These not so very clever Red agents are travelling under <u>Guatemalan</u> passports although they were born in the Dominican Republic. Their names are Francisco Perise (phonetic), Juan Ducaradre (phonetic), and Gregoria Perise (phonetic). To the CIA in Washington - you'd better get to know these people before they get to know you.

Comment:

No record could be located in the Bureau indices based on a check made under variations of the above phonetically spelled names. Winchell specifically called the attention of the CIA to these men. He did not indicate that they are in the United States or any of its possessions nor did he state that they intend to come here. He gave no destination for their travel.

Windsor, Canada. <u>Donald Ritchie</u>, the witness who escaped in the Walter Reuther shooting, has been traced to Kent County, Ontario.

Comment:

On December 21, 1949, Attorney General McGrath ondered the Bureau to investigate the attempted bombing of the WAW - CIO Headquarters in Detroit, Michigan, and all other phases connected with this which included the shootings of Walter and Victor Wather a year previously. On May 14, 1952, the Bureau pointed out to the Department that over 7,000 suspects had been interrogated and close to 300 shotguns had been checked and that no information had been developed indicating a federal violation. On May 14, 1952, Department instructed the Bureau not to conduct any further investigation unless a federal violation developed. Since that time the Bureau has followed the matter closely without conducting an active investigation. Ritchie implicated a Detroit hoodlum, as the trigger man in the Walter Reuther shooting. Ritchie was under police guard as the key witness in Detroit and disappeared from a Detroit hotel on Friday, January 8, 1954. Since that time he has been in contact with a Detroit newspaper and has made the statement that he was just engineering a shakedown.

Winchell said:

The Department of Justice wants to close the Ambassador John P. Davies matter. The Jenner Committee, however, will expose the whole thing if anyone tries that.

Comment:

Davies is presently

a counselor at the American Embassy in Lima, Peru.

Winchell said:

The McCarthy Committee in a secret session voted to reopen the investigation of the Voice of America.

Comment:

The Voice of America is now the United States Information Agency which is a separate distinct agency no longer under the Department of State. By legislation the applicants for the Voice of America were investigated by the Bureau.

Winchell said:

Washington. Senator Welker of Idaho will make sensational charges on the floor tomorrow against American Ambassador to Korea Arthur Dean. Mr. Welker will produce a letter written in 1949 naming two of Mr. Dean's top guys on foreign affairs. The names shockingly are Owen Lattimore who was indicted by a Federal Grand Jury recently, and Lawrence hosinger, who when questioned about alleged membership in the Communist Party sought shelter behind the well known Number 5 (Fifth Amendment).

Enclosed are some typical newspaper Items that reflect a crosssection of the attitude here. One is an article on yourself written by, I believe, a Canadian Washington correspondent but who I don't know. Another is a British United Press dispatch in which even the headling is a dishonest one. A reporter myself, it is evident to me that our press is far superior in the recognition of impartiality and ethics in news reporting.



Central American Governments are perennially faced with crises, both economic and political. With respect to the second point, Winchell is referring to the forthcoming meeting at Caracas, Venezuela, of the Organization of American States (OAS). 

Winchell said:

An FBI undercover man will accuse a civilian worker in the Army Department before a Senate Committee some time this week as a dues-paying conspirator.

Comment:

Both of the principal Senate investigating committees -- the McCarthy Committee and the Jenner Committee -- have hearings scheduled for the immediate future. In view of the considerable number of former Bureau informants who are now testifying before these committees and since there are literally tens of thousands of civilian employees in the Army Department, no identification of Winchell's subject is possible without further identifying data.

Winchell said:

To the President of the United States -- Former Communist newspaper people have a plant in the White House.

Comment:

The significance of this mtatement is not known. Winchell may be dramatizing the fact that Tass, the official Soviet news agency, has an accredited correspondent in Washington who regularly attends White House press conferences; or he may be referring to the <u>Daily Worker</u> correspondent in Washington.

Winchell said:

A new suspect will be maked in the Brink's case. This individual is now the subject of a deportation proceeding.

