Bureau letter to Kansas City dated April 21, 1943 In compliance with the instructions contained in the DETAILS: letter from the Bureau to the Chicago Field Office, a letter was directed from the Kansas City Office to FRANK J. RYAN, Secretary of State, Topeka, Kansas, to determine if the Moorish Science Temple of America, Inc. or the Moorish Temple of Science of America, Inc., had been registered in the State of Kansas. In reply to this inquiry, Secretary of State RYAN advised by letter dated May 18, 1943, that neither of these organizations had been registered in the State of Kansas, either as a foreign corporation or as a domestic organization. Reference letter from the Bureau to the Kansas City Field Division dated April 21, 1943, indicated that information had been received from a highly confidential source to the effect that the negroes employed at the Quarter-Approved and Forwarded Kansas City 5 - Bureau 3 - Chicago Kanaas City - G-2, Kansas City $C_{J,F}$ ONI, Chicago

master Depot, Kansas City, Missouri, had an overbearing attitude toward the white people; that these negroes were reported to be untrustworthy and to be planning some sort of a racial uprising soon.

that in October, 1942, the labor conditions and tempo of the work at the U. S. Quartermaster Depot ware good and that there was a minimum of troublesome employees or labor problems; that shortly thereafter it became apparent that some labor problems were impending at that depot; that during the fall of 1942 the American Federation of Labor had initiated a movement to organize a local union at this depot. This organization work for the AF of L Warehouse and Teamsters Union was carried on largely by R. E. JAMES, an organizer for total No. 2, AFL, 200 State Bank Building, Kansas City, Kansas. During this same period the rival CIO Warehouse and Teamsters Union also attempted to organize the workers in this depot. During this period of organizational work, by both of these unions at that depot, there were some indications of agitation among the American negroes, with statements being made by some of the workers as follows: "What are you going to be ————? A white man's negro? Don't work yourself to death for the white man."

The organizing and racial friction at this depot reached its heighth in December, 1942, and January, 1943. During the latter month about 300 of the colored workers at this depot were discharged and among this group were included all of the leaders who presumably were causing racial friction at this depot. Since that date the labor situation at this depot has constantly improved and there are no apparent labor difficulties at the present time. In addition, there are no obvious racial problems at this plant at the present time.

Reference letter indicates that the agitators at this depot were described as wearing beards, long hair and termed "The Red Fet Outfit."

that the only individuals fitting this description at this depot were some negroes who formerly drove a truck and picked up trash and waste paper at this depot. He advised that they drove a truck for the S and K Mastepaper Company; that these individuals were not employed by the War Department and merely picked up this trash and wastepaper under a private contract. Confidential Informant T-1 further advised that no individuals by the name of HEY or EL are presently employed at this depot.

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that she recalled that that SR. owned and formerly operated a truck for the that he was usually accompanied in the operation of this truck by EL. She related that both of these latter two individuals are members of Father MOHAMAND BEY'S organization of the Moorish Science Temple of America.

It is to be noted that BEY, was convicted in the U. S. District Court, Kansas City, Kansas, on January 19, 1943, and was sentenced to serve four years and a fine of \$1.000 for failure to register under the Selective Service Act. EL had been arrested in connection with a violation of the Selective Service Act but had been released on the order of the Attorney General of the United States on Octob 24, 1942, due to the fact he was too old.

BEY further stated that since the imprisonment of
BEY. Several of the other members of her sect had been operating this
truck. She could not supply the names of these individuals but believed

has been no activity whatsoever on the part of her organization due to the

It is to be noted that previous investigation in this case fails to reveal any subversive activity on the part of Father MOHAMMED BEY'S organization.

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that the membership of Temple No. 46 and Branch Temple No. 46 has been dwindling during the last several months; that none of the members appear to be taking any interest whatsoever in the organization and it is questionable if the organization will continue to exist for any great length of time in the future. She advised that all of the negroes ap-

pear to be much more interested in earning money than in attending to their religious duties. She advised further that all of the members of Temple No. 46 as well as Branch Temple No. 46 were complying with the provisions of the Selective Service Act. She related that from March 21 to March 23, 1943, Colonel C. KIRKMAN BEY of Chicago, Illinois, had been visiting in Hancas City, Kansas; that he had visited Temple No. 46 and Branch Temple No. 46 at this time; that Colonel C. KIRKMAN BEY had expressed dissatisfaction with these Temples due to the dwindling membership and lack of activity. She advised that this was purely a routine inspection trip by Colonel C. KIRKMAN BEY; that he had resided with her at her address during his visit in Kansas City, Kansas; that upon leaving Kansas City, Kansas, he had proceeded to Atchison, Kansas, where he was to inspect the local temple there.

