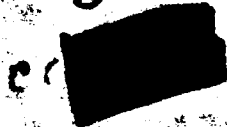

The following investigation was conducted by SA [REDACTED]

The following information was furnished by Mr. ROBERT HIRSCHMANN, Assistant Chief, Foreign Grantees Branch, Youth Activities Division, International Educational Exchange Service, Department of State, and is being set out in detail for the assistance of the Bureau.

Only 2800 of the total of approximately 30,000 foreign students in the United States are the recipients of grants from the Department of State under the Fulbright or Smith-Mundt Acts. So only about one in ten foreign students would be covered by a survey of the records of the Exchange Service of the Department of State.

At least two better sources for this type of information are available, both in New York City. The Committee on Friendly Relations Among Foreign Students, 291 Broadway, New York City, takes an annual census of foreign students in the United States, broken down by nationality (but not by religion) and by the states in which they are receiving their education. It was from figures released by this Committee, Director or Executive Secretary of which is BENJAMIN SCHLOCKER, that Mr. HIRSCHMANN was able to give the approximate total of 30,000 foreign students in the U. S. Another source would be the Institute of International Education, 1 East 67th Street, New York City, whose records would list all students processed as Department of State grantees, as well as many students who are the recipients of private scholarships and grants from private organizations, and in addition the names of some privately-

of the student. So it would be necessary to proceed only on broad generalizations, that a student from a predominantly Moslem country would be likely to be a Moslem himself, for example. While this assumption might be reasonably accurate for some countries such as Pakistan, Iran, and Iraq, it might be very inaccurate for some countries where Moslems are only fractional percentages of the whole population, and yet where the possibility exists that a student from such a country might be a Moslem. Mr. HIRSCHTRITT remarked that he believed that the records of the Institute of International Education might reflect the religious affiliation of the students listed therein.

A sizeable percentage of foreign students processed as grantees by the Department of State from previous years are still in the U.S. in one capacity or another. Mr. HIRSCHTRITT estimated that roughly half again as many Pakistan students, for example, from previous years grants might still be in the U.S. as the 62 listed by the Institute of International Education as taking part in the 1952 program. And again it must be remembered that the records of the Department of State cover only about 10% of the total number of foreign students in the U.S.

The problem of determining the likelihood that a student from a particular country is a Moslem is a very difficult one. The likelihood might be fairly great in such countries as Pakistan, Indonesia, Iran, Iraq, Jordan, Saudi Arabia, Syria, and Turkey. It would be less great in such countries of varying religious affiliation as Ceylon, Afghanistan, Egypt, Malaya, India, Lebanon, Libya, Tunisia and the Philippines. And many other African, European, and Asian countries have Moslem groups included in their total populations.

The work involved in getting the information desired as to identity and whereabouts of students from the above-listed countries would be considerable. The Department of State has no readily available lists, for example, of all current grantees from Pakistan. It would be necessary to run a series of cards through a machine-operated system to obtain cards for the 50 or 60 Pakistan students. It would be necessary then to examine the cards to determine if a student is attending a New York institution of learning, and then the name of the institution would have to be typed out. The same procedure would be followed for each of the countries where a possibility exists that a student from that country might be a Moslem. The approximate number of students in the Institute of International Education for 1952, as well as the number of grantees for the Department of State follows: Pakistan-62; Indonesia-13; Iraq-5; Jordan-1; Saudi Arabia-2; Syria-4; Turkey-41; Ceylon-7; Afghanistan-2; Egypt-62; Malaya-20; India-147; Lebanon-3; Libya-1; Tunisia-1; Philippines-76.

It also must be remembered that these figures cover only foreign students. They do not include Professors, Research Scholars, and Leaders. Substantial numbers of foreign citizens in these categories come to the U.S. every year to attend institutions of learning. It is noted that the Technical Cooperation Administration and the Mutual Security Agency, now merged in the Foreign Operations Administration, have maintained programs under which foreign students, technicians and scholars came to the U. S. to study, and many of them would be from the Near Eastern countries which have substantial Moslem groups.

A more direct source of information as to the number and whereabouts of students from Moslem countries attending various New York institutions, would be the institutions themselves.

It is recalled from press publicity concerning the AMAL KHAN, father of AMY KHAN, HINA KHAN's former husband, that the AMAL KHAN represents the ISRAELI STATE in the Moslem religion, and Imron in India.

In view of the foregoing, the WFO is requested to advise officials of the Department of State as to the need for verification of a very incomplete list of possible suspects. It is suggested that the New York Office consider the advisability of contacting the Committee on Friendly Relations Among Foreign Students, 201 Broadway, the Institute of International Education, 1 East 67th Street, both New York City, and/or all appropriate colleges in the New York area having foreign students, in an effort to ascertain the number and identities of Moslem exchange students in that area.

Copies of this letter are designated for the WFO Laboratory and the Los Angeles office for information and possible future assistance in this investigation. -RUC-

The Los Angeles Office advised on September 23, 1953, by teletype, that an extortion letter had been received by RITA HAY DEHN which threatened to do bodily harm and to kill her child, TASHIE. This letter was received by the Los Angeles Office by [redacted]

b7C [redacted] The aforementioned letter was supposed to be in the possession of [redacted] Sands Hotel in Las Vegas, Nevada.