Comment:

Winchell is probably referring to Boston hoodlum, who is now in the custody of the Indigration and Naturalization Service at Boston, Massachusetts. Who has been considered a strong suspect in the Brine's (

Washington -- GOP chiefs will urge the President to replace Secretary Benson and Secretary of War Stevens. Stevens refused to name the Army brass who promoted the Communists. Bad for votes!

Comment:

Secretary of War Robert T. Stevens last week publicly is denounced the "unfair attacks" made by Senator Joseph R. Kuccarthy (R-Visc.) on Army officers. Stevens' statement was an outgrowth of VcCarthy's questioning of Brigadier General Ralph Zwicker, Commanding Officer of Camp Kilmer, New Jersey, with respect to the promotion and honorable discharge of an alleged Communist, Major Irving Peress. According to Stevens, McCarthy had subjected General Zwicker to "humiliating treatment" and was undermining the morale of Army officers generally.

The Immigration and Naturalization Service has advised that they cannot immediately identify the individual to whom Winchell is referring; however, they are checking—on this item. INS would have primary interest in this matter.

Winchell said:

Oslo, Norway -- The Norwegian Intelligence has arrested a Norwegian spy ring of nineteen just as its leader turned over defense plans of Oslo Harbor to a Russian in a parked car. Norway had demanded the immediate recall of the Russian Second Secretary. The Second Secretary in all Russian Embassies is actually the chief of Russian intelligence.

Comment:

It is true that the Second Secretary of the Russian Embassy is frequently a ranking intelligence official. The Bureau has found this to be the case in a number of instances. Winchell's statement that all Second Secretaries are the heads of Russian Intelligence networks would seem to be a distinct exaggeration, however.

Winchell said:

Palm Springs, California -- I flew to this desert paradise to see Governor Inight the other day about Wesley Wells, a Negro sentenced to die in the gas chamber April 9th. The law in California condemns you to death for striking a prison guard if, IF you are doing life at the time. I have been told that the prisoner was given life AFTER he struck the guard and then condemned to the gas chamber.

Comment:

Vells, a habitual criminal, has been in prison almost continuously since 1925. During March, 1942, he was sentenced to a term of 1-5 years at San Quentin prison for auto theft. This sentence was increased to 5 years to life during September, 1944, after Wells violated the prison regulations relating to the possession of weapons by inmates. In August, 1947, Wells was sentenced to death for assaulting a prison guard. During a prison fracas, he had thrown a cuspidor at the guard.

Winchell said:

Chicago-American -- The policeman from Cicero convicted for violating civil rights will be retried in Chicago March 30th.

Comment:

Einchell is referring to the Bureau case entitled Erwin Konovsky Et Al, Harvey Evans Clark Et Al, Victims, Civil Rights." This case is the outgrowth of the race riots which occurred at Cicero, Illinois, during 1951, after Clark and his family moved into a previously all-white neighborhood. Konovsky, the Chief of Police at Cicero, and two others were subsequently convicted for failing to afford the victims proper protection. The Court of Appeals reversed this verdict last spring and remanded the case to the lower courts for retrial.

Winchell said:

John Edgar Hoover -- Look Magazine next Tuesday has a very wonderful article about three of your top men, Tolson, Nichols, and Ladd.

Comment:

The Bureau knows about this. In fact, Look Magazine consulted with the Crime Records Section in preparing this article in question.

Winchell said:

Detroit Times -- Senator Jenner's Investigating Committee will hold a series of explosive hearings in Detroit, Michigan, in about two weeks.

Comment:

Ed Duffy, staff member of the Jenner Committee, advised the Bureau late last week that although that Committee did plan to conduct some hearings in Detroit eventually, they had no immediate plans in that regard. Duffy indicated that the Jenner Committee would not visit Detroit until the House Committee on Un-American Activities had concluded its sessions in Detroit.

Winchell said:

Washington Post -- People representing all organizations recently listed as subversive by the government's Mr. Brownell will march on Washington, D.C., and also try to disturb the Congress March 7th and 8th.