Temple No. 46 nor Branch Temple No. 46 had been registered in the State of Kansas.

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

Madam TAKAHASHI then became a big worker in the organization in Detroit and she did lots of promotional work in favor of the Japanese Government. The Detroit unit was financed by TAKAHASHI, who in turn received his money from a Japanese by the name of NATAHABE. Another Japanese by the name of NATAHABE. "In accordance with the Divine Laws transmitted to Our Holy Prophet, Noble Drew Ali, Founder of the Moorish Science Temple, the Divine and National Movement of North America, Incorporated.

"Each Temple is to be provided with these supplementary rules to be accepted and adopted, and be governed by Love, Peace, Truth, Preedom, and Justice, to be practiced by all and meted out to all.

Each Temple is headed by the Grend Sheik, Ass't. Grand Shiek or Sheikess, and assisted by Chairman, Secretary, and Treasurer. All of the officers are to be seated at the table, the Secretary recording the minutes. Important-Start all meetings on time.

Salaam Ilyeum. This Temple has been duly awarded with a charter of approval by the M.S.T. of the D.N.M. of N.A., Inc., approved and passed by National and State Governments.

RULES.

- 1. Act as an individual and as a body in a manner which will not reflect unfavorably upon humanity, of which you are an integral part.
- 2. Remember, as Moorish Americans, you are a proud people.
- 3. Moorish Americans practice Love, Truth, Peace, Freedom, and Justice.
- 4. Remember the key of civilization was and is in the hands of our ancient Asiatic nations, the founders of the Holy City of Mecca. This is your birthright. Treasure ye it!
- 5. All Moorish Americans will duly consider it his and her duty to guarantee the necessary expenses of their travelling officers. Remember, every good servant is worthy of his hire. Look ye to it. Keep up your dues.
- 6. All Moorish Americans will promptly accept their duties and teach their children in the Holy Koran, that they too shall be blessed.
- 7. Destroy naught that ye cannot reconstruct.
- 8. Do not engage in subversive activities under any form. Remember first that you are proud of your ancestry, therefore you are good Moorish Americans.
- 9. Do not ridicule the teaching of any religion. It is not our aim to destroy anyone's belief.
- 10. Do not discourage Asiatics who would join the Moorish Science Temple the Divine and National Movement of North American, Inc. Every man woman and child who wishes to learn his true identity should be encouraged by you.
- 11. Do not join if you are prompted by sheer curiosity or if you cannot or will not accept Love, Peace, Truth, Freedom and Justice.
- 12. Do not interrupt when speakers have the floor. You will be given full opportunity to express your every opinion.
- 13. Do not straggle in when the meeting is nearly over. Make it your business to be on time.
- 14. Do not neglect your membership, your dues, and your obligations to those officers who strive to serve you.

"These rules shall be so placed that they will not miss being seen by all of the members of this Temple No. . May the blessing of Allah thru his Holy Prophet Nobel Drew Ali be with you all. Amen.

"TRANSCRIPT OF MESSAGE SENT TO PRESIDENT ROOSEVELT BY

"We propose, as Moorish Americans, first the absolute respect due to Americans and America; to the Chief Executive; to the laws of America and to abide thoreby.

Since, thru the Divine Knowledge of Men, know thyself, and the truth shall set thee free.

Therefore we Moorish-Americans, have sought, thru the pages of life, the origin of the so-called Negro, the birth of slavery. We have found that its origin began with the complete loss of identity.

Therefore, we are restoring to Humanity, its God given birthright. We are acknowledging our forefather's gift to civilization. We recognize the truth. We denounce the evil that enslaved us.

Now, Whereas the Constitution decrees that people be recognized only from the land of their fathers, "by their nation and religion", be it known that under the name "negro" those born out of slavery are not eligible for national recognition.

Therefore, we, as Moorish Americans, do resolve:

- 1. That the name "negro" be banned forever as a title of nationality and created international Humanity.
- 2. That "negro" in its best defined term indicates color (black) not a nationality. From whence cometh the terms "colored", "Nigger", etc. We know not its Godgiven land.
- 3. That we as Moorish Americans, will not submit ourselves to subversities to thwart our progressive rights.
- 4. That we, as Moorish-Americans, shall seek representation in all progressiveness pertinent to affairs of the people, be it, civil, national or international.
- 5. That compromise shall not be conducive to progress where actualities where actuality shall be concerned, indiscriminately.
- 6. Irrational acts of radicalism shall not be tolerated by loyal Moorish Americans. Any contrarities to America and its principles, any

attempts to overthrow our government, or otherwise cause the principles of Moorish Americans to be misconstrued, under the Divine Laws of the Moorish Science Temple, will be prosecuted.

