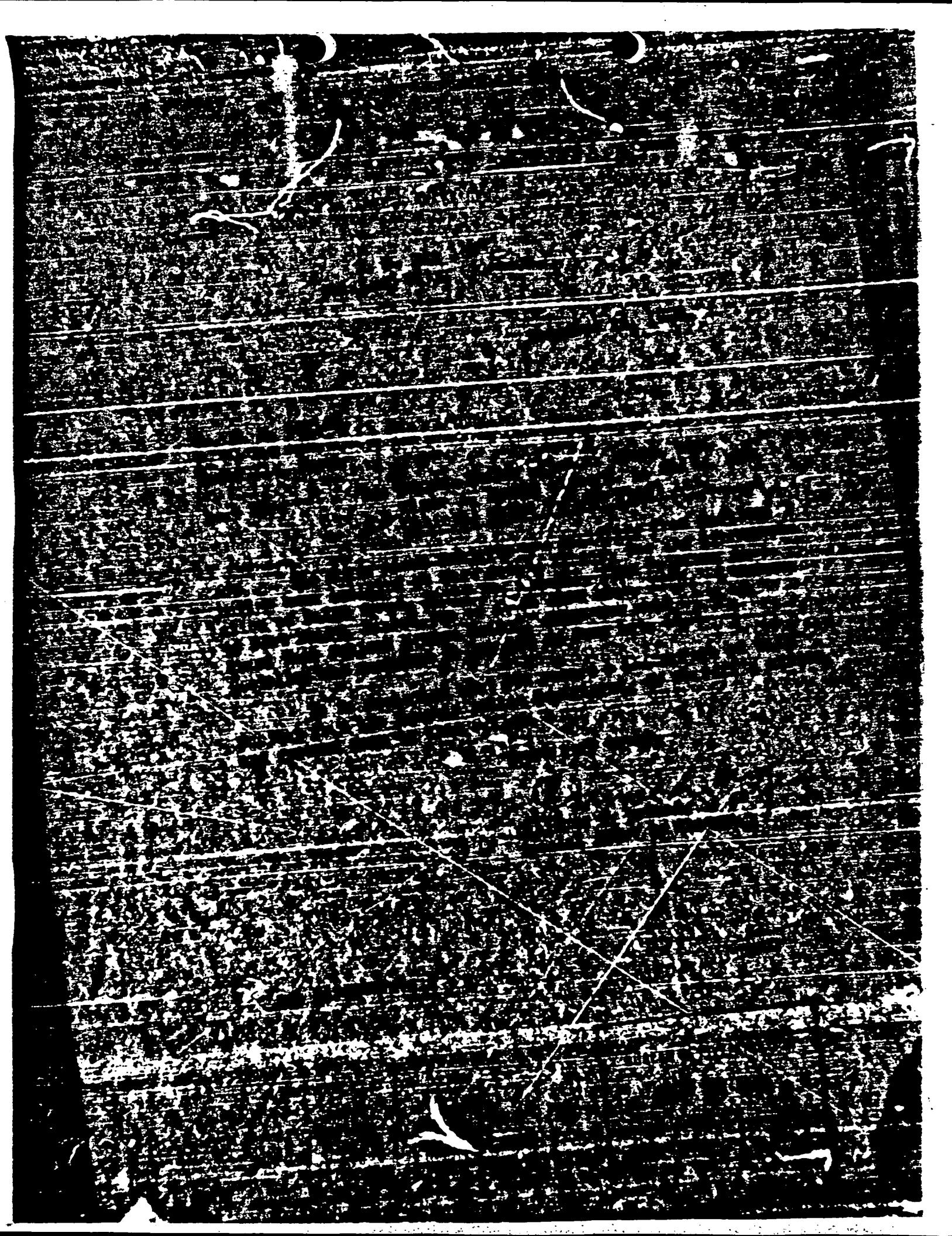

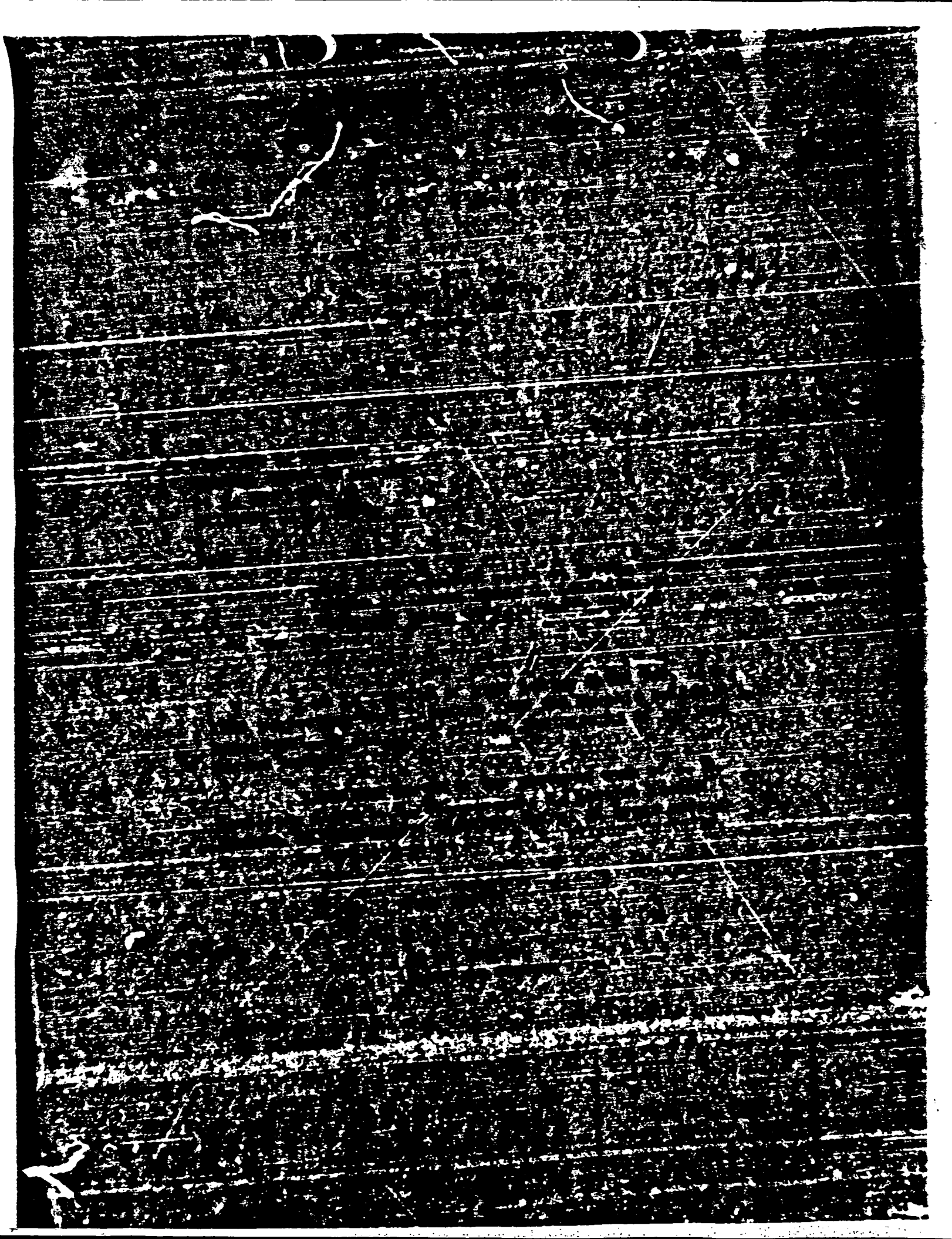

Two of the above subjects indicted at Ft. Scott, Kansas, on November 9, 1925, for theft of Miss Corro, Iowa T-412, 225, stolen June 5, 1925, at Fairfax, Oklahoma, property of Harry Ward, Fairfax, Oklahoma. Elmer A. James and Myrtle Hill were held at Ardmore, Oklahoma, September 27, 1925, having been arrested by Sheriff Lucas for burglary, and are now fugitives.

- FEELTS -

REFERENCE: - Previous reports in the above entitled case.

DETAILS:-

- At Ardmore, Oklahoma -

Elmer A. James, one of the above subjects, was arrested with Myrtle Hill on a charge of burglary by the Sheriff's office at Ardmore and on September 27, 1925, broke jail by overpowering the jailer and making their escape. These two were undoubtedly assisted by Valva Higgins, alias Mrs. Myrtle Hill, Mrs. Ethel Sawyer, alias Mrs. Ethel Myrtle, and Mrs. Edna Amy, alias Edna Amy Sawyer, as these three women were in the City of Ardmore on the day and evening previous to the jail break. Agent has been informed that after this jail break all the above mentioned parties disappeared from Ardmore. James and Myrtle were next heard of at Springfield, Missouri, where they robbed a bank of \$7,000.00, and then proceeded to Wichita, Kansas, where they bought a new Buick Brougham, and that they transferred their guns, etc., from the car they were driving to the Buick Brougham. (Agent was unable to learn the kind of car they used to come to Wichita, Kansas.) They then left Wichita, Kansas, en route to Arizona, stating they were going to a warm climate for the winter, since which the Agent has been unable to trace them.

Ray Terrill and the Ray Terrill are well known to the officers at Lansing, Michigan they are subjects of a white slave case. And Sheriff Tom Barker and Deputy W.D. Marshall of Michigan had a shooting wrap with Terrill and apprehended him at Lansing, Michigan.