Comment:

Winchell is probably referring to the People's
Conference to Repeal the McCarran Act" which is being sponsored
by the Civil Rights Tongress on Sunday, March 7th. Plans call
for a special train to transport delegates from the New York
area. According to a Bureau source, efforts will be made to



For record purposes, late Sunday afternoon, Rose Bigman of Mr. Walter Winchell's office called you and I took the call. She pointed out that they had bumped into something that was very interesting. They had received a letter in the mail signed "Ed," that this letter enclosed a few cards containing names and amounts of contributions on them. The letter stated that if they were interested in learning more details, an item should be put

in the column stating, "Dear Eddie: We are interested." This they did.

Shortly thereafter, a man called at the office on Friday, February 26. The man claimed that he was married, had a family and did not want to get into trouble. He had a few cards bearing the date 1946 and showing contributions of \$50, \$100 and \$200. He stated that he could get more cards. He did come up with more cards and these looked to Rose b like a sucker list. She then asked about more cards like the ones she had seen first showing contributions of \$50, \$100 and \$200. In about a half an hour, he returned with approximately 150 cards. Among the names which she recognized as making contributions were the names of The man called Eddie represented that he either stole the cards or got them surreptitiously or in some way secured them from

Rose noticed this man was wearing a ring with the letter on it. She then remarked to him that his name was not Eddie. He admitted it was not, but that it was

Rose stated that the cards had been sent to Mr. Winchell and of our Los Angeles Office Mr. Winchell turned the cards over to to be photostated. Rose stated Winchell asked her to contact us and also be sure that the man known as Eddie does not get in trouble. Rose did not know what was back of the move other than the fact that Eddie indicated the cards had something to do with Communism. He wants the cards back as he must return them and he is to call Rose early this week. Rose stated that if perhaps she knew what line to take, she could get more information from Eddie.

SAC Malone of Los Angeles telephonically advised Mr. McGuire of my office this afternoon that pursuant to Bureau instructions he had personally called on Walter Winchell yesterday afternoon and obtained from him a number of 3x5 index cards which Winchell had on individuals who possibly might have Communist Party connections. Malone stated the Los Angeles was photographing these cards today.

Winchell had asked Malone to have the cards returned to his secreta in New York and suggested Malone send a cover note to Rose Bigman so she would know where he got them. Further, that Rose would know what to do with them. Malone suggested rather than have him write a note to Miss Bigman that he have the cards sent direct to SAC Kelly in New York so they could be delivered by an Agent personally to Miss Bigman, thereby obviating the necessity of having any correspondence in his file on this subject matter.

Malone was advised that unless instructed to the contrary by the Bureau tonight, to send the cards to the New York Office for delivery by an Agent to Winchell's secretary.



WINCHELL SAID:

Mr. John Ireland says he is a very loyal American, that he has requested the FBI and all committees to put him through any acid test. This is a relief, I think, from the people who refuse to answer questions. I invited Mr. Ireland here tonight to meet you all and lets hear what he has to say about it. John, I have a list as it appeared in a page ad in the "Hollywood Reporter" in 1947. It contains the names of many loyal Americans out here in the movie colony and some known "Reds," attacking a Congressional Committee. John Ireland, your name is on that list. Now I do not accuse you or anyone on that list, because that would be guilt by association and I have always been opposed to that. John, have you any comment on why your name happens to be on this list?

JOHN TRELAND SAID: 0112

I was having dinner at the Players Restaurant a few years ago and someone submitted a petition to me. I understand tonight the petition was to abolish the Un-American Activities Committee. Well I would never be a party to that. I would never sign anything that has to do with abolishing the Un-American Activities Committee whatsoever. Personally I'm not really interested in politics. I'm sorry to say I am only interested in acting and I always have been.

WINCHELL SAID:

Ok John Ireland, I hope this helps get your side of the story OVET.

CONVENT:

newspaper falsely identifying Ireland as a Communist Party sympathizer. He requested that he be permitted to come to the Los Angeles office on March 8, 1954, to be interviewed concerning this matter. It was agreed that he should be interviewed there at 3 P.M. teday.

At 4 P.W. March 3, 1954, Walter Winchell called the Los Angeles office and advised that he had asked Ireland to appear on his program March 7, 1954.

