ON DECEMBER FOURTEEN, PRESENT, A SPECIAL AGENT OF THE FEDERAL BUREAU OF INVESTIGATION (FBI) OBSERVED APPROXIMATELY FORTY INDIVIDUALS DEMONSTRATE AT SUFFOLK COUNTY POLICE HEADQUARTERS, HAUPPAUGE, NEW YORK. DEMONSTRATION STARTED AT APPROXIMATELY TWELVE MOON AND WAS SPONSORED BY THE GAY ACTIVIST ALLIANCE. DURING COURSE OF DEMONSTRATION THREE DEMONSTRATORS WERE ARRESTED FOR ASSAULT.

SOURCE WHO HAS PROVIDED RELIABLE INFORMATION IN THE PAST. ADVISED IDENTITIES OF THOSE ARRESTED WERE NOT KNOWN AT THIS TIME, HOWEVER, PERSONS ARRESTED WERE TWO MALES AND ONE FEMALE. SOURCE ADVISED THOSE ARRESTED ARE BEING CHARGED WITH ASSAULT IN

Bylaws of the Gay Activists Alliance", the pertinent portions of which are set forth below:

PREMIBLE

"WE AS LIBERATED HOMOSECUAL ACTIVISTS demand the freedom for expression of our dignity and value as human beings through confrontation with and disarmament of all mechanisms which unjustly inhibit us: economic, social, and political. Before the public conscience, we demand an immediate end to all opression of homosexuals and the immediate unconditional recognition of these basic rights:

"THE RIGHT TO OUR OWN PEELINGS. This is the right to feel attracted to the beauty of members of our own sex and to embrace those felings as truly our own, free from any question or challenge whatsoever by any other person, institution, or 'moral authority.' U

"THE RIGHT TO LOVE. This is the right to express out feelings in action, the right to make love with anyone, anyway, anytime, provided only that such action be freely chosen by the individuals concerned. U

"THE RIGHT TO OUR OWN BODIES. This is the right to treat and express our bodies as we will, to nurture, U

display, and embellish them solely in the manner we ourselves determine independent of any external control whatsoever. N

"THE RIGHT TO BE PERSONS. This is the right freely express our own individuality under the gogvernance of laws justly made and executed, and to be the bearers of social and political rights which are guaranteed by the Constitution of the United States and the Bill of Rights, enjoined upon all legislative bodies and courts, and grounded in the fact of our common humanity. N

"To secure thme rights, we hereby institute the GAY ACTIVISTS ALLIANCE, which shall be completely and soley dedicated to their implementation and maintenance, repudiating, at the same time, violence (Except for the right of solf-defense) as unworthy of social protest, disdaining all ideologies whether political or social, and forebearing alliance with any group except for those whose concrete actions are likewise so specifically dedicated.

"It is finally to the imagination of oppressed homosecuals themselves that we commend the consideration of these rights, upon whose actions alos depends all hope for the prospect of their lasting procurement.

"BY-LAWS

"Article I. The Gay Activists Alliance will not endorse, ally with, or otherwise support any political party, candidate for public office, and/or any organization not directly related to the homosexual cause. The Gay Activists Alliance will not align itself with any organization that advocates the use of violence (except in self-defense)."



INNER CIRCLE DINNER, NEW YORK HILTON HOTEL, 4/15/72

On Saturday evening, 4/15/72, I attended the captioned dinner in the Grand Ballroom of the New York Hilton Hotel. It was a black-tie affair, at which there were approximately 1600 in attendance. This affair is similar to the Gridiron Dinner which is held annually in Washington, D. C. U

During the third intermission of the evening, a group of approximately twenty-five young, crudely dressed individuals, who identified themselves as members of the GAY ACTIVISTS ALLIANCE (GAA), invaded the ballroom and began distributing handbills setting forth protests and complaints about the handling of homosexual stories by the The GA is a group of homosexuals. The members of the GAA distributed the leaflets and one tried to talk into the microphone on the stage. The curtain was drawn for the intermission and the individual trying to seize the microphone could not be seen from the main part of the ballroom where I was seated. Men in dinner jackets, who appeared to be part of the hotel management ordered the GAA group to leave, which they did. U

APPROX 1951 The next day the newspapers carried a story indicating that two of the members of the GAA had been beaten, one on the escalator outside the ballroom and the other behind the curtain when he attempted to talk over the microphone. The members of the GAA who had been beaten had not been able to identify their alleged assailants. However, one MORTY MANFORD, age 21, head of the "Gay People at Columbia University", and one of the two allegedly beaten, believes that MICHAEL MAYE, President of the Uniformed Fire Fighters Association, was the individual who attacked him on the escalator. MANFORD has sworn out a warrant for the arrest of MAYE. A spokesman for the NYCPD stated that allegations concerning the incident are being investigated.


