SECTION IV

Persons Arrested

Primarily a gauge of law enforcement's response to crime, arrest counts also provide definitive data concerning the age, sex, and race of perpetrators. Arrest practices, policies, and enforcement emphases vary from place to place even within a community from time to time as, for example, during a local police campaign against residential burglary. While the practices for certain unlawful conduct such as drunkenness, disorderly conduct, vagrancy, and related violations may differ among agencies, those for robbery, burglary, and other serious crime arrests are more likely to be uniform and consistent throughout all jurisdictions. The Program's procedures require that an arrest be counted on each separate occasion a person is taken into custody, notified, or cited. Annual arrest figures do not measure the number of individuals arrested since one person may be arrested several times during the year for the same or different offenses.

In 1998, law enforcement agencies nationwide made an estimated 14.5 million arrests for all criminal infractions excluding traffic violations. Within specific crime categories, the highest arrest counts were for drug abuse violations at 1.6 million arrests. Driving under the influence registered approximately 1.4 million arrests and larcenythefts and simple assaults each accounted for 1.3 million arrests. Drug abuse violations and alcohol-related arrests in 1998 accounted for an estimated 30 percent of the overall arrests. (See Table 29.)

In relation to the total United States population, the arrest rate was 5,534 arrests per 100,000 inhabitants. Among the city population groupings, cities with more than 250,000 inhabitants recorded the highest rate, 7,024, while those with populations from 25,000 to 49,999 recorded the lowest rate, 5,108. (See Table 31.) The arrest rate for suburban county law enforcement agencies was 4,216, and for rural county law enforcement, 4,181 per 100,000 inhabitants. By region, the arrest rates per 100,000 population ranged from 4,529 in the Northeast to 6,126 in the South. The Midwest and the West had arrest rates of 5,746 and 5,359, respectively. (See Tables 30 and 31.)

Due to NIBRS conversion efforts, only limited arrest data were received from contributing law enforcement agencies in New Hampshire and Illinois, and no arrest data were received from Kansas. Because of reporting problems at the state level, only limited arrest statistics were provided from Kentucky and Montana, and no arrest data were received from Wisconsin. Arrest statistics received from the District of Columbia could not be processed because the format in which the data were submitted were not in accordance with UCR guidelines. Therefore, tables showing the age, sex, or race of persons arrested contain limited or no data for these states. Arrest totals for these missing states and the District of Columbia were, however, estimated for inclusion in Table 29, Total Estimated Arrests, United States, 1998.

Arrest Trends

The total number of arrests for all offenses excluding traffic violations decreased 1 percent nationally from 1997 to 1998. Arrests for Crime Index offenses fell 7 percent. Among those, arrests for violent crimes dropped 5 percent, and those for property crimes declined 8 percent.

For the 2-year period 1997 and 1998, adult arrests fell 1 percent, and juvenile arrests declined by 4 percent. Violent crime arrests declined 4 percent for adults, and juvenile violent crime arrests fell by 8 percent. Property crime arrests declined 6 percent for adults and 11 percent for juveniles. (See Table 36.)

A comparison of total arrests for 1997 and 1998 indicates a 2-percent decrease in the Nation's cities collectively and a decline of 1 percent in suburban counties. Rural counties showed virtually no change in arrests for this 2-year period. (See Tables 44, 50, and 56.)

Even though total Crime Index arrests fell 12 percent with violent crime arrests decreasing 8 percent and property crime arrests falling 14 percent, data used to establish 5-year trends show total arrests were up 4 percent. From 1994 to 1998, juvenile arrests increased 1 percent, and adult arrests rose 5 percent. (See Table 34.)

For the decade 1989 to 1998, arrests for all offenses were up 7 percent. Crime Index offense arrests fell 14 percent, and those for property crimes declined 19 percent. However, arrests for violent crimes increased 4 percent for the decade.

In 1998, the drug abuse violation arrest total was 1 percent higher than in 1997, 17 percent above the 1994 level, and 20 percent higher than in 1989. The types of drugs involved in drug arrests during 1998 by geographic region are shown in Table 4.1.

Age

Six percent of all persons arrested nationally in 1998 were under the age of 15; 18 percent were under 18; 32 percent were under 21; and 45 percent were under 25. The under-25 age group also accounted for 47 percent of arrestees in the cities, 41 percent of arrestees in the suburban counties, and 40 percent in rural counties. (See Tables 41, 47, 53, and 59.)

Twenty-nine percent of persons arrested for Crime Index offenses were under the age of 18; 44 percent, under 21; and 55 percent, under 25. The under-25 age group comprised 44 percent of the violent crime arrestees and 59 percent of property crime arrestees in 1998.

The offense that resulted in the most arrests of persons under age 18 was larceny-theft, while adults were most often arrested for drug abuse violations. (See Table 38.)

Sex

In 1998, males comprised 78 of the persons arrested in the United States. (See Table 42.) Seventy-four percent of Crime Index arrestees were also males. In the violent crimes and property crime categories, 83 and 71 percent, respectively, of those arrested were males. The offenses for which men were most often arrested, drug abuse violations and driving under the influence, accounted for a combined total of 22 percent of all male arrests. Comparatively, those same offenses account for 15 percent of overall female

arrests and 20 percent of total arrests. Forty-five percent of male violent crime arrestees and 41 percent of female violent crime arrestees were under the age of 25.

Females were most often arrested for larceny-theft, accounting for 72 percent of arrests of females for Index crimes and 15 percent of all female arrests in 1998. Fifty-six percent of all female larceny-theft arrestees were under 25 years of age.

Virtually no change was recorded in the number of female arrests from 1997 to 1998, but a 2-percent decrease in male arrests was registered for the same period. Female arrests for violent crimes showed no change over the past year with male violent crime arrests decreasing by 5 percent.

For the 5-year period of 1994-1998, male arrests rose 2 percent, and female arrests were up 13 percent. Female violent crime arrests rose 12 percent during that same period, and male violent crime arrests fell by 12 percent.

Over the past decade, 1989 to 1998, total arrests have risen by 7 percent with arrests of males up 2 percent and arrests of females up 28 percent. During this same time period, violent crime arrests increased by 4 percent. Violent crime arrests showed a 53-percent increase for females, and a 2-percent decrease for males. (See Tables 32-37.)

Race

Race distribution figures for the total number of national arrests during 1998 showed 68 percent of the arrestees were white, 30 percent were black, and the remainder were of other races. (See Table 43.) Whites accounted for 63 percent of the Index crime arrestees, 65 percent of the property crime arrestees, and 58 percent of the violent crime arrestees.