7. And, finally be it unaimously resolved that Moorish Americans will not be subjugated to submissiveness in any form which tends to enslave or otherwise decrease the progressiveness of a people worthy of their birthright under their free Name-Moorish Americans.

Thus be it resolved:

MBrother Moslem-Salaam Ilycuum, I give praise to Allah, the omnipotent Creator of the Universe; to Jesus, the Divine Savior of Humanity, the Eternal Prophet of Revelation; to Noble Drew Ali, the Divine Prophet and Founder of the Moorish Science Temple, the D.N.K. of N.A., Inc., to our National Flag of Origin and Principle.

I honor those leaders who profess their oneness with Allah; our Grand International Councillor El; Grand Gov. Brother Bey; the Grand Sheiks and Sheikesses, and the Divine Ministers, Distinguished Guests, All.

I present myself to you on this honorable occasion to celebrate the birthday of a man destined to prophesy the advent of revelation of the truth; the true dignity, the rightful heritage of man. On this Moorish Christmas we assemble to reason with one another, as we have all learned either one thing or another in contrarities. We have been taught that we are negroes, to begin with. We have wondered why we have thus far progressed so slightly. Since the supposed emancipation, oppressions, depressions, subjugations, have been our lot. Discriminations, intolerance, ostracisms have pursued us in all our attempts to gain equal rights. Why? Have we not given thought to our forefathers, suffered as they suffered? They were torn away from their God-given homeland, shackled to the cars of slave ships, sold into bondage, whipped, lashed, burned into a state of forgetfulness. Children born of this unhappy slave stock were mocked out of their forefathers religion, made to forget their one-time Divine right to Love, truth peace, freedom, and justice. They were branded with the name of a color, made to believe that they were originally nomads, pagans, people without a country.

"Should we not therefore, vindicate the bloodshed of our forefathers? Remember, they released the first civilization to our sugjugators. Should we not take back the free national name of origin, shed the name of "negro" "nigger" "colored" "darky" Etc. Indians, West-East or any other kind of Indian are known by the one free national name.

This should not seem hard to understand. Whatever our fore-fathers were, so also are we.

Have you ever wondered why cannot a "negro" become recognised? The explanation is very simple; because he has declared himself as a color. The undeclared Moorish American must look within himself - seek out whether or not he is a perfect "color-scale". For example, Black Negro, colored negro, brown, yellow, or even white negro. Have you ever seen a white black? I don't think you have! Negro which means black, therefore needs no adjective to describe it, as "colored" negro, for example, and other descriptions.

There is no anthropological student who will deny this fact: Those who know, however, hope that we will never question their theory. Those of you who doubt, check with any student of English, Latin, or Spanish. You will soon learn that you have been classified as a color that had no place in this world of othics, sociollogically used and psychologically balanced.



BEY, a dentist at was contacted by the writer as a potential patient and Dr. BEY, who is white, advised that he is a graduate of St. Louis University, a Catholic of French descent, and that he has never heard of the MOORISH SCIENCE TEMPLE OF AMERICA.

Under the pretext of being a genealogist from Chicago, Illinois. inte<u>rested in the origin</u> of the BEY family, the writer approached and in general conversation the following information was obtained from him. This individual is of negro-Moroccan descent and doesn't actually know where or when he was born. His father, who was supposed to have been of Moroccan descent, died when this individual was an infant, and he grew up in St. Louis, going to Chicago, Illinois in the late 1920s, where he became interested in the M.S.T.A. The then leader of the temple died in 1928 and for a while thereafter until about 1930 BEY gave lectures in the temple. Since that time BEY has lived in St. Louis and from time to time has lectured at various gatherings of colored people. He works as an Evangelist minister in his own home to people who call on him and visits various colored people in St. Louis who are interested in his religious views. BEY expressed himself as being very much a patriot and believing that the present government is doing much for the educational and economic advancement of the colored race, and stated that he feels Krs. FRANKLIN D. ROOSEVELT is one of God's chosen. BET stated that his religious beliefs are based on his early leanings in the MORISH SCIENCE TEMPLE and that he prays in the morning and at noon every day, facing to the east and bowing to Allah and to Jesus Christ. BEY indicated to the writer that he would be glad to pray for him, and intimated that for his prayers he

expected some contribution. BEY stated that the MOORISH SCIENCE TRAFLE OF AMERICA had never established an organisation in St. Louis to his knowledge and that he has grown away from the church and has never heard of COLONEL C. KIRKMAN BEY of Chicago.