Letter to Director RE: INNER CIRCLE DINNER

On the late afternoon of 4/19/72, MANFORD called the NYO and asked to speak with me. I was out of the office at the time. He advised the person with whom he spoke that he wanted to talk to me and ask me some questions about anything I may have seen at the Inner Circle Dinner. He asked that I call him back. I have no intention of returning his call.

What I actually saw is set forth above. I did not see either of the alleged assaults, nor did anyone seated in the ballroom. According to the newspaper, three witnesses say MAYE beat MANFORD on the escalator but there appear to be no witnesses to what went on behind the stage concerning the individual who tried to take over the microphone.

On April 19, 1972, a Miami source who is well informed concerning some New Left activities in the Miami area reported the following information: U

The Gay Activist Alliance (GAA) in Miami meets each Tuesday at the Center for Dialogue, St. John's Lutheran Church. At a recent meeting, plans were discussed for a series of "zaps" in the Miami area during the Democratic National Convention, designed to draw attention to, and sympathy for, the GAA cause. Possibilities discussed for these "zaps" were a "wedding" between two homosexuals and a dance for persons of the same sex. Both of these actions are believed to be illegal, and the official action taken against the GAA by the authorities would hopefully bring about a situation which would create sympathy for their struggle. Plans for these "zaps" are still in the formative stage and have not been finalized. A (4)

Said file and record searches and police contacts also failed to develop any information concerning a GAA Chicago chapter, a National Coalition of Gay Organizations (NCGO), or the Rainbow Tribe, an alleged violence-prone element of the Purple Star Tribe, an alleged Gay Liberation organization. U

It is noted Chicago previously advised by nitel to the Bureau (copy to Miami) dated 4/7/72 under Gay Liberation Front and MIDEM captions, that investigation, including indices search, failed to identify or develop any information concerning the Purple Star Tribe in the Chicago area.

Investigation to date at Chicago, including contacts with sources listed above, as well as with logical informants, has failed to develop any information to indicate any actual organizational activity has been undertaken by any element of the street movement, including Gay Liberation, for mass, group or organizational appearance for demonstration or any other activity at the Democratic or Republican national political conventions during the summer of 1972 at Miami Beach, Florida. Unquestionably, individuals and possibly even organized groups from Chicago will be present at Miami Beach. There is just no indication, at this time, that such activity is being seriously considered or organized by any element and no specific assertions by individuals or groups have been made that they will be in Miami Beach. U

Chicago will continue to remain alert for such information. If developed, it will be immediately furnished to the Bureau, Miami and interested Offices by the most expeditious means followed in form suitable for dissemination with appropriate recommendations by Chicago.

On June 21, 1972, a source, who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised that there would be a demonstration held at the Federal Court House, Miami, Florida, at 8:30 AM, Thursday, June 22, 1972. The source also advised that the American Civil Liberties Union would also be present.

On June 22, 1972, Special Agents of the Federal Bureau of Investigation went to the Federal Court House, Miami, Plorida, to observe the proposed demonstration. Agents determined that no demonstration was being conducted. Further inquiries by agents determined that there was to be a court hearing concerning the Gay Activists bringing a complaint before the Federal Court against the Miami Beach Police Department concerning Ordinance 25-50 and Ordinance 25-52.

It was observed that 20 to 25 individuals, men and women, from the local Gay Activists Alliance were in attendance. One individual was overheard to say that there would be 500 sisters in for the conventions referring to the upcoming two political conventions.

The complaint was filed by the Gay Activists
Alliance under the names of ROBERT BARRY and CHARLES LAMONT.
A Mismi Beach attorney attempted to get the complaint dismissed, stating that the ordinances do not violate First Amendment rights. Motion to dismiss was denied by Federal Judge EMETT C. CHOATE. A hearing followed where ROBERT BARRY was called as a witness and advised that he is a homosexual and that the Gay Activists Alliance is a non-violent civil rights organization. He further stated that their plans are for their organization to attend the convention in order to demonstrate for gay civil rights. He advised that there are approximately 584 gay organizations in the United States and that there is an expected six thousand individuals from these organizations coming to Mismi.