[redacted] was contacted at the Sands Hotel, Las Vegas, Nevada, by Reporting Agent on the evening of September 13, 1953, at which time he advised that he had the letter in his possession which was addressed to Miss RITA HAYWORTH which is set out as follows:

RITA:

But think that this wont happen because it truly will if you marry dick Haynes. Your little girl YASMIN will be kill and if you dont want this to happen than you had better go back to Aly Khan, and also for you your rotten and there will be some one that will beat you so that you will have to go to the hospital and your career as movie star will be over.

This letter was postmarked New Rochelle, New York, September 12, 1953, at 10:00 PM and addressed to Miss RITA HAYWORTH c/o [redacted] Nevada.

[redacted] measured approximately 3 2/3" by 6 1/2" and the envelope contains no watermark and nothing was found in breaking the envelope to its contents.

[redacted] was interviewed and advised that she did not recognize the writing in longhand and stated that she did not have any acquaintances to her knowledge in New Rochelle, New York.

She further advised that she had received numerous crank letters in the past but that none of them had ever been of a threatening nature to herself or to her children. She stated that she had employed numerous people during the past number of years and that some of them had left her employment recently and were very bitter at the time they left their employment with her.

She stated that at the time that DICK HAYLES was arrested relative to an Immigration and Naturalization matter because he had traveled outside of the United States to Honolulu to visit her, that her employees were very bitter because she had been keeping company with

DICK HAYLES and as a result a number of them walked out at one time. [REDACTED]

She stated that [REDACTED] of those who had left her and that also a [REDACTED]

Miss HAYWORTH stated that [REDACTED] was extremely hurt when he was advised that he was being released from his employment with her.

Miss HAYWORTH advised that she had an employee by the name of [REDACTED] who was employed by her as a [REDACTED] and that [REDACTED] had come to her and advised her that she intended to leave HAYWORTH's employment on [REDACTED] and that subsequent to being advised by [REDACTED] that she was going to leave that a disagreement came up between her employees and that as a result of this disagreement that [REDACTED] decided to resign and that she was separated from HAYWORTH's [REDACTED] Miss HAYWORTH stated that [REDACTED]

Miss HAY WORTH stated that other employees who left her employment were [redacted] who resides in [redacted] California, and [redacted] who resides in Los Angeles, and [redacted] who also resides at Los Angeles. All of the aforementioned employees of HAY WORTH have been interviewed or located by the Los Angeles Office and their whereabouts are known on the date that the letter was postmarked in New Rochelle, New York.

The Los Angeles Office reported that Mrs. LOUELLA O. PARSONS had received a letter similar to the one received by RITA HAY WORTH in Las Vegas and that the letter addressed to Mrs. PARSONS was addressed to the Motion Picture Editor, International News Service, Hollywood, California, and that it was postmarked New Rochelle, New York, August 24, 1953, at 12:30 PM. The letter to Mrs. PARSONS also contained information and threats similar to the one received by RITA HAY WORTH. The threats in both letters, however, were against RITA HAY WORTH and her child YASMINE. Both letters, the one addressed to Mrs. LOUELLA PARSONS, Hollywood, California, and the one addressed to RITA HAY WORTH, Las Vegas, Nevada, were submitted to the FBI Laboratory who has advised that the questioned handwriting on the letter to Mrs. LOUELLA PARSONS in Hollywood, California, and the one to RITA HAY WORTH in Las Vegas, Nevada, that both letters were written by the same person. The FBI Laboratory further concluded that there were no latent fingerprints of value developed and that a search of the anonymous letter file met with negative results. It was further concluded that the questioned paper on which these letters were written bore the letter mark "Stratosphere" which paper is manufactured by the Miller Falls Paper Company of Miller Falls, Massachusetts.

The FBI Laboratory concluded that a letter to Mrs. LOUELLA PARSONS in Hollywood, California, which contained the threat on the life of RITA HAY WORTH and her child YASMINE was written on paper which probably was "Laton's Letter Paper" which is made by the Laton Paper Company of Pittsfield, Massachusetts.

On September 21, 1953, [redacted] for the Sands Hotel, advised the Resident Agent's Office at [redacted] that a second letter had been received by RITA HAY WORTH. This letter was addressed: Miss RITA HAY WORTH, Sands Hotel, Las Vegas, Nevada, and was postmarked Brooklyn, New York 7, September 16, 1953, at 11:00 PM. The letter read as follows:

"Miss HAYORTH,

"You should have taken my advice. YASMINE will die unless her father is permitted to raise her as a Moslem."

"You will suffer too! Praise Allah".