Reference is made to Bureau letter dated June 7, 1943 requesting to be advised as to what the B. B. Plan is mentioned in the report prepared by transmitted in a letter to the Bureau dated May 31, 1943. The Bureau also requested the extent of connections with the Moorish Science Temple.

Enclosed are photostatic copies of two articles appearing in the "People's Voice", a negro weekly newspaper published in New York City, which are self-explanatory and which disclose the B. B. Plan. Copies of these clippings are also being furnished the Chicago office.

On January 4, 1943

directed a letter to the New lork office in which he enclosed articles written by him in the People's Voice newspaper concerning the Japanese plan in regard to Negroes in America and people of other parts of the world.

The enclosed photostatic copies of articles published in the People's Voice are identical to those furnished by were subsequently returned to him.

The files of the New York office reflect that an individual with the same name as has many references in the 67 classification tion, also that he is listed on the mailing list of the American Youth Congress, a Communist Front organization.

Pursuant to a request from the New York Field Division in a ropyicromy letter on January 22, 1943 was interviewed $KL \subseteq RDED$

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t his Base in Sioux City, Iowa, on January 29, 1943 by Special Agents and informed that he had been a newspaper reporter in New York City, as well as having formerly been a free lance writer and a sort of adviser for groups in New York City who were protesting against non-hiring of Negro help in business establishments. informed that he had started the newspaper "The People's Voice", but was only reporter and advertising salesman for this paper, which, at the time he was a reporter, was printed by editors of "P.W.", which, in turn, was owned by MARSHALL FIELD interests in Chicago, Illinois. Interviewing Agents state that it was apparent during the interview with he did not have recent information relative to any Japanese propaganda among Negro people in New York City and that he had written to the New York Field Division because he had allegedly observed a feeling of unrest among Negro soldiers and among Negro people prior to his induction into the army, which he claimed was the treatment given the Negroes by the white people.

that this feeling of unrest could create fertile ground for Japanese propaganda which would enable them to get converts among the colored people. during his work as a newspaper reporter he had come into contact with one SUFI ABDUL WAMID who formerly lived from "hand to mouth" practicing numerous quick cures, spiritualist movements, and who had been very active in organizing various racial movements in Chicago, Illinois and New York City. In about 1935, HAMID, whose real name is reported to be BROWN allegedly made some connection with a Japanese organization which had supposedly furnished him with considerable money and induced him to establish the Buddhist Temple at 103 Morningside Avenue, New York City. According to he has been in this Temple and has observed Japanese people in the office, as well as Japanese books, pictures, et cetera. The complete connections between the Buddhist Temple operated by HAMID and the Japanese people was never ascertained by however, it was his understanding that the Japanese were using this means to develop friends and converts among the Negro race and to create hatred among the white people.



He stated he did not know that Japan had attacked the United States although he knows that we are at war from reading the papers. He stated that he did not know why we are fighting and advised that Pearl Harbor was in Asia and he knew that Japan had attacked Pearl Harbor, but he did not know who started the war.

He informed that he filed his conscientious objector form because he is against war, but admitted that he would fight to defend his shirt if it were forcibly taken from him, but under no circumstances would he shoot a man. He stated his religion teaches him not to fight and that he got the facts about war from NORIE DREW ALI, who has passed away, but in a haphazard manner can contact him through the ether waves. He stated that when NORIE DREW ALI died, he appointed C. KITHMAN REY to represent his people, just as any nation has a representative.

He advised that his wife is now a member as she joined one



EY produced a book purported to contain extracts pertaining to the Holy Koran and an instruction manual similar to a catechism, but said that it was against his religion to allow these books to go out of his house or out of his sight. He referred the writer to and said that he could give more information.

HEY stated that in the event he were to receive a notice to report for induction, he would advise C. KIRKMAN BEY, who would take the necessary action. He stated that he was instructed to contact C. KIRKMAN BEY and his Temple by NOBLE DREW ALL, who informed him of this through the ether waves.

He maintained that he was not a citizen of the United States until he was nationalized by joining the MOCRISH SCIENCE TEMPLE. He added that that act gave him his birth rights as before that he had no vote and he was just like other Moorish Americans who had never been nationalized. He stated he was not a Negro and objected to Negro in the Selective Service forms, saying that there is only one race and that is the human race.

He informed that he is now a Moorish American similar to the German Americans and the Irish Americans only that his people are the l'oors. He advised that he was not colored as colored is either painted, dyed or varnished and he is not any of that.