CHARLES A. LAMONT was next called to the stand and advised that he is the community organizer for the National Conlition of Gay (regardinations and that their main purpose is for gay civil rights. He advised that the purpose for coming to the convention is to talk with delegates in an attempt to have them understand their rights. U

JudgeWILLIAM O.MEHRTDEstated that, in his opinion, the ordinances are vague and overbreath and give a chilling effect on the First Amendment rights. He placed a permanent injunction on Ordinances 25-50 and 25-52, stating that these individuals may dress in any manner which they want and are not to be arrested by the Miami Beach Police Department. A confidential source advised on May 23, 1972, that at a rally at Columbus, Chio, on May 21, 1972, sponsored by the GAA, a recognized student group on the campus of Chio State University, an announcement was made urging everyone to go to the national political conventions in Niami and stating if they could not be at both conventions, they should plan to be at the Democratic Mational Convention. The announcement stated arrangements should be made through the GAA office in Miami.

A second confidential source advised on May 31, 1972, that CHUCK LAMONT of the Chicago chapter of GAA and a spokesman for the NCGO has recently been in Miami organizing for protest activity by these organizations at the Democratic Mational Convention.

The May 31, 1972, issue of the "Miami Herald", a daily Miami newspaper, contained an article stating that CHUCK LAMONT, spokesman for the MCGO, had advised that his group has requested the City of Miami Beach furnish a camp site on the 21st Street Beach, Miami Beach, for use of the gay demonstrators. LAMONT said this beach is already known as a "gay beach" and he added that a separate gay camp site is needed from camp sites utilized by other demonstrators because of possible animosities of these other demonstrators who may harbor "anti-gay feelings". 1/

On June 1, 1972, on the program "The Informer", a daily talk show on Miami Beach radio station WKAT, talkmaster LYNN RUSSELL talked by telephone with BOB BARRY, who identified himself as President of the Miami chapter of GAA. He related as follows:

The GAA has made plans for peaceful demonstrations at the site of the Democratic Mational Convention in support of the delegates within the convention committed to the support of "gay rights". Some 50 such delegates are already committed.

R: GAY ACTIVISTS ALLIANCE; MATIONAL COALITION OF GAY ORGANIZATIONS

The expected number of gay demonstrators was estimated at over 6,000 based upon the number who attended a recent national convention in Chicago sponsored by the NCGO. Some of the demonstrators will be dressed in "full drag", complete attire of the opposite sex, and others will be dressed in "skag drag", partial female attire or full female attire with beards. GAA considers this a political action and the demonstrations will be in support of full civil rights for all homosexuals in every field.

tuation has developed between the In recent years, an ersar ychiatric profession and the homosexual community. While much of psychiatry sees w unaware of this, it is felt with growing resentment and terness by the homosexual community who increasingly see psychiatry as THE major enemy a battle against deeply-rooted societal prejudice, and see psychiatrists as singularly insensitive and obtuse to the destruction which they are wreaking upon homosexuals Un by their negative attitudes and pronouncements. We consider such an adversary situation undesirable and reconciliation to be to the advantage of both adversaries. That is why we, as homosexuals, are here at the Dallas conference of the American Psychiatric Association. In our view, homosexuals are the people most knowledgeable about, and certainly most concerned with these questions. We have traditionally been the people least consulted while others, self-appointed and never authorized to represent us, have talked about us instead of with us, and set themselves up, without our permission, as our spokesmen. We are bringing that to an end.

Central to the conflict between psychiatry and the homosexual community is the "sickness theory" of homosexuality and the whole related complex of negative attitudes toward homosexuality, which try to make of homosexuality something inferior to and less desirable than heterosexuality. It matters not whether the word used be sickness, disorder, affliction, disturbance, dysfunction, neurosis, immaturity, fixation, character or personality disorder, pathology, or any other—or whether homosexuality be considered as merely symptomatic of these—the effects are the same: (1) To support and buttress the prejudices of society and to assist the bigots in the perpetration and perpetuation of their bigotry; and, at least equally important (2) To destroy the homosexual's self-confidence and self-esteem, impair his or her self-image, degrade his or her basic

human dignity.