We have not conducted any investigation concerning Ireland. The only previous information appearing in our files which may refer to Ireland, is as follows: In the November 3, 1947, issue of the "Hollywood Reporter" there appears a full-page ad of the Actors' Division of the Progressive Citizens of America which is entitled "The Rankin Committee Must Go." The name John Ireland appears as one of the sponsors of this ad.

WINCHELL SAID:

The scoop of my life that never got on the air. Last week's script had a tip on the shootings in Washington, but I never got to it. This is the item now on the cameras confirmed so shockingly the next afternoon. Washington Post, Attention Mr. Brownell. Followers of Campos, the pardoned Nationalist beast of Puerto Rico, are expected to stage demonstrations against leading Americans in Washington, D. C.

J. E. Hoover, and FBI men may be the first target of their shots. Now get this. The Winchell broadcast of February 21, that's two Sundays ago, was even closer to the news. Listen now to the sound track of the Winchell kinescope for February 21, while I read it and weep. Listen to the last four words. "Washington Post; People representing all organizations recently listed as subversive by the Governments Mr. Brownell, will march on Washington, D. C. in hopes of trying to disturb the Congress."

"And try to disturb the Congress," that's pretty close.

CONVENT:

We received information from the U.S. Secret Service in Movember, 1953, to the effect that an informant of unknown reliability

had stated that the Nationalist Party of Puerto Rico had hatched a plot to assassinate the Director of FBI, President Eisenhower, and Henry Cabot Lodge, U. S. Ambassador to the United Nations.

On February 22, 1954, the San Juan office advised that confidential informant

The "march on Washington, D. C." mentioned above apparently refers to the "Peoples Conference to Repeal the McCarran Act" (PCRMA) which is sponsored by the Civil Rights Congress. The PCRMA has been scheduled to confer with Congress on the morning of March 8, 1954, and with officials of the Justice Department and the Subversive Activities Control Board during the afternoon of March 8, 1954. Details concerning this matter are set forth in your memorandum to the Director dated March 8, 1954, captioned "Civil Rights Congress, Internal Security - C."

There is no tie in between the PCRMA and the activities of the Nationalist Party of Puerto Rico.

WINCHELL SAID:

There are more Puerto Rican Nationalists in Venezuela than in the United States of North America.

COMMENT:

WINCHELL SAID:

Senator McCarthy will say tomorrow that if the Republicans attack him once more, he McCarthy, will not speak outside Wisconsin in the Fall Campaign. McCarthy accuses his own party of using his fight on the Communists to cover up business conditions and the farm issue. "I will no longer," said Senator McCarthy, "Take the rap."

COMMENT:

Senator McCarthy is doubtlessly referring to recent criticism directed at him by President Eisenhower and other top Republicans because of the feud between McCarthy and Secretary Stevens of the Department of the Army, which grew out of McCarthy's alleged "brow-beating" of General Zwicker when the latter was testifying before the McCarthy Committee.

WINCHELL SAID:

Testerday in Florida, Mr. Adlat Stevenson declared that the . Eisenhower administration was surrounded by political plungers. Wen who had wagered the life of the Republican Party on "McCarthyism" Mr. Stevenson neglected to mention, ladies and gentlemen, that the Truman administration had bet the life of the nation on Alger Hiss and Dean Acheson, and very nearly lost the nations life in Korea. Mr. Stevenson also said that President Eisenhower's great crusade had practiced great deception. Well in my opinion that's a very timid man's way of calling the President of the United States a liar. Mr. Stevenson also neglected to mention that one of the greatest lies in our history was exposed long ago. The Truman administrations fabrication that Alger Hiss and Harry Dexter White were merely "Red Herrings." Well, many Red leaders in the United States have since been convicted and jailed and if Mr. Stevenson only realized the 1952 election convicted the Truman administration of harboring them. Mr. Stevenson, however, truthfully said when one party calls another party a party of traitors it does great damage to the nation. What Adlai Stevenson forgot to tell you, however, was the name of the author of that very generous and very wise statement. It was stated at a press conference several months ago by the President of the United States, Dwight D. Eisenhower, who considers it more important to be an American than a politician.
