
The above letter was received at the Sands Hotel in Lar Vagas, Nevada, on Sentember 21, 1953. It was immediately forwarded to the FII Laboratory who advised that it cannot be determined that the record letter received by Miss HATTORTH was written by the same persons he has written the letter to LOUELLA PARSONS and the first letter to Miss HATTORTH inasmuch as the second letter received by Miss HATTORTH was a handprinted letter.

This envelope was approximately 6 1/2" by 3 2/3" and the letter was approximately 6" by 9" and may have been taken from a pad. No water marks on letter.

The FFI Laboratory advised that latent fingerprints of value had been developed from the second letter. These prints consist of one latent fingerprint and two latent palm prints developed on the envelope as well as five latent fingerprints and to latent palm prints developed on the letter itself.

Miss RIT; HAY OUTH and DICK HAYES both were interviewed relative to anyone whom they might suspect that would write a letter containing the threats which were in both letters received while Miss HAY ORTH was in Las vegas. They advised that they knew of no one who would write this type of letter who was located in the East or who was well known to them.