Before any theory having consequences as disastrous as these is accepted, there should be certainty that it rests upon a sound scientific basis. As anyone with even a rudimentary scientific training is aware, the approach of psychiatry to homosexuality violaces every canon of good scientific research. For psychiatry cavalierly to spout forth its characterisations of homosexuality as less than fully healthy represents utter irresponsibility. If the profession wishes to continue to take pride in its alleged scientific accomplishments, it had better be sure that its "researches" really are scientific. Insofar as homosexuality is concerned, they could not be less so. They are a textbook illustration of "science" gone wrong. When the psychiatric position on homosexuality is examined, we find that we have been DEFINED into sickness and pathology by cultural, social, moral, teleological and theo-Elogical value judgments, camouflaged and cloaked in the language of science, but with none of the substance of science.

Even more irresponsible is the continuing refusal of psychiatry to shoulder its proper burden in any situation of bigotry: To provide therapy for the bigots in order to change their attitudes; to change the attitudes of society, instead of not only accepting those attitudes but deifying them

and then engaging in human engineering for conformity to them.

Deeply resented by the gay community are persistent efforts by psychiatrists to convert homosexuals to heterosexuality, instead of inculcating them with pride in their homosexuality. Increasingly, we hear psychiatrists piously declare that they attempt to convert "only those homosexuals who wish to be changed." That is an unacceptably simplistic, superficial, and shallow approach. When society generally, and psychiatry particularly, have "brainwashed" homosexuals into a belief in the inferiority of their homosexuality, the homosexual who asks to be changed in merely the creation of a self-fulfilling process. How many whites choose, to try to "pass" as black, and why is the number so small, and why do any blacks at all choose to "pass" as white, and is it not better that now, in an era of "Black is Beautiful," fewer and fewer Blacks are trying to be untrue to themselves? We must investigate and often challege the motives before we accept the desire to change. The great majority of homosexuals desiring to change to heterosexuality should be instilled with a belief that "Gay is Good," not blandly welcomed as candidates for change.

The homosexual community looks upon efforts to change homosexuals to heterosexuality, or to mold younger, supposedly malleable homosexuals into heterosexuality (the very existence of this "plastic teenager" is questionable at best) as an assautit upon our people comparable in its way to genocide. We find offensive the entire vocabularly of the psychiatric literature, in which "help." "improvement," "success," "recovery" and similar terms relating to the therapy of homosexuals is related to the extent of increase in heterosexual tendency and activity. The goals of therapy of homosexuals must be subjected to searching re-examination.

Equally important as a consequence of psychiatric attitudes, is the fact that large numbers of homosexuals who might benefit from psychotherapy for a variety of problems unrelated to their homosexuality (which is NEVER a problem in and of itself, any more than heterosexuality is ever a problem in and of itself) will not go near a psychiatrist because of their fully-justified expectation that their real problems will be shunted aside and ignored, and the therapy will become an unwanted assault upon their homosexuality.

Por better or for worse, psychiatry and psychiatrists are authority figures in our society today. Responsible authorities assess with great care the consequences of the exercise of their authority and the validity of their positions and premises. In regard to homosexuality, psychiatry clearly has not done so. It is time to start doing so, or to doff the mantle of authority before it of ia taken from you!

In our view, it is time for psychiatry to reassess its position on homosexuality from the ground ' up. Queen Victoria has been dead for almost three-quarters of a century " , in project up in w

work as a pioneer and trail-blazer, but trails are necessarily diamewith lack of knowled the whole terrain and selfom foll w what ultimately turns out the the optimum route. It is time to realize that muc. f the sychiatric approach to home lity ust be recognized for what it is: A misinter retation of cultural artifacts of the largerly storted, warped, perverted sexual attitude of the Victorian era, in which Free up, and shortly following which eta most modern "authorities" on this subject were traine

We must recognize that one of the glories of humankind is itselless diversity and pluralism in all things; that we are not faceless robots all turned out of thume mold, but that we follow different courses of equal value to different goals of equal valuem psychosexual development as in all other areas; that there is no one, single healthy course may chosexual development.