"Mohammed and His Followers"

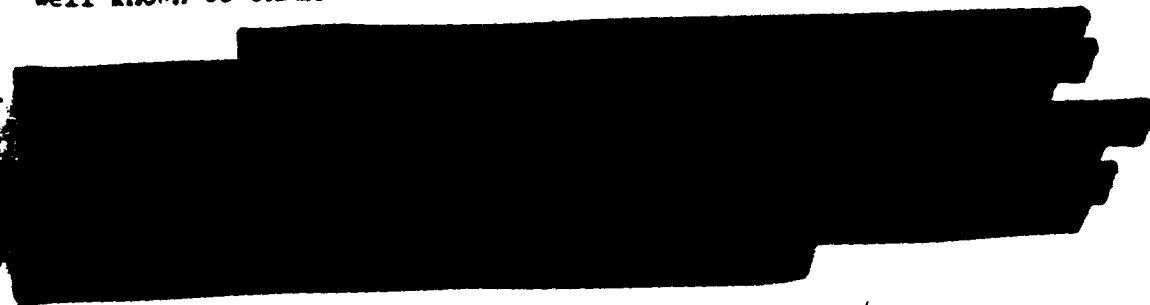
The above letter was received at the Sands Hotel in Las Vegas, Nevada, on September 21, 1963. It was immediately forwarded to the FBI Laboratory who advised that it cannot be determined that the second letter received by Miss HAYORTH was written by the same persons who had written the letter to LOUELLA PARSONS and the first letter to Miss RITA HAYORTH inasmuch as the second letter received by Miss HAYORTH was a handprinted letter.

This envelope was approximately 6 1/2" by 3 2/3" and the letter was approximately 6" by 9" and may have been taken from a pad. No water marks on letter.

The FBI Laboratory advised that latent fingerprints of value had been developed from the second letter. These prints consist of one latent fingerprint and two latent palm prints developed on the envelope as well as five latent fingerprints and two latent palm prints developed on the letter itself.

Miss RITA HAYORTH and DICK HAYMS both were interviewed relative to anyone whom they might suspect that would write a letter containing the threats which were in both letters received while Miss HAYORTH was in Las Vegas. They advised that they knew of no one who would write this type of letter who was located in the East or who was well known to them.

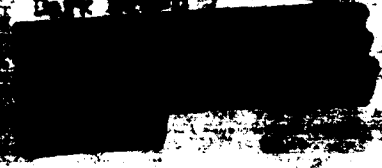

with assistant United States Attorney WILLIAM P. [REDACTED] who advised that
in his opinion these letters constitute a violation of the Espionage
Statute and that he will hold prosecutive opinion in abeyance pending
the identity of the person who wrote the letters.

Fingerprints were obtained from WITA BAYWORTH, 3228 W. 8th St.,
[REDACTED] and [REDACTED] all of whom were known

to have handled the original extortion letter, however, as the Bureau
has advised that no latent fingerprints were found on this letter or
the letter received by Mrs. LUCILLA PARSONS in Hollywood, California,
the fingerprints are not being forwarded to the Bureau at this time.
In regards to the second letter received by WITA BAYWORTH at the Sands
Hotel, postmarked in Brooklyn, New York, this envelope and letter
was only handled by [REDACTED] and at the time this letter was
received [REDACTED] very carefully removed it from the envelope by utilizing the
fingernails of the thumb and index finger and immediately thereafter
placed it in a cellophane envelope being very careful so that his
fingerprints would not appear on the letter.

In view of the fact that one latent fingerprint and
two latent palm prints were obtained on the outside of the envelope,
efforts will be immediately made to obtain palm prints of [REDACTED]
at which time both palm prints and fingerprints will be submitted to
the Bureau for elimination purposes.

On September 26, 1953, RICK HAYMES and RITA HAYWORTH instructed [redacted] to get in touch with the Reporting Agent and advised him that they desired to give some information prior to their departure for the East Coast.

HAYMES and HAYWORTH advised Reporting Agent that he and YVONNE and REBECCA WELLS, nine year old daughter of HAYWORTH, and YVONNE and RYAN, three year old daughter of HAYWORTH and Victim in instant case, would depart during the night of September 26 for New York and would go immediately to Greenwich, Connecticut, where they could be located at HAYMES' mother's home on [redacted]

HAYMES stated that [redacted] would meet them in New York with a guard for the two children and that the guard would go to Greenwich, Connecticut, with them and remain at his mother's home as the children, REBECCA and YVONNE, would remain there while he and HAYWORTH were on tour of public appearances.

HAYMES stated that these appearances would be on October 9, 10, 11, in Birmingham, Alabama, and on October 13, 1953, that he would appear for a two weeks engagement at the Shamrock Hotel in Houston, Texas, and that this tour would complete his engagements as far as he knows at the present time through the month of October, 1953.

HAYMES was given the telephone number of the Birmingham Office of the FBI, also the telephone numbers of the Houston and New Haven Offices. Upon receipt of these telephone numbers, HAYMES advised that on his arrival in each city that he would contact the office and advise them of what hotel he was staying in and the room number so that in the event that agents of these offices were desirous of getting in touch with either him or RITA HAYWORTH that they would have no trouble in locating them.

For the information of the New York Office, it should be noted that the letter addressed to LOUELLA BRIDGES in Hollywood, California, and the letter addressed to RITA HAYWORTH in Las Vegas, were both mailed Monday. This fact is being called to your attention in the event it might prove beneficial with any suspects that might be developed.
