## SECTION III

## Crime Index Offenses Cleared

For UCR purposes, law enforcement agencies clear or solve an offense when at least one person is arrested, charged with the commission of the offense, and turned over to the court for prosecution. Clearances recorded in 1996 may be for offenses which occurred in prior years. Several crimes may be cleared by the arrest of one person, or the arrest of many persons may clear only one offense. Law enforcement agencies may clear a crime by exceptional means when some element beyond law enforcement control precludes the placing of formal charges against the offender. Examples of circumstances allowing such clearances are the death of the offender (suicide, justifiably killed by police or private citizen, etc.); the victim's refusal to cooperate with prosecution after the offender has been identified; or the denial of extradition because the offender committed another crime in a different jurisdiction and is being prosecuted there. In all exceptional clearance cases, law enforcement must have identified the offender, have enough evidence to support arrest, and know the offender's location.

Law enforcement agencies nationwide recorded a 22-percent Crime Index clearance rate for 1996. Collectively, 47 percent of violent crimes were cleared. Among the violent offenses, the clearance rates were 67 percent for murder, 52 percent for forcible rape, 27 percent for robbery, and 58 percent for aggravated assault. Clearances for crimes against persons (murder, forcible rape, and aggravated assault) are generally higher than for property crimes as crimes against persons are often given more intensive investigative efforts, and the victims and/or witnesses can frequently identify the perpetrators.

The overall property crime clearance rate was 18 percent. Twenty percent of the larceny-thefts, 14 percent each of motor vehicle thefts and burglaries, and 16 percent of arsons were cleared during the year.

When considering the Modified Crime Index total which includes arson, the overall clearance rate was 22 percent.

The highest total Crime Index clearance rates geographically were registered in both the Northeastern and Southern States, each with 23 percent. The Midwestern and Western States each recorded a 21 -percent clearance rate. For violent crime, the highest clearance rate, 49 percent, was recorded in the South. In the West, the rate was 47 percent, while the Midwest and

Northeast each registered a 46-percent rate. Property crime clearance rates were 19 percent each in the Northeast and South, 18 percent in the Midwest, and 17 percent in the West.

By community type, rural county law enforcement agencies recorded the highest clearance rate for Crime Index offenses brought to their attention, 24 percent. City agencies solved 22 percent of total crimes reported and suburban county agencies, 21 percent. Cities with 10,000 to 24,999 inhabitants registered the highest total Crime Index and property crime clearance rates, 27 percent and 24 percent, respectively. The highest violent crime clearance rate- 62 percent-was recorded both in cities with populations under 10,000 and in the rural counties. (See Table 25.)

## Clearances Involving Only Persons under 18 Years of Age

Involvement of juveniles in crime can be measured by the number of crimes in which they have been identified as the offenders. Even though no physical arrest may have been made, a clearance by arrest is recorded when an offender under 18 years of age is cited to appear in juvenile court or before other juvenile authorities. Since the juvenile clearance percentages shown in this publication indicate only those offenses where no adults were involved, they should be considered a slight underestimation of juvenile involvement in crime. Juveniles (persons under 18 years of age) account for 26 percent of the United States population, according to 1996 Bureau of the Census estimates.

Twenty-one percent of the Crime Index offenses cleared by law enforcement during 1996 involved only young people under age 18. Persons in this age group accounted for 13 percent of the violent crime clearances and 23 percent of those for property crimes. Murder showed the lowest percentage of juvenile involvement, 8 percent, while the highest percentage was shown for arson, 45 percent.

Geographically, the Midwestern States recorded the largest percentage of Crime Index offense involvement by the under 18 age group- 25 percent. Juveniles alone were the offenders in 23 percent of the clearances in the Western States, 20 percent of those in the Northeastern States, and 17 percent of those in the Southern States.