Finally, we must realize that among the glories of humankind and brain, which has liberated us from the degrading, demeaning, dehumanizing (and inapplicables this context) "anatomy is destiny" theory. Our genital organs are our appendages; we are mappendages of our genital organs.

We take the position that in our pluralistic society, the homescal has a moral right to be a homosexual, and being a homosexual, has a moral right not only live his or her homosexuality fully, freely, openly, and with pride, but also has a right to do since of arrogant and insolent pressures to convert to the prevailing heterosexuality, and in the emetation of the active, affirmative, positive assistance and encouragement of all the official and sofficial arms and agents of society, including psychiatry, in his so living. Not only do we insist that homosexuals, as people, are in no winferior to heterosexuals as: people (a precept to which we are sure that most psychiatrists willing no exception) but we insist, equally uncompromisingly, that homosexuality—as a condition state of being, a way of life or life-style, an expression of love and affection—is fully on pavith and in no slightest way

... We are working to create a sense of community among our pealeto create, in turn, a sense of unity, solidarity, militancy, and activism, in order to assist us medieve our full rights and status in a society which is ours as much as it is that of the hetenmals. We are working with success to create among our people a sense of pride in their homenuality and a sense of the

In order to do this, it is necessary to extract homosexuality in the medical context in which it has long and persistently been placed, and to place it in amological context of minority group relationships involving prejudice, discrimination, and bigotmThis is the only context in: which the real problems of real homosexuals in our society today wibe constructively and productively addressed. It has been well and truly said that in our societhere is no Black problem, there is a white problem. We say that there is no homosexual prime, there is a heterosexual problem. Psychiatry, as it presently deals with homosexuality, is assor part of that problem. "

A psychiatric profession which persists in approaching homosulity as a medical problem and homosexuals, per se, as patients, while homosexuals themselvess homosexuals are busy entering politics and running for public office, is singularly out of take with reality—psychotical-

We are trying to open dialog with the psychiatric profession on the questions. In past years, it has been necessary, on occasion, to resort to strong measures again a resisting profession in order to achieve such discussion of our problems with us instead amerely about us. We sincerely hope that productive, constructive discussion and dialog, silved by meaningful reform. of psychiatry, will now proceed actively.

Psychiatry, in the past-and continuingly-has been the majoragle obstacle in our society: to the advancement of homosexuals and to the achievment of our Mights, our full happiness.

WHAT YOU CAN DO:

- 1. Both individually, and collectively as a profession and an acciation, re-examine your past positions on homosexuality. Discard the negative attitudes anthe biases which have afwith the first the second to the second to the second to the flicted you in the past. '
- 2. Work for a public renunciation, by psychiatry, of the "sickmetheory" of homosexuality ANY semantic guise. in ANY semantic guise.
- 3. Undertake an active, vigorous campaign to ameliorate and ullately to eliminate popular prejudice on this question, both through work to change attitudend in such specific areas as law referm, equal opportunity legislation, etc.
 - 4. Consult on an on-going basis with representatives of the besexual community.

PREAMBLE:

WE AS LIDERATED ECHOSEXUAL ACTIVISTS demand the freedom for expression of our dignity and value as human being through confrontation with and disarmament of all mechanisms which unjustly inhibit us: occurred, social, and political. Before the public conscience, we demand an immediate and to all oppossion of the homosexuals and that immediate unconditional recognition of these basic rights:

THE RIGHT TO OUR OWN FEELINGS. This is the right to feel sttracted to the beauty of members of our own son and to embrace these feelings as truly our own, free from any question or challange whatscover by any other person, institution, or "moral authority."

THE RIGHT TO DUE. This is the right to express our feelings in action, the right to make love with anyone, anyway, anytime, provide only that such action be freely chosen by the individuals concerned.

THE RIGHT TO OUR OWN PODIES. This is the right to treat and express our bodies as we will, to nurture, didplay, and embellish thom solely in the manner we ourselned determine independent of any external control whatsoover.

THE RIGHT TO BE PERSONS. This is the right freely express our own individuality under the governmence of laws justly made and exactives, and tot be the bearers of social and political rights which are guaranteed by the Constitution of the United States and the Bill of Rights, enjoined upon alllegislative bodies and courts, and grounded in theth fact of our common humanity.