He stated that there were 200 to 300 members of the MOORISH SCIENCE THIPLE No. 7 although only about sixty were active. He advised that the following persons were the leaders of the group:

Cleveland Field Division. It was noted on this occasion that he was wearing a small metal button, blue in color, upon which was a crescent with a white dot and under it the word "Allah". At that time he stated that he became a member of the MOTRISH SCIENCE TEMPLE in August, 1941 and although he had gone to the Temple three or four months before joining it, he admitted he was not a member when he registered for the Selective Service in October, 1940.

He stated that he had seen NORIE DREW ALL when he was in Cleveland in 1928 and advised that in January, 1941, he started going to the Temple regularly. BEY advised that prior to association with the MOORISH SCIENCE TEMPLE he had attended a Moorish Church in the vicinity of 75th and Woodland. However, he did not like that organization as they wanted him to use an ancient Moslem name. He stated that the MOORISH SCIENCE TEMPLE was the religion he wanted. He advised that upon reading the Koran, he became fully "conscious". He advised that the Moorish Americans who are not members of the MOORISH SCIENCE TEMPLE are not conscious and are mentally dead.

He stated that if he received an induction notice he would advise the EEY. He added that he had discussed with the BEY the filing of a conscientious objector form, at which time the BEY remarked that the HEY was a bright student to declare himself such and was "very conscious". He advised he secured the form and with the assistance of the one whom the BEY relied on for religious guidance and where the home office of the organization was located.

EEX advised that the conscientious objector form was in error where it stated that he was a member since August, 1940 as he did not become a member until 1941.

BEY advised that all of the books and literature upon which he depended for instruction were those which were presented to the writer at this interview, namely a copy of the Holy Koran and the question and answer instruction books bey stated that he was opposed to submitting in regard to the Army and described submitting as putting one in a position where one did not think for himself—in other words, that you would be ordered and told what to do. He said he was against the principles

of fighting with a gun in any army and as this was submitting, he was not in favor of submitting.

It was noted that the Holy Koran of the MOORISH SCIENCE TEMPIE OF AMERICA, a copy of which was possessed by HEY, was printed in 1927 and the instruction book was entitled, "Koran Questions for Moorish Americans", price 25¢, NOBLE DREW ALI, founder, MOORISH SCIENCE TEMPIE OF AMERICA, 1104 Sedgwick Street, Chicago, Illinois.

It was noted that BEY did not state that BEY, leader of Temple #7, advised him to file a conscientious objector form and he was reluctant to admit ahat BEY in any way counseled him in regard to his draft status, although he did state he had joined the MOORISH SCIENCE TEMPLE after he had registered in October, 1940 under the Selective Service Act.

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



MEMORANDUM FOR THE DIRECTOR FEDERAL BUREAU OF INVESTIGATION

Re: Mogrish Science Temple of America, C. Kirkman Bey, w/a, Supreme Grand Advisor and Moderator, et al, INTERNAL SECURITY (J). SEDITION, SELECTIVE SERVICE

Reference is made to your memorandum of August 7, 1943, relating to the above named subject.

We do not believe that there is sufficient evidence swailable at this time to marrant prosecution of Shelby Stricklin El under Section 311, Title 50. It appears from the reports relating to these two subjects that they are using exemption from military service under the Selective Service Act as an inducement to membership in the Moorish Science Temple of America, but there is little swidence of any actual counseling evasion. It is noted that the subject Shelby El is an aged tubercular and that both Shelby and Stricklin are registered and not presently delinquent with their local draft boards.

It is further noted that indictments have been returned against both Shelby and Stricklin in Mississippi for violation of State sedition statutes.

Inaguch as and are presently serving prison terms for violation of State sedition statutes, the Department does not feel that it is advisable to press Federal charges at this time.



Please refer to your letter of June 14, 1943, captioned "Jesse Shelby El, Albert Stricklin El, Moorish Temple of Science Number 1, Internal Security, J, Sedition", which points out that the captioned persons were indicted by a State Grand Jury in Mississippi together with Rubin Payne and Jim Barnes for violation of the State Sedition Laws. Your letter suggested that the facts be submitted to the Department for an opinion as to the Federal prosecution of Shelby and Stricklin who departed from Mississippi and avoided apprehension by the State authorities.

The Criminal Division of the Department advised by memorandum dated August 13, 1943, that there is insufficient evidence available at this time to warrant prosecution of Shelby El and Stricklin El under Section 311, Title 50. The Criminal Division pointed out that it appears that these men are using exemption from military service under the Selective Service Act as an inducement to membership in the Moorish Science Tample of America but that there is little evidence of any actual compseling of evasion.

It was also stated that, inasmuch as an and are presently serving prison terms for violation of State Sedition Statutes, the Department does not feel it is advisable to press Federal charges at this time.