A photograph of Alton James, subject in this case, and a photograph of a woman who might be with him, are being mailed to the various offices interested in this case. The woman interested in this case will be identified by the Sheriff at Ardmore, Oklahoma. She is reported to have married a daughter of the warden of the Penitentiary at Lansing, Kansas, at some time under the name of Emma.

KANSAS CITY OFFICE: Is requested to investigate the robbery at the bank at Springfield, Missouri. Also interview the mother of Ethel Wagner at the road hotel at Kansas City to ascertain the whereabouts of her daughter, also interview the warden of former warden of the Lansing Penitentiary relative to the marriage of James to his daughter, and locate Subject if possible. It is also requested to endeavor to locate sale of a Hudson Brougham car that might have been sold at Kansas City or Topeka, Kansas, the latter part of September or early part of October, 1926.

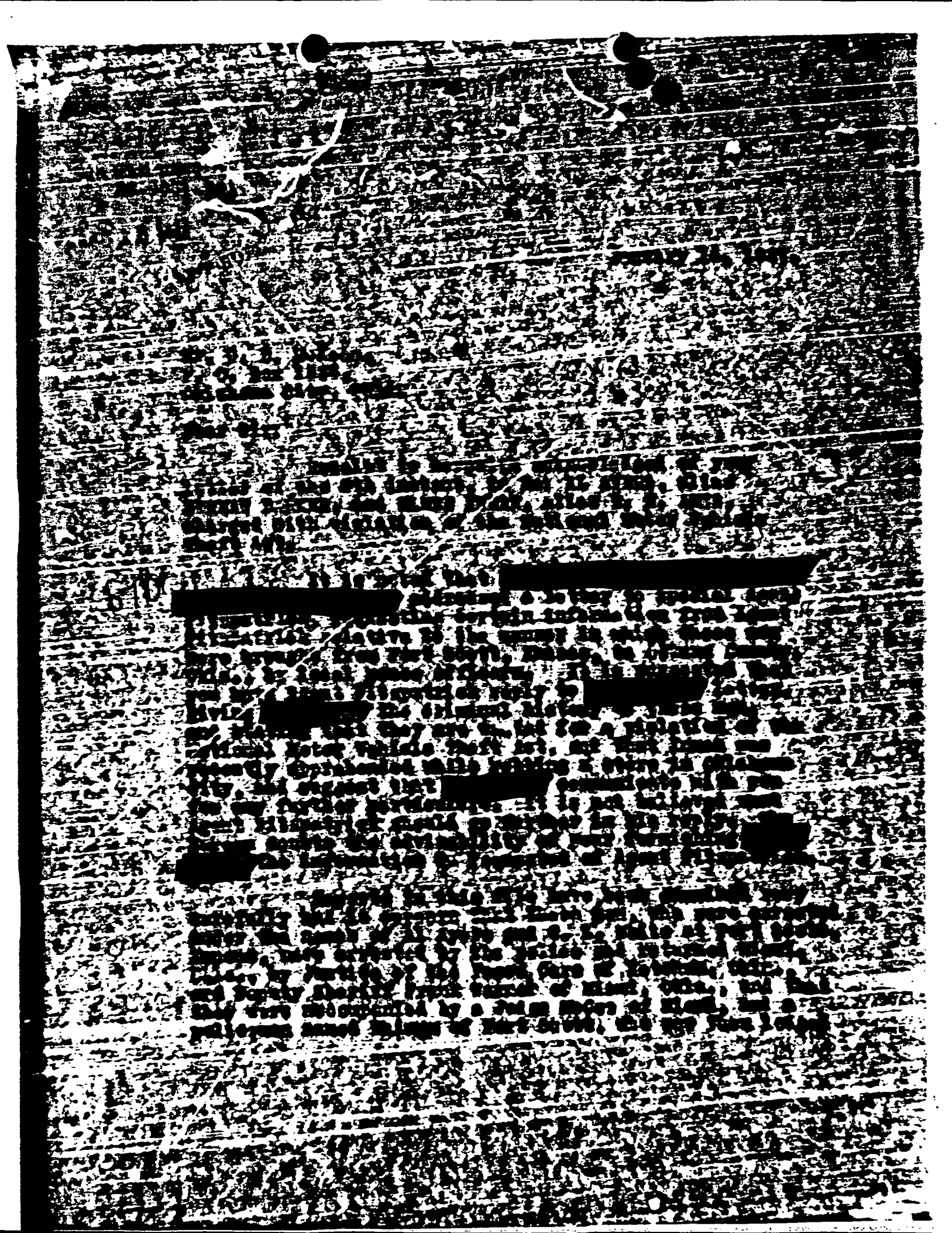