To secure these rights, wew hereby institute the GAY ACTIVISTS Alliance, which shall be completely and soley dedicated to their implementation and maintenance, repudiating, at the same time, violence (except for the right of self-defence) as unworthy of social protest, Cisdaining all ideologies, whether political or social and for bearing alliance with any group except for those whose concrete actions are likewise ap specifically dedicated.

It is finally to the imagination of oppressed homosomusis thamselves that we commend the consideration of these rights, upon whose actions alone depends all hope for the prospect of their

lusting procurement.

1972 CA. RIGHTS PLATFORM IN THE UNITED STATES

1. 3.

(adopted by the National Coalition of GAY Organizations meeting in Chicago, Illinois, February 13, 1972)

Millions of Gay women and men in this country are subject to severe social, economic and psychological and legal oppression because of their sexual orientation.

We affirm the right of all persons to define and express their own sensibility, emotionality and sexuality, and to choose their own lifestyle, so long as they do not infringe upon the rights of others. We pledge an end to all social, economic and legal oppression of Gay women and men.

We demand the repeal of all laws forbidding voluntary sex acrs involving consenting persons in private.

Laws prohibiting loitering for the purpose of soliciting for a homosexual liaison are vague and unconstitutional.

Nevertheless, they are frequently used as the legal cover for police entrapment of Gay women and men.

We demand the repeal of all laws prohibiting solicitation for a voluntary private sexual liaison.

Prejudice and myth have led to widespread discrimination against Gay women and men.

We demand the enactment of civil rights legislation which will prohibit discrimination because of sexual orientation in employment, housing, public accommodations and public services.

DEMANDS:

FEDERAL:

- 1. Amend all federal Civil Rights Acts, other legislation and government controls to prohibit discrimination in employment, housing, public accommodations and public services, because of one's sexual orientation.
- 2. Issuance by the President of an executive order prohibiting the military from excluding for measons of their
 sexual orientation, persons who of their on volition
 desire entrance into the Armed Services; and from issuing
 less-than-fully-honorable discharges for immosexuality;
 and the upgrading to fully honorable all much discharges
 previously issued, with retroactive benefits.
- 3. Issuance by the President of an executive order prohibiting discrimination in the federal civil service because of sexual orientation, in hiring and promoting; and prohibiting discriminations against Gay women and men.
- 4. Elimination of tax inequities victimizing single persons and same-sex couples.
- 5. Elimination of bars to the entry, immigration and naturalization of Gay aliens.
- 6. Federal encouragement and support for sex education courses, prepared and taught by qualified Gay women and men, presenting homosexuality as a valid, healthy preference, lifestyle, and as a viable alternative to beterosexuality.
- 7. Appropriate executive orders, regulations and legislation banning the compiling, maintenance and dissamination of information on an individual's sexual preferences, behavior, and social and political activities for domiers and data banks, and ordering the immediate destruction of such data.
- 8. Federal funding of aid projects for social and political activities of Gay women's and men's organizations designed to alleviate the problems encountered by Gy women and men which are engendered by an oppressive sexist society.

Immediate release of all Gay women and men now iscarcerated in detention centers, prisons and mental institutions because of sexual offense charges relating to victimless or mes or sexual orientation; and that adequate compensation be made for the physical and mental duress encountered; and that all existing records relating to the incarceration be immediately expunged.

STATE:

- 1. All federal degustered and programs enumerated in Demands 1,4 1,7,8, and 9 above should be implemented at the State of 1 where applicable.
- 2. Repeal of all state laws prohibiting private sexual acts involving consenting persons; equalization for homosexuals and heterosexuals for the enforcement of all laws.
- 3. Repeal all state leve prohibiting solicitation for private voluntary remaind limiting, and laws prohibiting prostitution, both male and female.
- Enactment of legislation prohibiting insurance companies and any other state-regulated enterprises from discriminating because of sexual orientation, in insurance and in bonding or and other prerequisite to employment or control of one's personal demesne.
- 5. Enactment of legislation so that child custody, adoption, visitation rights, foster parenhood, and the like shall not be denied because of sexual orientation or marital status.
- 6. Repeal of all laws prohibiting transvestitism and cross dressing.
- 7. Repeal of all laws governing the age of sexual consent.
- 8. Repeal of all legislative provisions that restrict the sex or number of persons entering into a marriage unit; and the extention of legal benefits of marriage to all persons who cohabit regardless of sex or numbers.




